



MALE Vs. FEMALE RESPONDENTS




AGE RANGES OF RESPONDENTS






MOSTLY WHITE HOME OWNERS

HOME OF RESPONDENTS





HOW CENTRAL OKLAHOMA GETS TO WORK


TRAVELED TO/FROM WORK DURING THE LAST WEEK

REASON FOR DRIVING ALONE

We asked respondents to tell us the main reasons they most often drove alone.

The following are the top three:

- Quickest/Most convenient: 48% of respondents
- Takes too long to walk/bike/take transit: 35% of respondents
- Walking/biking/taking transit is not safe: 34% of respondents

FUNDING PRIORITIES

When asked which alternative mode of transportation should receive more funding, respondents ranked:

- Top Priority: Biking (trails, bike lanes, etc.)
- Second Priority: Walking (sidewalks, crosswalks, etc.)
- Lowest Priority: Public transportation (bus stops, buses, etc.)


RECREATION

When asked how often during a typical week respondents ride a bike, most respondents never rode as a means of transportation. Even recreationally, most respondents declared they never rode for fun, though this was followed closely by the categories 'Once a week' and '2-3 days a week.'


Most respondents stated they walked, jogged, or ran for fun 2-3 times a week. However they never did so as a means of transportation.

RESPONDENTS WOULD WALK MORE IF...

TOP CONCERNS

- There were more off-street walking or multi-use trails
- There were more sidewalks
- There were safer crosswalks

NEUTRAL CONCERNS

- They had access to public or workplace showers
- They didn't have to coordinate transportation with other family members
- They felt safer from crime while walking

LEAST CONCERNS

 They had better health or physical ability to do so



RESPONDENTS WOULD BIKE MORE IF...

TOP CONCERNS

- There were more barrierprotected bike lanes
- I felt safer from traffic while riding a bike
- There were more off-street multi-use paths

NEUTRAL CONCERNS

- They had access to public or workplace showers
- They didn't have to coordinate transportation with other family members
- They felt safer from crime while biking

 They had better health or physical ability to do so




OPINIONS OF AVS

- When combining the Very Positive with Positive, 108 people like AVs


WHAT IS YOUR GENERAL OPINION ON AVS?






COMPARISONS OF VIEWS

OPINION OF AVS BREAKDOWN BY SEX




OPINION OF AVS BREAKDOWN BY AGE
