I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Jan Fees called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m.

II. APPROVAL OF THE NOVEMBER 9, 2017 MEETING MINUTES

Hon. Jim Mickley moved to approve the November 9, 2017 meeting minutes. Eric Brandt seconded the motion. The motion carried.

III. ACTION ITEMS:

A. Motion to elect 2018 APTAC officers

The committee elected to continue the two-year service term of previous committee chairs and vice chairs. Jan Fees was nominated to continue as Chair and Monica Cardin was nominated to continue as Vice Chair. The nominations were then closed and the Hon. Jim Mickley made the motion to accept these nominations for APTAC officers. Wayne Stenis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

IV. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

A. <u>Bicycle and Pedestrian Crash Analysis</u>

Charlotte Adcock, Assistant Planner with ACOG, provided an overview of her analysis of bicycle and pedestrian related crashes in Central Oklahoma. Ms. Adcock presented her initial findings, including information regarding crash cause, light conditions, and crashes involving distracted drivers. A list of the most dangerous locations in the region for both cyclists and pedestrians was provided to the committee and Ms. Adcock selected several of the locations for a more detailed indepth analysis. Ms. Adcock concluded by stating that many communities in the region are working to address bicycle and pedestrian safety issues. The committee was invited to review the data and provide feedback.

B. 2018 Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program

John Sharp, Deputy Director with ACOG, reminded committee members that the 2018 Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program application deadline is 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 31, 2018. The program is a reimbursement-type grant program that provides 80 percent federal share and requires a 20 percent local match. Mr. Sharp stressed that a public meeting is required prior to applying for the grant.

C Safe Routes to Grant and Transportation Alternative Program

John Sharp informed the committee that the application period for the statewide Safe Routes to Schools will likely open later in the spring of 2018. Originally, the application was to open in January 2018. Mr. Sharp also stated that ODOT will be requiring a preliminary project application to facilitate an ODOT project site visit and application feedback. The final project application will be due after the initial review.

D. <u>Planner Bingo</u>

ACOG hosted the first annual Planner Bingo for APTAC committee members. The lucky winners were Rebecca Blaine (Guthrie), Danielle Barker (Bethany), Wayne Steins (Norman), Monica Cardin (Del City). ACOG staff thanked the committee for their involvement.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Community Activities and Updates

Erik Brandt, Oklahoma County, said they are working on sixth phase of buyouts for residents of Crutcho Creek. Oklahoma County is expecting to purchase five or more houses in this phase, with another 20 to 30 remaining. The county has not received request for residential building permits, but has started work on their master plan and subdivision regulations updates.

Wayne Stenis, Norman, said the city is finalizing their comprehensive plan update. Through Norman Forward, the city has plans for two additional libraries, as well as park and trail improvements. Mr. Stenis also mentioned that Norman has adopted a form-based code for the center of the city.

Hon. Jim Mickley, Vice Mayor with Warr Acres, said he was just re-elected for a fourth term. Mr. Mickley said the city is focusing on economic development since they have lost several businesses, which is affecting their tax base. Warr Acres is also working on their town center redevelopment, which is expected to be a three-year project.

Rebecca Blaine, Guthrie, said they are working on an outdoor venue/green space for downtown Guthrie. The city is also working on economic development and city staff went to ICSC in Dallas last week to recruit retailers. Ms. Blaine said the city is working on two projects for trails grants. Guthrie's sales tax is up 15 percent from last month.

Danielle Barker, Bethany, announced that the city is working on their first TIF district. Bethany is currently working on vision plans for its 23rd Street corridor and historic areas. Ms. Barker mentioned that the city is reviewing its charter in order to increase the allowable density within the city limits. Bethany is also working on several other projects, including: revitalizing city parks, installing sidewalk, and rebuilding a city library.

Ava Zrenda, Moore, mentioned the city are working on rezoning a travel center project at 27th St. and I-35. The project has been on hold and has received some push pack, but is going before the planning commission in January. Moore is also in the initial phase of developing a form-based code for the Old Town area.

Robert Floyd, Blanchard, said they have five new subdivisions in various stages for approval. In the spring, the University of Oklahoma will be assisting with a downtown concept plan. Also, Oklahoma State University will be completing a park study for community sports park. Blanchard has just finished its fourth building renovation, a senior citizens center on the corner of Broadway and May. Mr. Floyd mentioned the city has a 300,000-gallon water tower that will be in service by the first of the year and Blanchard's long-awaited water line service will be connected back to Oklahoma City by this Christmas 2017.

Jan Fees, Edmond, said the Spring Creek Trail opened on Thanksgiving Day. Ms. Fees also mentioned that the city has been busy, and the planning commission is expected to review twenty items at their next meeting.
