D. <u>ITEMS REQUIRING INDIVIDUAL ACTION AND/OR DISCUSSION:</u>

1. <u>PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION ON REQUEST FOR AMENDMENT OF THE FFY 2018-2021</u> TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) BY THE CITY OF DEL CITY

Kathryn Wenger explained that the City of Del City is requesting additional funds for this bridge project as its cost has increased over 20 percent. She said the additional funding would have to come out of the FFY 2019 element of the TIP. Mayor Hoffman shared his concern about this funding taking away from other entity projects. John Sharp said there is a new solution for rehabilitating that bridge with a new type of coating that has gone

up in price. It is a new application, so companies that are available to do the project are limited and there is concern as to how much it will cost.

Mr. Sharp said the ITTC had a long discussion on this item and know they must get better control of these cost estimates. In January, the ITTC agenda will include an item stating that FFY 2019 projects will be capped and if the entity's estimate increases, then the entity must take care of that overage. He said there are some built-in overages in all of these projects currently, but this project went over the 20 percent. He also said that ACOG is in communication with ODOT staff to develop a scoping form, explaining all the project dynamics and details so the engineer and the entity can go through the process in a detailed fashion to help eliminate some of the final cost overages.

Dawn Sullivan said the nature of every bridge project is that you really do not know how bad the damage is until you start looking. The estimate is at greater risk to be accurate than a bridge replacement project, but of course, a replacement would cost five times more than a rehabilitation. There are so many things that are volatile with a construction estimate that no engineer is going to be able to promise or guarantee that the entity will hit that estimate; it is not reasonable to expect that level of accuracy. However, to do a bridge rehabilitation, the entity must understand that 10 percent contingency is not enough; there must be a great amount of variability. Ms. Sullivan said money can be set aside that is not allocated each year to accommodate these overages. Mr. Sharp said ACOG does set aside 10 percent, but apparently that is not enough. Ms. Sullivan added that if the entity makes bidders be more accountable, the bidder will over-estimate and the region will get less projects in a given year.

Chairman Jay Adams opened the public hearing. There being no response from the public, the public hearing was closed.

Councilmember Ken Bartlett moved to amend the FFY 2018 element of the FFY 2018-2021 OCARTS Area TIP to update the price for the Bridge Rehab over Cherry Creek in Del City and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Mayor Mike McEachern seconded the motion.

Mayor Lynne Miller pointed out that the ITPC did approve The Village last month and it would make her uncomfortable if we now say no to Del City because we know we cannot keep doing this. Chairman Adams agreed, saying he did not want to penalize an entity in need right now for something we plan to do in the future.

Mr. Campbell offered to help the entities if they have an intersection they need to review. Mr. Sharp said ACOG has been working with the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office to see if there are any grants available to help the entities put in some extra speed monitors, lighting, etc. for some of their high crash areas.

4. TRANSPORTATION NEWS AND UPDATES

John Sharp said ACOG staff attended some FHWA target setting training in regards to safety, along with FHWA, ODOT, and INCOG.

ACOG staff gave a Regional Transit Authority (RTA) presentation at the Midwest City Council meeting in November.

There have been a number of Clean Cities and electric vehicle coalition meetings in the last few weeks.

ACOG hosted an Autonomous Vehicle Seminar/Workshop in the Board Room with about 30 attendees. Cambridge Systematics came in to give background information.

ACOG gave an RTA presentation at the monthly city managers meeting that was held at ACOG, and future meetings with some of the entities' city managers were set as a result.

ACOG staff was asked to speak at the Santa Fe Hub opening last week.

ACOG staff attended ODEQ's Volkswagen Settlement Listening Session and the Clean Cities Coalition presented a list of suggestions. Mayor Ray Poland asked for details. Eric Pollard said that as of December 5, ODEQ has the task of determining how \$21 million will be spent in the State of Oklahoma. They have a list of eligible projects, from heavy duty trucking to electric vehicle charging. He said it will be similar to ACOG's public fleet program for vehicle replacement, but they have not decided how much the entities will be reimbursed as a public sector entity. ODEQ is working through a lot of questions and ACOG presented ideas of what they could look at, including prioritization of areas that struggle with ozone pollution. Mr. Pollard said there will be a blog post on some of ACOG's comments. ODEQ has ten years to spend the funds. The settlement is set up in three phases in which they can spend funds, so the state has to decide if they will spend as much as they can up front, or spread it out over the ten years. One of the questions they must think about is, as technology improves, the state might get more of an emissions benefit if we wait.

ACOG staff met with ODEQ to go over 2017 ozone numbers and prepare for next year.

Mr. Sharp said the Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA) registration deadline is tomorrow. He said the Census Bureau wants the entities' street names and address ranges for every street in their city, which allows them to get more accurate population counts, which helps when applying for grants.

ACOG received notice today of the Department of Energy grant for next year of about \$45,000, which helps ACOG with some of its coalitions in regards to air quality.

E. NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Adams asked if there was any new business to present.

Mayor David Bennett said that his alternate, Cathy Cummings, could not attend today, but wanted to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and will see everyone next year.

No further new business was presented.

F. ADJOURN

There being no further business, Chairman Adams adjourned the meeting at 2:52 p.m.

SUBJECT: Suggested Modifications to the STBG-UZA Program Procedures

INFORMATION:

In October, ACOG staff received requests for review of cost overruns and clarification of the current *Surface Transportation Block Grant Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Program Procedures for the OCARTS Area Funds*. After review, staff found that procedures regarding project cost overruns and the movement of TIP projects between years, need to either be further clarified or new procedures need to be put in place. Following this memorandum is a <u>summary of project cost overruns for the last 5 years</u>.

SUBJECT: OCARTS Safety Performance Measures and Target Setting

INFORMATION:

Performance-based planning and programming has become a national emphasis per recent federal transportation legislation—namely, the 2012 Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act and the 2015 Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. Federal planning requirements direct metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) to coordinate with their respective state department of transportation and area public transportation providers in developing 14 performance measures and targets to track and maximize the benefits of transportation planning decisions and infrastructure investments.

Recently the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) submitted the five required safety targets to FHWA. Now, ACOG as an MPO needs to identify and submit its regional safety targets for those same five performance measures by February 27, 2018. Federal guidance states that MPOs may either support the targets of the state, or may submit their own targets based on the data from our region. In either instance, ACOG will need to report on the measures and the targets, and eventually explain how our region is making progress towards reaching those targets. This occurs through both our short-range plan (TIP) and our long-range plan (MTP). In particular, ACOG should select projects using criteria which help support the goals, measures and targets established by our region in the MTP. The presentation will review possible options for our regional safety targets, and in February they will be brought back to the Committees for final consideration.
