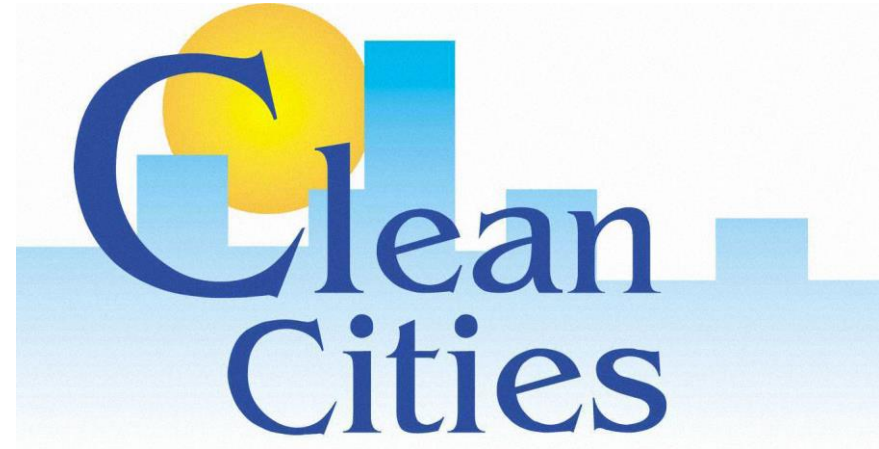

WHAT IS CLEAN CITIES?

- Clean Cities advances the nation's economic, environmental, and energy security by supporting local coalition actions to reduce petroleum consumption.
- Public & private sector stakeholders deploying alternative fuels, idle-reduction measures, fuel economy improvements, and emerging transportation technologies

The Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG) organized the coalition in 1995 and received official Clean Cities designation May 29, 1996

Funding is provided by the Oklahoma Dept. of Commerce (State Energy Office), U.S. Department of Energy support, ACOG, & coalition private sector member dues

Coalition geographic area is Central and Western Oklahoma

ACOG'S CLEAN AIR FOR PUBLIC FLEET GRANTS

- Projects are scored based upon their air quality impact (criteria pollutants)
