Mayor Ray Poland moved to approve that all items under the Consent Docket be considered in one vote. Mayor David Bennett seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

D. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE ITPC ACTION

1. Selection of FY 2021 ACOG Public Fleet CLEAN AIR Grant Projects

Eric Pollard gave a brief overview of the latest round of the Public Fleet CLEAN AIR Grant Projects. There was continued interest in compressed natural gas refuse trucks. New this year, the City of Norman Transit requested two electric vehicle (EV) fast chargers. The city proposes to use one for charging electric transit buses and the other will be open to the public.

Mr. Pollard said two of the projects involved this year are also utilizing the State Volkswagen settlement funding. ACOG used less grant funding than what was available, so Mr. Pollard encouraged the Committee to see, throughout the year, if they have a project that can utilize the funding. Chairman Gentling asked if there would be another round of project selection, and Mr. Pollard said that is possible, or the unused amount would be rolled into next year's funding.

Councilmember Josh Moore made a motion to approve the four projects listed in the agenda memorandum for funding, utilizing CMAQ funds allocated to ACOG's Public Fleet Conversion Grant (CLEAN AIR Grants) Program. Councilmember Stephen T. Holman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Air Quality Small Grant Program Project List

Jennifer Sebesta said ACOG held a Call for Projects for the Air Quality Small Grant Program from October 2 to November 6, 2020. There was \$200,000 in Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funding available for small infrastructure projects and congestion relief efforts.

Ms. Sebesta said ACOG received one application during the call, which was from the City of Oklahoma City requesting funds for the installation of bike lanes along N. Lottie Ave., from NE 4th St. to NE 23rd St., with connections to Kelley Ave. Vertical delineators will be used along the N. Lottie Ave. route to provide protection to cyclists, and shared lanes are proposed along Madison St., from N. Lottie Ave. to N. Kelley Ave. Oklahoma City is seeking \$163,857.60 in CMAQ funds for the project.

A scoring committee consisting of representatives from ODOT, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, and ACOG reviewed Oklahoma City's application and has recommended the project for approval. The remainder of the funds will be rolled to the next Call for Projects in the fall.

Mayor David Bennett made a motion to approve funding the Oklahoma City Bicycle Lane Project for the FY 2021 Air Quality Small Grant Program. Councilmember Stephen T. Holman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. STBG-UZA Project Recommendations for the FFY 2022-2025 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Hayden Harrison said the Intermodal Transportation Technical Committee (ITTC) met January 14 to review and prioritize projects proposed by OCARTS Area local governments to be included in the upcoming FFY 2022-2025 OCARTS Area TIP. She referred the Committee to the tables in the agenda of the ITTC's project recommendations.

Councilmember Mark Hamm made a motion to approve the STBG-UZA projects attached in the agenda memorandum for inclusion in the Preliminary FFY 2022-2025 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement Program for public review and comment. Mayor Ray Poland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

4. Preparation of CY 2020 Network Monitoring Report

Lauren Wood said ACOG staff would soon be preparing the CY 2020 Network Monitoring Report. She said surveys had been sent out to the local government employees listed in the agenda, requesting that they be returned by March 3.

5. Transportation News and Update Report

John Sharp presented the following transportation news and updates:

Electric Vehicle Legislation

ACOG has been following many pieces of electric vehicle legislation, as it seems to be a hot topic this year, and will continue monitoring this spring.

CARES Relief Act

Through the CARES Relief Act signed early in January, additional STBG funding will be coming to ACOG, but the details are forthcoming. ACOG staff will gather more information next week when visiting with FHWA, ODOT, and local MPOs. This funding will likely be available through 2024, so there is time to plan.

Surface Transportation Block Group - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Projects ACOG staff has been coordinating with local government staff members to help them develop their STBG-UZA projects. This month ACOG staff ranked the STBG-UZA project scores and provided them to the ITTC for review and selection. The FFY 2022 and FFY 2023 STBG-UZA projects selected, totaling \$43 million in funding, will be locked in for the next two years.

Cost of Nonattainment (CNA) Study

ACOG staff is currently working with ODOT on a CNA agreement that can be used with the Greater Oklahoma City Chamber.

Coordination Regarding Non-Federal Match Funding

ACOG staff has been in coordination with other COGs, DOTs and FHWA regional offices around the US, discussing funding issues, especially regarding local match (aka non-federal match).

Call for Projects for the 2045 Plan

ACOG staff has been discussing the initial criteria for the Call for Projects for the 2045 Plan, asking that local governments review their projects that were listed in the previous plan so they can submit a modified list.

Stakeholder Advisory Committee

Goals for 2045 Plan will be discussed at the next Stakeholder Advisory Committee meeting in February and will be provided to this Committee as well.

Oklahoma Highway Safety Office Grant

ACOG is in discussions with Anglin PR on the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office (OHSO) Grant. Anglin will help develop a marketing campaign to promote bike/ped safety in the region.

Recertification of the MPO

The formal report from FHWA/FTA on the recertification of the MPO will likely not be received until February. However, ACOG has received a letter stating that our MPO has been recertified.

Alternative Fuel Corridors in Oklahoma

ACOG staff has been in discussions with ODOT for signage on certain major corridors throughout the state.

Central Oklahoma Clean Cities Program Redesignation

In February, ACOG will go through the redesignation process by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) for the Clean Cities Program. This year, ACOG will celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Central Oklahoma Clean Cities Coalition.

ACOG Working with UCO on City Related Projects

ACOG staff is currently working with the University of Central Oklahoma (UCO) and their city manager program. UCO has six interns for ACOG to work with and discuss different programs regarding city related projects.

Census Information

Every ten years, ACOG receives information regarding our estimated population and probably the most accurate information received is the PL-94 171. This 2020 Census data and map will be received by Oklahoma on February 9, and ACOG will provide the information to the local governments for review.

Chairman Gentling asked if there was any new business to present. No new business was presented.

INFORMATION:

Each year ACOG, in conjunction with its member entities, prepares the annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The UPWP is a description of the proposed multimodal transportation planning activities to be conducted in the Oklahoma City Area Regional Transportation Study (OCARTS) area for a given fiscal year.

The attached meeting schedule is for the preparation of the FY 2022 UPWP. INFORMATION:

Central Oklahoma's Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) - Encompass 2045 - will be a long-term vision for the region's transportation system based upon locally developed goals and strategies. The plan will identify major multimodal transportation investments that provide the best transportation solutions with anticipated future revenues to accomplish the region's goals.

The Federal Highway and Federal Transit Administrations, through the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), have identified ten (10) planning factors that all MTPs are required to address. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation has also established a set of seven (7) statewide transportation goals. The recommended Encompass 2045 Goals are the same as the Encompass 2040 Goals and are reflective of national, state, and past regional goals:

- 1. Connectivity
- 2. Economic Strength
- 3. Equity & Options
- 4. Healthy Communities
- 5. Performance
- 6. Safety & Security
- 7. System Preservation

The 2045 Goals were presented to the Encompass 2045 Stakeholder Advisory Group and members were able to provide additional feedback through an online survey. See results: http://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/02/SAG-Survey-1-Results.pdf.

Each goal will be articulated into a goal statement and will include several strategies to accomplish each goal. These strategies will be brought to the ITTC and ITPC for review and approval at future meetings.

INFORMATION:

Next month, ACOG will hold a call for all regionally significant transportation projects to be included in the next Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Encompass 2045. **Funds are not distributed as a result of this call for projects.** However, there are many important reasons to submit projects, including:

- For the federal transportation programs (including STBG-UZA) administered by ACOG, only projects that are included in, or are consistent with, Encompass 2045 are eligible to receive funding
- Regionally significant roadway projects, from any funding source, need to be modeled to determine their impact on future mobility
- The identification of regional transportation priorities will direct the investment of federal funds
- Being listed in the MTP will help communicate to the public information concerning projects planned in each community

As required by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, the financial strategy for Encompass 2045 must demonstrate a balance between the estimated costs and anticipated revenues for carrying out the long-range MTP. As a result, a set of project scoring criteria is used to evaluate and prioritize suggested projects.

In fall 2018, the ITTC developed new criteria to be used to fund projects submitted for the STBG-UZA program. This set of new criteria was developed with the guidance of cities, counties, and transportation agencies in the OCARTS area. While the STBG-UZA criteria contains elements of the previous Encompass 2040 criteria, the new STBG-UZA criteria differs from the previous Encompass 2040 criteria because it scores projects based on project type, and all projects can score a total of 100 points.

Using the STBG-UZA criteria as a starting point, as well as incorporating criteria used in the previous Encompass 2040 plan, ACOG staff has developed a combined and updated set of criteria to be reviewed and potentially used for the next Encompass 2045 Call for Projects. These criteria score all projects out of a total of 125 points, and are more equitable across all project types. The criteria reflect a blended version of the previous Encompass 2040 criteria and the current STBG-UZA criteria. Some criteria used in the Encompass 2040 plan were already reflected in the current STBG-UZA criteria, and as a result, have been removed.

The Encompass 2045 Call for Projects is anticipated to open March 1, 2021.

SAFETY PERFORMANCE MEASURES TRENDS AND TARGETS FOR CY 2021

INFORMATION:

Performance-based planning and programming has become a national emphasis per the most recent federal transportation legislation—namely, the 2012 Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act and the 2015 Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. Federal planning requirements direct metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) to coordinate with their respective state department of transportation and area public transportation providers in developing 14 performance measures and targets to track and maximize the benefits of transportation planning decisions and infrastructure investments.

Recently the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) submitted the five required safety targets to Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Now ACOG, as an MPO, needs to identify and submit regional safety targets for those same five performance measures by Thursday, February 25, 2021. Federal guidance states that MPOs may either support the targets of the state, or may submit their own targets based on regional data. In either instance, ACOG will need to report on the measures and the targets, and eventually explain how the region is making progress towards reaching those targets. This occurs through both the short-range plan (TIP) and the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). In particular, projects should be selected using criteria which help support the goals, measures, and targets established by the region in the MTP.

A presentation will be given at the February ITPC meeting to review possible options for regional safety targets and staff recommendations, as summarized in the <u>table</u> on the next page.
