#### A. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Chairwoman Elizabeth Waner called the meeting to order at 1:20 p.m., welcoming all in attendance. ACOG Executive Director John G. Johnson called the roll, stating that a quorum was present.

#### B. APPROVAL OF THE DECEMBER 17, 2015 MINUTES

There being no discussion, Councilmember Mark Hamm moved to approve the December 17, 2015 minutes. Vice-Mayor Jim Mickley seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Commissioner Marc Hader moved to place Items C-1 through C-5 on the Consent Docket and approve or acknowledge those items, subject to any conditions included in those items. Vice-Mayor Jim Mickley seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### D. <u>ITEMS REQUIRING INDIVIDUAL ACTION AND/OR DISCUSSION:</u>

#### 1. ENCOMPASS 2040 UNIT COSTS

Holly Massie provided an overview of the methodology used to develop unit costs for arriving at a total cost for each alternate considered in the development of Encompass 2040. She advised that the metropolitan long-range transportation plan is federally required to be financially realistic, by demonstrating there will be adequate revenues from reasonably anticipated sources to cover the capital and maintenance costs of the adopted plan.

Ms. Massie advised that the proposed unit costs were developed in consultation with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and several OCARTS member local

governments and were based on recent construction cost information. She said that factors affecting the unit cost for specific project locations are the functional classification of the roadway (limited access versus non-limited access facilities) and its location within either the more heavily developed urban area or rural portion of the region.

Ms. Massie explained that the recent (2015) cost information obtained from 0D0T and area local governments was converted to 2010 dollars, the base year of Encompass 2035, and an inflation factor will be applied to each project based on its anticipated implementation period. Inflation rates will fall into three ranges: short-term projects (2010-2020), medium-term projects (2021-2030), and long-term projects (2031-2040). In addition, roadway maintenance will be assumed to occur every 10 years for the network and will be inflated using the same factors.

Ms. Massie said the Intermodal Transportation Technical Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee received this same unit costs information, reviewed it, and have recommended approval.

Chairwoman Waner said she contacted Ms. Massie after reviewing the figures to gain a better understanding of the unit cost increases from the last plan. Ms. Massie said the Technical Committee is aware of these increased costs, which are in line with current local trends and projects.

Vice-Mayor Jim Mickley moved to approve the recommended 2010 unit costs for developing the street, highway and bicycle/pedestrian costs for Encompass 2040. Councilmember Mike Fullerton seconded the motion. The motion carried.

# 2. <u>STP-UZA PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS AREA TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM</u>

Holly Massie provided an overview of the process and project selection for the 2017-2020 TIP. She said there was a call for projects in November 2015 and 82 projects were received from the communities requesting STP-UZA project funding. ACOG staff reviewed the projects and scoring to ensure conformity with STP-UZA evaluation criteria. A special ITTC meeting was held on Thursday, January 21, to review project scoring and develop a recommended project list for the estimated STP-UZA funding in the 2017-2020 TIP, and the list of recommended projects is included in the agenda.

As with the long-range Plan, the TIP also must be financially constrained; ITTC recommended projects based upon current STP-UZA funding estimates for the 2017-2020 period. She referred to a table in the agenda, showing the estimated funds used for each year.

Ms. Massie said the Committee's approval of the 2017-2020 TIP project list will allow ACOG to publish a preliminary TIP for public review and comment. After the public comment period, the 2017-2020 TIP will be brought back to ITPC for consideration and action. Ms. Massie thanked the communities for their participation in the project selection process at the Special ITTC meeting.

Mayor David Bennett moved to include the recommended list of STP-UZA projects in the Preliminary FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement Program for public review and comment. Mayor Ray Poland seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### 3. SELECTION OF FY 2016, ACOG PUBLIC FLEET CLEAN AIR GRANTS PROJECTS

Chairwoman Waner provided remarks about the Central Oklahoma Clean Cities 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event on January 27. She noted that much regional progress has occurred in the 20 years since ACOG started monitoring and developing programs to improve air quality. She commended the City of Midwest for receiving the Zach D. Taylor, Jr. Clean Cities Vision Award, noting that Midwest City has done a great job of diversifying its public services fleet and using a variety of alternative fuels, depending on the need of the particular piece of equipment.

Mr. Eric Pollard, Clean Cities Coordinator, then highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. He said four projects were submitted and two projects were recommended for funding: 1.) the COTPA/EMBARK project and 2.) the City of Norman project.

Jason Ferbrache shared that COTPA appreciated Committee consideration and support for this project. He said the COTPA Board of Trustees has made a commitment to transition its entire bus fleet from diesel to CNG. This timely grant allows COTPA to accelerate the design and construction of its CNG fueling facility. This project has the potential to also allow COTPA to convert its paratransit and support vehicles to CNG.

Councilmember Castleberry said the City of Norman is very pleased with the grant award. He said in the two years Norman has had its CNG fueling infrastructure, the City has saved over \$700,000 in fuel costs with its city vehicles.

Doug Myers moved to approve the COTPA and City of Norman projects detailed in the agenda memorandum for funding, utilizing CMAQ funds allocated to ACOG's FY 2016 Public Fleet CLEAN AIR Grants program. Councilmember Robert Castleberry seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### 4. TRANSPORTATION NEWS AND UPDATES

#### FFY 2017-2020 TIP Project List

Daniel O'Connor thanked the Committee for the approval of the STP-UZA FFY 2017-2020 TIP project list. He said that for FFY 2017, there were 17 projects selected with about \$18.6 million in federal funds programmed for those projects from nine entities. He thanked the Committee for the great applications and help with the process, noting many of the entity staff members spent time at the Special ITTC Meeting developing the recommended project list.

#### ODOT Transportation Alternatives Program Process

Mr. O'Connor called attention to consent agenda item C-2 regarding the ODOT Transportation Alternatives Program call for projects, noting that this is a great funding opportunity for bicycle and pedestrian projects in ACOG communities outside of the urbanized area. He said the program provides 80 percent federal funding with a maximum award of \$700,000. He encouraged members to apply and contact John Sharp with any program questions or application assistance requests.

Commissioner Rod Cleveland asked if a project could include a three foot shoulder for a bike facility. Mr. O'Connor said eligible projects include bike lanes, bike facilities, trail facilities, pedestrian facilities — as long as transportation components are included in the design and function.

Commissioner Cleveland asked how much funding total is available for the OCARTS area and will ODOT limit the funding share per entity. John Sharp said program funding is statewide, and the funding amount has yet to be published.

Chairwoman Waner asked if there was any new business. No new business was presented.

There being no further business, Chairwoman Waner adjourned the meeting at 1:44 p.m.


