D. ITEMS REQUIRING INDIVIDUAL ACTION AND/OR DISCUSSION:

1. PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION ON REQUEST FOR AMENDMENT OF THE FFY 2017-2020 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) BY THE CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY

Chairman White opened the public hearing. There being no response from the public, the public hearing was closed.

Holly Massie said this is a request by the City of Oklahoma City to amend the TIP. She said during the previous project selection process for the STP-UZA funds under the previous TIP, this group did approve the use of \$2 million in those funds to go towards

renovation of Santa Fe Station, which was selected to be the future intermodal transportation hub for the region. She said renovation is currently going on and the total package of about \$28.5 million is being used to renovate the interior, exterior, and various portions of the station to better accommodate the streetcar that will be coming and pedestrian access through a tunnel that will connect Bricktown and Downtown. Ms. Massie said the funds come from the TIGER Grant award that the City received, as well as local funds from the Oklahoma City MAPS Project funding and Project 180 funds, ODOT provided some in-kind contribution, and the last piece of that grant application was the \$2 million in ACOG STP-UZA funds.

Ms. Massie said the ACOG funds will go towards the pedestrian tunnel portion of the project and this is one of the latter work elements. It was in the previous TIP, but the funds were not able to be authorized by the end of the FFY 2016, so the request is to move the funds into FFY 2017 of the current TIP that just became effective October 1. She said the Intermodal Transportation Technical Committee recommended approval.

Councilmember Jim Pumphrey moved to amend the FFY 2017 element of the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS Area TIP by adding the Santa Fe Station Transportation Hub, as requested by the City of Oklahoma City, and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Councilmember Mike McEachern seconded the motion. There being no discussion, the motion carried.

2. <u>BENEFIT-COST ANALYSIS OF ENCOMPASS 2040 PLAN TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATE</u> NETWORKS

Jennifer Sebesta said ACOG staff conducted a benefit-cost (B/C) analysis for the Encompass 2040 transportation alternate networks, noting that this analysis compares the benefits and costs associated with each alternative network and determines if the suggested improvements are representative of sound investment decisions. She said that according to the B/C ratio analysis, Alternate 2 offers a significant benefit over Alternate 1 and a slightly better B/C ratio than Alternate 3. Ms. Sebesta said that additional information was provided illustrating the analysis in a table following the agenda memorandum. This item was for information only.

3. APPROVAL OF ENCOMPASS 2040 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN

John G. Johnson said the Encompass 2040 MTP has been developing for about two years in terms of the components and building blocks — the long-range transportation plan. He said the brochure handout was the Executive Summary of that spending guide for Central Oklahoma for transportation infrastructure. It is \$10 billion through 2040, so it is a significant investment in all modes of transportation in Central Oklahoma.

Mr. Johnson said ACOG has reached that point in the process where the Committee is being asked to approve the adoption of this Encompass 2040 Plan. He had all the transportation staff members stand who worked diligently on this project and the Committee applauded.

Mayor Ray Poland asked if the Encompass 2040 Public Comments handout listed all the comments that had been received on the Plan out of half a million people in Central Oklahoma. Mr. Johnson said yes.

Mayor Poland moved to approve the proposed financially constrained Encompass 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan. Councilmember Jim Pumphrey seconded the motion.

Chairman White asked Mayor Poland if he thought the public feedback portion was a flaw or just disinterest of the citizens. Mayor Poland said he thought it was disinterest...until something happens. People do not want to get involved unless something happens after the fact. He did not think it was a reflection on anything that ACOG has done, as he thinks they have done a very good job of getting this information out to the people. People just do not want to take the time to get involved in something like this; it is our culture. On a positive note, Mayor David Bennett said it looks like everyone is so pleased with what is being done!

Mayor Jay Adams said the City of Mustang is working on its comprehensive plan and received 750 responses, but he said that was because that was inside their little world. When dealing with a Plan this size, it is outside most people's worlds and that is why it is absent of comments.

John Sharp, ACOG, said ACOG's comment process started about two years ago when starting to push out the Plan. He said ACOG did receive feedback at the beginning with a survey on the ACOG website where about 500 responses were received about what they thought the region should look like. However, there just was not much feedback at the end.

Chairman White opened the public hearing.

Jody Harlan wanted to acknowledge all the work that had been done on the Plan and said she submitted comments that were too late for the package today. In a nutshell, she is concerned that our region is not approaching public transit as a Big League City the way Dallas and Fort Worth have. She said according to the American Public Transit Association, every one dollar invested in public transportation generates four dollars in economic returns. Every \$10 million in capital investment yields \$30 million in increased business sales. Every \$1 billion creates 50,000 jobs. Home values perform 42 percent better if located near public transportation with high frequency service.

Ms. Harlan said we have a geographically large city and as the Plan says, it acknowledged the demand for alternative forms of transportation — transit, sidewalks, bikeways — is growing on a daily basis. Also, John G. Johnson wrote about significant growth in Central Oklahoma, resulting in congestion affecting mobility and overall quality of life. She said an appropriate response would be expanding public transportation and regional rail, park and ride, bus rapid transit and even regular bus and paratransit. However, these services are referred to in the Plan as "illustrative due to lack of dedicated funding for their implementation. Ms. Harlan expressed disapproval that public transportation is only allocated \$1.3 billion. She stated that a greater investment would substantially reduce the investment of street maintenance and construction and the assumed need for more parking garages, which do not bring people to a Big League City. Reasonable public transportation does. Ms. Harlan also stated concerns over air quality issues.

Ms. Harlan noted that the American Public Transit Association said the Americans took 10.8 billion rides on public transportation in 2014 – the highest in 78 years. Public transportation is a crucial part of the solution to the nation's economic, energy, and environmental challenges, helping to bring a better quality of life.

Ms. Harlan said she did not want to wait 24 years to catch up with every other major city – not just in the country, but in the world – and the four dollar return for every one dollar invested that we should be realizing in Central Oklahoma. She thinks that transit has been overlooked and the investment needs to be bumped up in public transportation by 2040, as it would benefit all of the cities sitting at the table. She said she lived in Yukon and is hoping someday to take public transit to and from work. However, since she does not think she will be working in 2040, she would like to see it before then. She thanked the Committee for allowing her to share her thoughts.

There being no further response from the public, the public hearing was closed.

Chairman White said many of the Committee members share Ms. Harlan's thoughts about public transportation. He said they have not substantially increased contributions to public transportation, but incrementally done it over the last ten years. He thinks it is vital and that the City of Oklahoma City has to take the lead on this, but has fumbled its opportunity to do it by building a streetcar, which cannot be undone, before putting money in real public transportation. Also, adding parking garages will likely increase ozone emissions in the region.

Mayor Poland said this Plan is a living, breathing document that changes from year to year. It is not set in stone. The world is changing and younger people want better public transportation. He said he does not think anyone disagrees with the idea of putting more money in public transportation, but there is a long-term picture here as you cannot take money away from roads and place into public transportation because without the roads, the public transportation will be non-existent. There will be a certain amount of people

who will complain because their wait time at the stop light is 90 seconds longer than it was last week. He does not think this is anything that needs to get worked up about.

John G. Johnson said this document was prepared in collaboration with ODOT and our transit providers, as well as all of the member cities, so it was not ACOG staff creating the list of 220 projects. All of the entities actually submitted those projects, and some of those projects will have to be done not by the funds coming through ACOG, but perhaps through ODOT. All projects in the Plan must have a funding source and the Plan must be fiscally constrained. It is a dynamic document, so there will be amendments as we go forward. Mr. Johnson said it is the decision of this Policy Committee to change the Plan going forward, and the law requires that ACOG update this Plan every five years. Also, annually ACOG is examining what the new priorities are and if they can be included. Philosophically it does not constrain the ITPC to say these are the only things we are going to do in the next 30 years. This Plan does not hinder any entity or ODOT about projects that they want to develop, nor does it keep us from building public transportation if a revenue stream can be identified.

Chairman White quoted Eisenhower as saying, "Plans are worthless; planning is indispensable." This Plan changes as the dynamics change. He said the Regional Transit Authority (RTA) will have a huge impact on what is done if they can ever figure out a way to fund and organize it and everyone will want to participate in it.

Ms. Harlan said in 2015, she met with Dallas Area Rapid Transit Authority to ask how Oklahoma citizens might suggest funding because their culture is much like ours, but with a greater amount of people. They said to not try to get any statewide funding issues passed because the people will not support it. The only way to do it is with a sales tax, much like MAPS, and cities buy in and participate and get support as a result of the willingness of their citizens to invest.

Chairman White said it is a little unfair to compare Texas to Oklahoma because Oklahoma cities only have sales tax as a way to survive. Texas cities share the ad valorem taxes and as a result have a lot of flexibility of what to do with sales tax. He said RTA is looking at something other than sales tax.

John Sharp said this Draft Plan Summary will be incorporated into a full document with much greater details and maps of the Plan to show more of the story. It will also give more background information.

There being no further discussion, Chairman White called for the vote on the motion to approve the proposed financially constrained Encompass 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan.

4. QUADRENNIAL JOINT CERTIFICATION REVIEW OF OCARTS METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION

John G. Johnson introduced Isaac Akem of FHWA and Pearlie Tiggs of FTA. Mr. Akem thanked Mr. Johnson and his staff for working with them on a short notice to complete the Certification Review before the end of this year.

He said by law, a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Certification Review must be conducted every four years. Referring back to the last review in 2012, he said FHWA and FTA concluded that the ACOG MPO process was being conducted properly and proceeded with certification, which meant there was no issue with the way the ACOG MPO was conducting the process and thus would continue to receive federal funds uninterrupted.

He said there were four steps in the 2016 review to determine how the ACOG MPO was carrying out the certification process.

They had individual interviews with ITPC members: Hon. Jay Adams, Mustang Mayor, Jason Ferbrache, COTPA Administrator, and Hon. Pete White, Oklahoma City Councilmember and thanked them for their time.

Mr. Akem said there was a public listening session on Monday, October 17, that was held in conjunction with the Citizens Advisory Committee. He said about 20 people participated as FHWA and FTA listened to the views of the public and questions or issues they had with the planning process. He said the comments received will be reflected in the report that will be prepared before the end of next month.

Mr. Akem said the planning partners included ACOG, ODOT, COTPA, CART, and Citylink and and they all participated in the desk audit review process on October 25 and 26. He concluded that the planning process is being conducted very well.

He said the process is designed to produce some products, which included the long-range transportation plan that this Committee discussed today, the Public Participation Plan to determine if ACOG reached out to the public, including minorities, traditionally underserved populations, and the disabled. Other products discussed included the

Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Short-Range Plan, the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), and the Congestion Management Plan (CMP).

FHWA/FTA Observations:

- Products are completed in a timely manner according to the law and regulations
- Meets conditions of being collaborative, comprehensive, continuous
- Adequate public involvement
- Extensive use of social media to target certain populations and reach them in different ways
- Staff provides much technical assistance to the members, both in data and support
- MPO is on the cutting edge with scenario planning in being able to understand how that works in narrowing down the alternatives and capturing the essence of planning – very good mark of recognition
- Bicycle/Pedestrian activities a significant investment extensive network showing where people can bike and walk
- Open streets is good for the planning process
- In preparing the Long-Range Plan, staff looked ahead at the funding that was
 expected to be received and the anticipated costs. He said staff demonstrated
 significant financial constraint in part because of the way the planners were able to
 identify to the fullest extent the sources of revenues
- Staff is using some of the recent data from the National Performance Management Research Data Set which is put out by FHWA, noting that data is more efficient than data collected locally. Staff is up to speed in the planning task in this area.
- The collaboration/cooperation among COTPA/CART/ODOT/MPO is very commendable. COTPA and CART rely on ACOG for technical issues which is also commendable.

Mr. Akem said a report will be issued by the end of next month, but beforehand, a draft will be presented to ACOG staff for review of the technical information. He said this process belongs to the members and is being carried out in accordance with the law, noting that there is no reservation about making a recommendation for continued certification of this process.

5. TRANSPORTATION NEWS AND UPDATES

John G. Johnson asked Holly Massie to come forward. He said tomorrow was her last full-time day, but she will continue on as an ACOG consultant if the Board approves today. He said Ms. Massie joined ACOG in March 1988. He announced that the Committee could enjoy cake and punch following the meetings as they congratulate her.

Ms. Massie said it has been a real pleasure working at ACOG and that she enjoyed it a lot. She thanked them for all their support. The Committee applauded.

E. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

Chairman White asked if there was any new business to present. No new business was presented.

F. <u>ADJOURN</u>

There being no further business, Chairman White adjourned the meeting at 2:25 p.m.



The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a federal-aid program administered by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department (OTRD). This reimbursement-type grant program is part of the Transportation Alternatives formula funding. The RTP provides for 80 percent federal share and requires a 20 percent local match. The match may be either in cash or in value of documented contributions. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for the match up to 95 percent of the total project cost.

<u>The application deadline is 4:00 p.m. on TUESDAY, January 31, 2017.</u> The 2017 application and further information is available at https://otrd.ok.gov/0kTourism/Federal%20Grants/Default.aspx. The funding cap for non-motorized projects is \$240,000 (with at least a \$60,000 match). There is no cap for motorized projects. Notification of awards will be announced in July of 2017.

OCARTS Area TIP to Reflect the ODOT Projects Listed in the 8-Year Construction Work Plan

INFORMATION:

On October 3, 2016, the Oklahoma Transportation Commission approved a new 8-Year Construction Work Plan (FFY 2017–FFY 2024) for the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT). The first four years of the 8-Year Plan will be incorporated into the FFY 2017-2020 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

To ensure consistency between the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and the latest funding priorities reflected in the 8-Year Construction Work Plan and STIP, it is requested that the FFY 2017-FFY 2020 state highway system projects reflected on the following pages replace the ODOT projects currently listed in the OCARTS TIP. New projects are indicated with shading.

In order to utilize federal transportation funding, eligible projects are required to be listed in both the metropolitan and statewide transportation improvement programs. Approval of these amendments will not impact the region's Surface Transportation Program Urbanized Area (STP-UZA) funds available for use by OCARTS area local governments.
