I. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions around the room. There was a quorum.

II. <u>APPROVAL OF THE JULY 20, 2017 MINUTES</u>

Wayne Stenis moved to approve the July 20, 2017 meeting minutes. Ahmad Lesani seconded the motion. The motion carried.

III. <u>ACTION ITEMS:</u>

A. <u>Consider recommending that the ITPC amend the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area TIP by replacing the COTPA FFY 2018 Transit Element with the attached programs of projects, and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).</u>

Chip Nolen of COTPA (Embark) highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. There was no discussion.

Angelo Lombardo moved to recommend that the ITPC amend the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area TIP by replacing the COTPA FFY 2018 Transit Element with the attached programs of projects, and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Taylor Johnson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

B. Consider recommending that the ITPC amend the FFY 2017 element of the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS Area TIP to include the US-77 bridge replacement project, and amend the FFY 2018 element of the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area TIP to include the I-40 reconstruct and added lanes project moved from FFY 2017, as requested by ODOT.

Kathryn Wenger highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. Daniel Nguyen provided further details. There being no discussion, Elizabeth Weitman moved to recommend that the ITPC amend the FFY 2017 element of the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS Area TIP to include the US-77 bridge replacement project, and amend the FFY 2018 element of the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area TIP to include the I-40 reconstruct and added lanes project moved from FFY 2017, as requested by ODOT. Ahmad Lesani seconded the motion. The motion carried.

IV. <u>ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:</u>

A. <u>ODOT Safety Performance Measures and Targets</u>

John Sharp introduced Matt Swift of ODOT to present ODOT's Safety Performance Measures and Targets. Mr. Swift said that Congress has taken funding specifically designated in the MAP-21 Act and made it more flexible in the FAST Act for State DOT's to use. Under the FAST Act, the Highway Safety Improvement Program, the National Highway Performance Program, and the Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program now have stipulations, one of which is a Performance Based approach to making sure that the money is being spent correctly. As a consequence, with the performance measures, if you do not spend it in the right way, say, your safety project does not turn out well, then you are designated to still spend that money on safety, instead of other state project priorities.

Mr. Swift said there are five safety-related performance measures associated with the Highway Safety Improvement Program money. This includes number of fatalities, number of serious injuries, rate of fatalities for 100 million vehicles of miles traveled (VMT), rate of serious injuries for 100 million vehicles of miles traveled, number of non-motorized fatalities and non-motorized serious injuries. He said the Dept. of Public Safety compiles these numbers and this information is aggregated by other agencies for the performance measures for the safety matrix, which is done over a five year rolling average. At the end of four years, they set targets and will review to see if they have met the targets they tried to set. Based upon a trend line of serious injuries and fatalities, if they are below the line, there will be flexibility to continue to use the money. If they are above the trend line, then FHWA will require money that had flexibility previously to be directed to an area where the targets were not met.

Mr. Swift said that MPOs have been given the option to use the State's targets or come up with its own targets. John Sharp said ACOG might use a similar methodology that ODOT has used and will bring them to the Committee over the next few months to decide what the entities wish to do. The MPO targets are due by the end of February 2018.

B. <u>Suggested Modifications to the STBG-UZA Project Evaluation Criteria</u>

Kathryn Wenger said that in July, comments were sought for the current Criteria, explaining that it is not the same Criteria that ACOG will be reviewing and changing with the consultant. For the current Criteria, she said one comment for change was received, requesting that there would be a Call for Projects every two years instead of every year. That would set funding priorities for two years instead of every year. She said ACOG is willing to support this change, but if it is accepted, ACOG would like to hold off until the new Criteria is updated so there is a chance to allow the new Criteria to have an impact on the call for projects in 2018.

Commissioner Marven Goodman shared that it would benefit the counties to have a two-year lock-in for funding. Isaac Akem said that only the first year is an actual commitment whereby projects are fully funded by FHWA based on the availability of funds. Mr. Goodman said that for planning purposes, it would still be good to have a two-year lock-in.

Ms. Wenger said ACOG is still working on setting a kickoff meeting for the consultant for review of the new Criteria. She said the hope is to have a meeting with Olsson in the next couple of weeks and then the kickoff meeting with an ITTC Subcommittee. She asked who would like to be on the subcommittee to discuss the Criteria changes. Volunteers included Chad Meisenburg, Commissioner Goodman, Geoffrey Butler, Angelo Lombardo, Stacey Trumbo, Ahmad Lesani, Eric Brandt, and Patrick Menefee. She said the first subcommittee meeting would take place after an ITTC meeting in the next couple of months.

C. <u>Schedule for Update of the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement</u> Program (TIP)

Ms. Wenger informed the Committee of the schedule for the FFY 2019, 2020, and 2021 Call for Projects to update the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS TIP, noting that on November 1, the Call for Projects email will be sent out and December 15 is the deadline for the applications this year. Then, ACOG will hold the Special Meeting in February 2018 (instead of January) in order to give staff more time to review the applications and verify the documentation.

D. <u>Call for Projects – ACOG CLEAN AIR Grants for OCARTS Area Public Fleets</u>

Eric Pollard said this is a vehicle replacement and reimbursement program to remove gasoline and diesel vehicles from fleets and replace with alternative fueled vehicles. He said ACOG staff plans to release its next Call for Projects under the ACOG CLEAN AIR Grants for OCARTS area Public Fleets, offering approximately \$350,000 in CMAQ funding. He said all of the entities on this Committee, public schools, technical colleges, public trusts, etc. are eligible for this opportunity.

He said there was a new development in that Volkswagen diesel emissions settlement where a modified agreement is in the federal court system. The court has the opportunity to review that agreement. It affects ACOG in that the State of Oklahoma will receive around \$20 million and a portion of that settlement is to provide NOX emissions mitigation project funding. There are a number of eligible projects under that mitigation fund. The State has not indicated what projects will be funded. ACOG will be monitoring that funding closely.

E. Review of the OCARTS Area Regional Snow Routes

Jennifer Sebesta referred the Committee to the Snow Routes map, which can be viewed online through the link that is provided. She said if an entity wishes to have a more detailed map of their community, ACOG staff can provide that to them. As noted in the agenda memorandum, necessary changes need to be submitted to jsebesta@acogok.org by Wednesday, October 4.

F. <u>OCARTS Area Line Item Projects and Administrative Modifications</u>

John Sharp said this is an informational item identifying specific FFY 2017 OCARTS projects that were previously included in statewide line items, and the second table reflects FFY 2017 administrative modifications affecting OCARTS area STIP projects.

G. Status of Surface Transportation Program Urbanized Area (STP-UZA) Projects in the OCARTS Transportation Management Area (TMA)

John Sharp said this is the monthly status report on STBG-UZA projects in the OCARTS TMA. He noted that the lists reflect:

- 1) The FFY 2017 STP-UZA projects included in the FFY 2017-2020 OCARTS Area TIP
- 2) The updated FFY 2018-2020 projects approved by the ITPC on February 23, 2017
- 3) Potential FFY 2021-2024 projects, for 8-year planning purposes only, which allows 0D0T to continue environmental review
- 4) The unscheduled projects which are programmed but not in the TIP

Mr. Sharp asked if anyone had questions regarding the status of the FFY 2017 and FFY 2018 STP-UZA projects in the FFY 2017-FFY 2020 TIP. There was no discussion.

V. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

Chairman Sharp asked if there was any new business to present.

National Highway System (NHS) Map Completed

Isaac Akem said the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has completed the NHS review and now has a completed NHS map for the State of Oklahoma that will be recommended to headquarters. He said that at the next ITTC meeting, FHWA can provide copies of the NHS map. He explained a bit of history, saying that after MAP-21, it was a requirement that all principle arterials be designated as part of the interstate NHS, so updates had to be made.

Ozone Season Update

Eric Pollard said that the Oklahoma Dept. of Environmental Quality called an Ozone Alert Day yesterday and our region had a number of exceedances. He said eventually this may cause our region to be pushed over the current standard.

Welcome to New ACOG Assistant Planner

Kathryn Wenger said that ACOG has a new transportation employee, Stuart Campbell. He will be working on some of ACOG's system performance, performance measures, safety, etc.

SUBJECT: Request for Amendment of the FFY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program

(TIP) by the City of The Village

INFORMATION:

The City of The Village has requested an amendment to the FFY 2018 element of the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the reconstruction of Britton Rd. from Pennsylvania Ave. to May Ave. (JP#3110204 & 3159704).

The request is to move the previously approved projects and associated Surface Transportation Block Grant Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) funds from FFY 2016 and 2017 to FFY 2018. The City of The Village has requested this amendment to ensure enough time to secure the additional funding for increased project costs of 75% over original estimates due to a change in project scope.

The request includes an increase in the federal share from \$1,601,908 to \$3,044,224.98. The STBG-UZA funding approval for the FFY 2017 project in the amount of \$819,672, would be carried forward to FFY 2018. However, there were no remaining funds from FFY 2016 to be carried over. **The additional \$2,224,552.98** in funds would be taken out of FFY 2019 to maintain a fiscally constrained TIP. This would reduce the amount of funds available for this November's call for projects. Attached is a detailed description of the request.

Dear Ms. Wenger:

I am writing on behalf of The City of The Village to formally request that the two referenced Britton Road Projects be moved from 2017 to 2018 due an increase in cost of approximately 75% above initial estimates. The certified engineer's cost for each Project is attached.

The Village has completed design and engineering work for the Projects, but we request a delay to bid them in March 2018 in order to allow time to obtain alternative and additional funding for the local share. We are currently working on a general obligation bond package to provide the necessary funding.

As you know, Britton Road serves a very important role in Central Oklahoma. It is a key connector to Lake Hefner, linking that regional asset and its amenities to diverse communities in The Village and north Oklahoma City. The portion of Britton Road covered by the Projects carries over 21,000 cars a day, many of which are traveling to or from the Lake Hefner Parkway (OK-74). In many respects, it is more of a regional road than a local road. Yet it serves a critical local function as one of only four commercially-zoned corridors in The Village.

These Projects were originally intended to be simply mill and overlay. However, the required coring revealed that the base was unstable in some places, and systematic coring further revealed that most of the base needed to be replaced, thus shifting the project to reconstruction, with the result that the cost of the project increased dramatically. We explored the possibility of achieving cost-savings through the use of asphalt, but we believe long-range cost-effectiveness is best achieved by using concrete, given its longer lifespan.

The one-year delay will enable us to obtain appropriate long-term financing, rather than paying for our local share out of operating funds, which would strain our liquidity beyond our normal policies and practices. This will also enable us to explore

potential improvements to the current design, in terms of addressing some of the access management issues and pursuing enhancements to safety, walkability, and active transportation. We believe this opportunity to polish the Projects will make them a better investment for everyone.

For these reasons, we request postponement of these two Projects. They are the top priority for our city, and we appreciate your consideration. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to give me a call at 751-8861 ext. 259. Thank you.

SUBJECT: Quarterly Transit Coordination Meeting Update

INFORMATION:

All transit agencies and sub-recipients of transit funding in the OCARTS area meet on a quarterly basis throughout the region to stay up to date on fleet status and new development at each of the agencies. Representatives from CART, COTPA, Citylink and ACOG met on September 6, 2017 at the COTPA offices in Oklahoma City to discuss new business with the agencies since the last quarterly meeting in June. Highlights from the meeting:

CART

- CART recently made a change to Route 10 to better serve the new University North Park retail development (off I-35 and Robinson St)
- CART officials will be traveling to Minnesota to observe the Hometown Trolley Factory and see the trolleys be built. CART is to receive two new 35', low floor CNG trolleys in January 2018.
- CARTs Accessibility Committee (CTAC) has been meeting regularly and has completed several route-rides to better understand the difficulties of riding fixed route service with any type of disability
- The ADA Coordinator for the City of Norman has hired a consultant team to complete a formal ADA plan for the city. Bus stops and bus accessibility will be included in this plan and CART is assisting the consultants with the information requested.

COTPA

- Currently ramping up marketing for the new Downtown Streetcar. COTPA has released several renderings of their future streetcars stops and is working on a safety campaign to inform drivers about how to interact with the streetcars when they are operational in late 2018.
- O Spokies and the Oklahoma River Ferry continues to see increases in ridership
- Spokies was recently awarded a TAP Grant to put in three new docking stations:
 2 additional stations in the downtown area and 1 new stand-alone station at Lake Hefner
- Recently completed installation of all 79 bus stop shelters through a contract with Tyler
 Media. There is a potential to add more shelters with another contract with Tyler
- Currently in the process of plans to reroute the Downtown Discovery route. This route will be changed to better serve the Streetcar once it comes on-line.
- Working with the city Parks and Recreation Department to conduct a Bus Stop Inventory
 of all bus stops serviced by COTPA/EMBARK. The inventory will include listing all
 amenities at each stop such as sidewalk access, shelters, assets, locations, etc.
- COTPA is in the process of searching for a consultant to provide additional planning and scheduling assistance to help make sure EMBARK's routes are best serving the citizens of Oklahoma City.

Citylink

- The City of Edmond is working with a contractor to install bus stops across the entire city to coincide with their new Bus Stop Policy. The contractor has a completion date of October 16th.
- Citylink has been working to remove all bus benches that are located on old routes that are no longer serviced.
- Citylink is wanting to have shelters installed at all bus stop locations. There is currently a request to bid for contractors to install these shelters.
- Citylink will be receiving 2 new full size buses and 2 new vans in the coming months to replace 3-4 older busses that are past their useful life.
- Citylink is currently working with a bicycle committee to potentially start a bike share program in Edmond
