




ECONOMIC STRENGTH

 Goal: Promote economic vitality through enhanced mobility

Objectives:

- Invest in improvements that enhance the efficiency of the existing transportation system
- Improve accessibility to regional employment centers
- Increase efficiency of goods movement by truck, rail, water, air, and pipeline

HOW IMPORTANT IS THE GOAL OF ECONOMIC STRENGTH TO YOU AND YOUR ORGANIZATION?





ECONOMIC STRENGTH

- Improving accessibility:
 - > To regional commerce in addition to employment
 - > To existing businesses in communities where walking, biking, or wheelchair travel are possible
 - > From transportation hubs to tourism destinations
- Increasing efficiency:
 - > Of moving goods by rail so as to remove oversized trucks from the roads (decrease road maintenance)
 - > Of people movement by various transportation modes
 - > Of goods movement to make the state more viable for manufacturing and distribution
- Combine Economic Strength and System Preservation so as to reflect the cost of long-term maintenance




SAFETY & SECURITY

 Goal: Provide a safe and secure transportation system

Objectives:

- Improve design, construction, and maintenance of infrastructure to reduce the number and severity of crashes, injuries, and fatalities
- Increase awareness of the public on safety issues and skills
- Collaborate on transportation system security strategies

HOW IMPORTANT IS THE GOAL OF SAFETY AND SECURITY TO YOU AND YOUR ORGANIZATION?







SAFETY & SECURITY

- Question of how "increase awareness of the public" is an achievable objective
- "Collaborate on transportation system safety and security strategies"
- Safety measures should make specific mention of pedestrians
- Prioritize the most vulnerable users, people in wheelchairs, walking, or biking
- Collaborate with law enforcement on the enforcement of bicycle laws.
 Emphasize the promotion and implementation of safe bicycle and pedestrian systems and procedures
- Include environmental issues such as air quality and urban heat reduction in approach to public safety
- Increase safety of goods movement to make the state more viable for manufacturing and distribution




EQUITY & OPTIONS

 Goal: Provide transportation access for the movement of all people and goods

Objectives:

- Provide equitable transportation services and improvements
- Expand and maintain a safe, secure, and accessible public transportation system
- Expand and maintain accessible and connected pedestrian and bicycle facilities

HOW IMPORTANT IS THE GOAL OF EQUITY AND OPTIONS TO YOU AND YOUR ORGANIZATION?





EQUITY & OPTIONS

- Clarify the definition of equity, can be difficult to operationalize and can be interpreted as political
- Provide infrastructure that complies with the American With Disabilities Act (ADA)
- Invest equally in all parts of the community to eliminate systemic racism
- Decide if the bicycle/pedestrian facilities and public transportation improvements are for the entire OCARTS region or if it is only for certain areas
- Prioritize accessible and connected bicycle/pedestrian facilities through funding opportunities
- As more and more families migrate towards the suburbs, offering equitable transportation alternatives is essential




HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

 Goal: Recognize and improve the connection between land use and transportation to enable citizens to live healthier lives and reduce environmental impact from vehicle travel

Objectives:

- Improve and increase the walkability and bikeability of the region
- Encourage use of alternative energy and cleaner-burning fuels
- Reduce the impacts transportation projects have on the environment

HOW IMPORTANT IS THE GOAL OF HEALTHY COMMUNITIES TO YOU AND YOUR ORGANIZATION?





HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

- Increase accessibility to healthcare services
- Advocate for and incentivize the use of alternative energy. Increase infrastructure for clean energy modes of transportation
- Focus on areas where there has not been improvements in some time
- Have walkable sidewalks and designated bike lanes
- Clean resources (air, water, soil, etc.) are necessary to preserve the foundation of the "Quality of Life" in the state
- Plan for climate change and extreme weather events as it relates to damage to infrastructure and services




CONNECTIVITY

 Goal: Develop connections among all types of transportation

Objectives:

- Provide efficient connections within and between modes and facilities
- Better connect land use and transportation decision-making
- Invest in projects that enhance the existing transportation infrastructure
- Implement a Complete Streets policy where appropriate

HOW IMPORTANT IS THE GOAL OF CONNECTIVITY TO YOU AND YOUR ORGANIZATION?






CONNECTIVITY

- Clarify when it is appropriate to Implement a Complete Streets policy
- Follow through on these goals and complete them in a timely fashion
- Better integrate land use with transportation, such as through code updates

PERFORMANCE

- Goal: Increase the efficiency and reliability of the transportation system
- Objectives:
 - Invest in improvements that enhance the efficiency of the existing transportation system
 - Supply alternative travel options
 - Increase capacity where needed

PERFORMANCE

- This goal is "very important" personally, but less for the organization represented
- Increased capacity is not needed as it increases congestion
- Increased performance of transportation is essential for perishables and time sensitive materials for businesses to operate in the state




SYSTEM PRESERVATION

 Goal: Maintain and improve the quality of the transportation system

Objectives:

- Preserve existing and future transportation investments
- Decrease unnecessary bridge and roadway wear and tear
- Encourage policies and procedures that preserve traffic operations and safety

HOW IMPORTANT IS THE GOAL OF SYSTEM PRESERVATION TO YOU AND YOUR ORGANIZATION?







SYSTEM PRESERVATION

- Increase the efficiency of stop lights, less waiting at lights
- Focus on the goal of allowing businesses to operate and families to enjoy travelling through the state
- Consider incorporating Levelized Cost of Transportation to capture long-term maintenance needs.

OTHER COMMENTS RECEIVED

- Respondents that felt the goals encompassed the transportation issues in the region (12)
- Some objectives are repeated
- Some objectives vague and/or too broad
- Goals need to be aligned with the priorities of who will be implementing the changes

- Influence the public's view of alternative modes of transportation and how long investments take to complete
- Promote alternative sources of revenue
- Educate the public on available options for new revenue sources
- Inclusion of EV as a mode of transportation
- Focus on air quality

- Identify target areas for experimentation with transportation alternatives
- Integrate transportation and land use
- Adhere to ADA design standards
- Adhere to NACTO for urban streets
- Provide for rail access across the metro
