#### IV. STAFF REPORT

#### a. Legislation 2016 – SB 1219

In a session where water bills went mostly unnoticed, the Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) bill got to the governor's desk and was signed. This bill allows water to be stored in an aquifer for use at a later time without counting against the quantity limits established in the groundwater permits.

Well spacing rules are required to prohibit interference with permitted and domestic use. The bill gives the Oklahoma Water Resources Board (OWRB) authority to implement ASR rules. ASR is considered a beneficial use of water.

SB 1219 will help store water in times of plenty for use during droughts.

#### b. Bread and Butter Issues – Slaughterville Rezoning Request

A tract of land is under consideration for rezoning from agricultural into residential for the purpose of development of a subdivision. The city of Slaughterville requested input from ACOG staff.

Simple groundwater modeling showed no significant impact on existing wells in the area. However, aerial photo analysis showed potential pollution from an old oil and gas well on one of the proposed plats. It was recommended that a test well be drilled and a groundwater sample be collected and analyzed before approving the tract.

#### c. ScienceFest 2016

ACOG has been doing ScienceFest since 2005! We have shown the stormwater model to thousands of fifth graders. A presentation was made to the Board and met with approval.

#### 069002 - ACOG Drought Program

The ACOG Drought Program started in 2006 when Central Oklahoma had the first good drought year in decades. There is a monthly report generated detailing statistics on rainfall, water conditions, reservoir conditions, and short and long-term forecasts. This report by the Water Resources Division of ACOG is issued via email to interested parties. Notify us if you want to be added to the distribution list to receive the report.

Oklahoma is now in a long-term dry cycle and we may continue to experience drought conditions over the next three to five years. Rainfall in May 2015 effectively ended the short-term drought conditions; however, recent rainfall activity has been below average. March 2015 saw the return of drought in western Oklahoma.

Since the last progress report, two monthly reports have been generated.

#### 159000 - Technical Assistance

Staff will be reviewing well log data for the city of Norman to help determine the best geological site for water well field expansion. Staff will integrate this data into the groundwater model.

Staff is reviewing a tract of land in Slaughterville which is under consideration for rezoning from agricultural to into residential for the purpose of development of a subdivision. Citizens in the area are concerned about the impact on the aquifer.

#### **Schools and Conferences**

John Harrington attended the Oklahoma Floodplain Manager's Spring Conference and the Oklahoma Clean Watersheds and Lakes Conference. John also spoke at the Oklahoma Rural Water Association conference and presented at ScienceFest 2016.
