#### III. ITEM FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

A. Phillip Walters, Associate Planner with the City of Oklahoma City Planning Department, provided a presentation on the city's recently adopted impact fees ordinance. Mr. Walters noted that while the City of Oklahoma City has had impacts fees related to water and sewer for some time, the new impact fees ordinance would focus on parks and transportation. The presentation highlighted the development process leading up to the adoption of the ordinance including outreach to local developers, as well as the ordinance's implementation once it was approved.

Mr. Walters stated that the city began collecting the new transportation and park impact fees on new development projects starting January 1, 2017. The revenue generated from the fees will help pay for new street, park, and trail infrastructure. Mr. Walters explained that this would allow the city to use more general obligation bond money for maintenance projects. According to the ordinance, the fees must be spent in the zone in which they were collected.

**SUBJECT:** 2010-2014 Building Permits and Demolitions

#### INFORMATION:

As part of the update of the Long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), ACOG staff collects building permits and demolition data from each community. Residential and commercial permit data are very helpful in tracking regional development. Staff received GIS and Excel files from member entities and used aerial photography to identify the new permits in other communities. The table below contains residential building permit counts for the OCARTS area from 2010 to 2014. These residential permits will be used to develop the 2015 population estimates that will be used for the 2045 MTP.
