#### I. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Chairman Daniel J. O'Connor called the meeting to order at 10:09 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions around the room. There was a quorum.

#### II. MINUTES:

#### A. Approval of the January 14, 2016 Regular Meeting Minutes

Harry Fenton moved to approve the January 14, 2016 regular meeting minutes. Tyler Gammon seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### B. <u>Approval of the January 21, 2016 Special Meeting Minutes</u>

Harry Fenton moved to approve the January 21, 2016 special meeting minutes. Angelo Lombardo seconded the motion. The motion carried.

#### III. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

#### A. <u>Congestion Management Plan Update and Notice of Work Group Meeting</u>

Daniel O'Connor said that ACOG's last CMP update was in 2007. He said the purpose of the CMP is to identify regional corridors with congestion and develop strategies to best mitigate the congestion affects. This update is a part of the Encompass 2040 Plan, and the consultant team of Olsson Associates with Cambridge Systematics has been hired to assist ACOG with this process. He said the second Congestion Management Work Group (CMWG) meeting will be held this afternoon at 1:30 p.m. and all are welcome to attend.

Mr. O'Connor then introduced Clyde Prem, Olsson Associates, and Kelsey Ahern, Cambridge Systematics. Mr. Prem gave a short presentation of CMP progress since December, which can be reviewed at:

Chairman O'Connor said the CMWG will focus today on defining the CMP goals, objectives, performance measures, and the regional network.

#### B. <u>Status of the Encompass 2040 Land Use Scenarios</u>

Chairman O'Connor said that 2040 land use scenarios are alternate patterns our region could grow over the next 25 years, and they can help inform our future transportation priorities. Jennifer Sebesta gave a presentation on the status of the Encompass 2040 OCARTS area scenarios, which can be reviewed at:

Harry Fenton asked if the new turnpikes were included in the scenarios. Ms. Sebesta said that the scenarios do not include the turnpikes since alignments have yet to be determined.

Isaac Akem asked what unit of geography is being used for this analysis. She said growth allocation was assigned to the land use parcels within 2,855 Traffic Analysis Zones [TAZs].

#### C. <u>ODOT Grant Programs: Transportation Alternatives Program and Safe Routes to School</u>

John Sharp highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. He noted that the Statewide TAP funding preliminary application deadline has changed from February 29 to March 20, and the final application has changed from March 31 to April 30. He said the application is to be completed online through the link provided in the agenda.

Mr. Sharp said that the available MAP-21 TAP funding is \$6.8 million for communities with less than 5,000 in population and \$4.2 million for communities with 5,000-200,000 in population. Eligible projects must be located outside of the urbanized area boundary. Grants require a 20 percent local match. He said \$700,000 is the maximum federal funding request per each project.

Mr. Sharp added that 0D0T is also taking pre-applications for the remaining Safe Routes to School Program funding provided under SAFETEA-LU, and expects to have \$4-6 million available to award statewide. The deadline for applications is expected to be later this year or early 2017.

Mr. O'Connor said that if the entities have related questions, to contact Jessica Scott, Bicycle/Pedestrian Coordinator at ODOT, or John Sharp.

#### D. <u>Preparation of CY 2015 Network Monitoring Report</u>

Holly Massie said that ACOG recently sent out its network monitoring survey to members. The survey asks the entities to report what transportation projects were completed last year in their communities so ACOG can update the regional network. She said a list of the member contacts who received the survey is in the agenda, and ACOG requests surveys be returned by March 15. She said the surveys can be completed online.

#### E. <u>FY 2017 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Subcommittee Schedule</u>

Chairman O'Connor said the FY 2017 UPWP is a joint document prepared by the UPWP Subcommittee, consisting of staff from ACOG, COTPA, CART, and cities that contract with ACOG for traffic count data. The Subcommittee will be meeting over the next couple of months to develop the FY 2017 work program, and the first Subcommittee meeting is February 12; all are welcome to attend.

#### F. <u>OCARTS Area Line Item Projects and Administrative Modifications</u>

Holly Massie said this is an informational item identifying specific OCARTS projects that were previously included in statewide line items. She said the second table includes administrative modifications affecting OCARTS area STIP projects.

## G. <u>Status of Surface Transportation Program Urbanized Area (STP-UZA) Projects in the OCARTS Transportation Management Area (TMA)</u>

Holly Massie said this is the monthly status report on STP-UZA projects in the OCARTS TMA. She noted that the attached tables include the January 21 Special ITTC meeting recommendations for projects to be included in the next TIP. The lists reflect:

- 1) The FFY 2016 STP-UZA projects
- 2) The recommended FFY 2017-2020 projects
- 3) Potential FFY 2021-2023 projects, as part of an eight-year plan, which allows 0D0T to continue environmental review
- 4) The unscheduled projects which are programmed but not in the TIP

#### IV. NEW BUSINESS

#### Route Changes for EMBARK

Larry Hopper said EMBARK has now added night service, between 7 p.m. and midnight, to two more routes; four EMBARK routes now have night service. The new night service provides access to NW Oklahoma City Mercy Hospital and South Oklahoma City OCCC. Mr. Hopper also noted that the downtown streetcar alignment and operating plan have recently been modified.

#### Smart Cities Challenge Grant

Mr. Hopper said the City of Oklahoma City Planning Dept. and COTPA have put together an application to compete for the Smart Cities Challenge, a competitive US DOT grant program that will award one city \$50 million to implement innovative transportation improvements. A short list of finalists is expected in the next few weeks.

#### Approval of ITTC recommendations for the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS TIP Projects

Chairman O'Connor said that on January 28, the ITPC approved the project recommendations from the Special ITTC meeting on January 21 for STP-UZA projects for the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS TIP.

**SUBJECT**: Projected Revenues for Implementation of Encompass 2040

#### **INFORMATION:**

Federal law requires that metropolitan transportation plans be financially realistic and affordable. In order to determine the financial feasibility of Encompass 2040, staff has developed a 30-year revenue projection for comparison with the estimated cost of each plan alternative under development.

Transportation expenditures during the previous five years within the Oklahoma City Area Regional Transportation Study (OCARTS) area were identified from a variety of federal, state and local sources. This information provided the basis for the 30-year revenue projection and was combined with any future additional revenues considered to be reasonably available to the OCARTS area. Estimated transportation revenues from local government sources were derived from responses to an ACOG survey distributed to each OCARTS area local government in August 2015.

The attached table summarizes the total revenue projection for implementing the street and highway, bicycle and pedestrian, and transit improvements that will be a part of the affordable Encompass 2040 plan. The summary table is followed by supporting tables that detail the recent historic information upon which each of the 30-year revenue projection components is based.

It should be noted that the attached revenue information does not include an annual growth factor. However, federal rules allow metropolitan areas to assume a measure of revenue growth over the plan period and require that plan costs reflect year-of-expenditure values. The addition of such inflation factors will be applied as part of the final financial capacity analysis for Encompass 2040, which will be presented at a subsequent meeting.

Please review the attached revenue information and advise if there are additional revenue sources, modifications or corrections that should be incorporated into the Encompass 2040 revenue projection.

**SUBJECT**: Discussion of Encompass 2040 Transportation Alternate Networks

#### INFORMATION:

ACOG staff, in close coordination with member entity staff, has begun to develop and model alternate street and highway networks in order to update the region's long-range transportation plan, Encompass 2040. As part of the 2040 Plan, each transportation model alternate will run using the development patterns created by the Encompass 2040 Land Use Scenarios.

#### **Encompass 2040 Scenarios:**

- Scenario 1: Continues similar development patterns of the past with no new zoning initiatives
- Scenario 2: Encourages infill and downtown development in each community

#### **Transportation Alternates:**

- **2010 Base Year Network:** Includes all regional streets and fixed transit routes as they existed in the base year of 2010, and the model attempts to replicate transportation patterns using base year network characteristics and land use patterns.
- Alternate One—Present + Committed Network: Includes all existing roadways and transit routes with improvements implemented since 2010, as well as those for which funding is committed through December 2016. The network also includes portions of the Oklahoma Department of Transportation's 8-Year Construction Work Plan.

At the March meeting, ACOG staff will present the transportation model results of the 2010 Base Year Network and Alternate One for Scenario 1 runs. In the coming months, staff will be bringing additional transportation alternates and land use scenarios to the committees for review.

#### INFORMATION:

The Environmental Protection Agencies' (EPA) Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program is soliciting proposals nationwide for projects that achieve significant reductions in diesel emissions in terms of tons of pollution produced by diesel engines and diesel emissions exposure.

#### Eligible Uses of Funding

Eligible diesel vehicles, engines and equipment may include school buses, Class 5 - Class 8 heavy-duty highway vehicles, marine engines, locomotives and non-road engines, equipment or vehicles used in construction, handling of cargo (including at ports or airports), agriculture, mining or energy production (including stationary generators and pumps).

Grant funds may be used for clean diesel projects that use:

- <u>EPA verified</u> retrofit technologies or certified engine configurations
- <u>California Air Resources Board (CARB) verified</u> retrofit technologies or certified engine configurations
- Idle-reduction technologies that are **EPA verified**
- Aerodynamic technologies and low rolling resistance tires that are <u>EPA verified</u>
- Early engine, vehicle, or equipment replacements with certified engine configurations

All Oklahoma based projects are eligible but Oklahoma, Bryan, Carter, Rogers, & Tulsa Counties are prioritized by EPA due to higher particulate matter pollution levels. \$2.7 million in funding is available to EPA Region 6 (includes Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Texas, & 66 Tribes).
