**Step 4: Performance Measures** -- Quantitative indicator that can be monitored over time

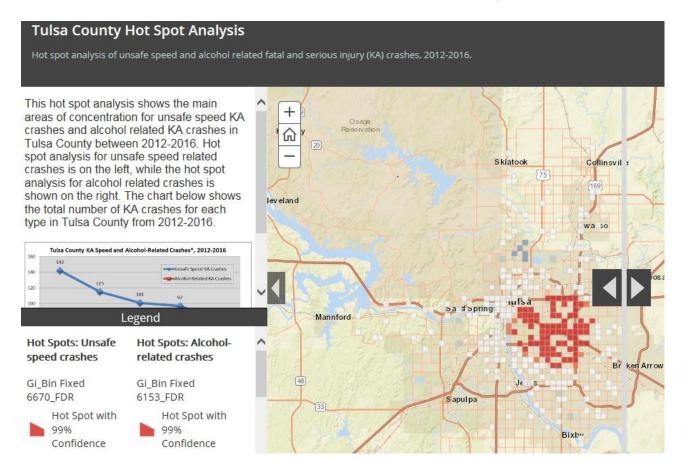

## Fundability – Not allowable

- Incentives or prizes of cash, gift cards or services
- Land
- Legislative expenses
- Police/emergency communications
- Alcoholic beverages including training
- Fines and penalties
- Supplanting replacement of current funded program
- Any expenses outside of the approved grant period
- Capital expenditures/capital construction
