III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – MAY 25, 2017

Director John Brown, Piedmont, made a motion to approve the May 25, 2017 Garber-Wellington Association Policy Committee minutes. Director Ray Poland, Jones City, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

IV. STAFF REPORT

a. The Norman Well Field Expansion-Picking the Location

Norman is implementing an exploration program to locate new water wells. Geophysical logs (especially gamma radiation logs) are used to define and map the sand channels. ACOG staff used the ACOG well log database to map the channels. A cost-benefit analysis was run on the water collection system to determine overall costs regarding location on the system. This being done, one can then rank the sand channel prospects about expansion costs. The next step in the well location process: negotiation with landowners!

b. Oklahoma City WWTP Modeling

The Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG) was asked by staff of Oklahoma City to reassess the water quality modeling on the Canadian River due to a proposed repositioning of the effluent location from an unnamed tributary of the Canadian River to a direct input into the river itself.

The previous regional model by Guernsey completed in October 2014 had modeled four different scenarios (Scenarios A-D) and a Scenario E was modeled by ACOG in 2016. Scenario F is another permutation of the previously modeled dischargers. To move the discharge location to the river itself, effluent quality during the summer will have to be better — the dissolved oxygen concentration will have to be 7.0 mgl rather than the permitted 6.5 mgl.

c. OK County GW Model

The Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG) was asked by staff of Oklahoma County to assess the impact of domestic water drilling in the Deer Creek area on the aquifer. This location is undergoing rapid development.

The Hennessey Shale is the critical element in the discussion. This gypsum-rich shale increases in thickness west of Meridian Avenue where most domestic would have at least 100 feet of shale in the top half of the well, with Garber Sandstone in the lower portion of the well. Based on this groundwater modelling the well design that is often used in this area [180-200 feet deep] is insufficient in many places for sustainable production in a drought and may not provide the homeowner a reliable water source. This is especially true as one goes west away from the Garber sandstone and towards the Hennessey Shale.

West of Meridian Avenue the prospects for public water supply groundwater development decrease dramatically due to water quantity and quality affected by the Hennessey Shale. Until the water challenge is solved, the Deer Creek area will remain a relatively low population density area.

069002 - ACOG Drought Program

The ACOG Drought Program started in 2006 when Central Oklahoma had the first good drought year in decades. There is a monthly report generated detailing statistics on rainfall, water conditions, reservoir conditions, and short and long-term forecasts. This report by the Water Resources Division of ACOG is issued via email to interested parties. Notify us if you want to be added to the distribution list to receive the report.

Oklahoma is now in a long-term dry cycle and we may continue to experience drought conditions over the next three to five years. Rainfall in May 2015 effectively ended the short-term drought conditions. Presently, drought conditions do not exist over most of Oklahoma, however, groundwater levels are still at levels seen in the 2010-14 drought.

Since the last progress report, two monthly reports have been generated.

151001 - Norman Water Plan

Staff reviewed and helped propose well locations for the city of Norman, based on net sand maps in the aquifer that were generated last summer. Cross-sections were prepared for three proposed locations. Site locations under cost-analysis review.

15604(b) - City of Midwest City Groundwater Model

As part of a 604(b) grant, staff is constructing a regional groundwater model for Midwest City to review drought impacts on the well field.

174601 - OK CO Groundwater Model

Staff has been asked to review zoning in NW Oklahoma County about domestic well spacing in the aquifer. A groundwater model has been generated to address domestic well drilling practices in the Deer Creek area.
