Hannah Nolen highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She said ACOG is recommending the same seven goals that were utilized for the last long-range plan. There was no discussion.

Mayor Matt Dukes moved to approve the proposed Encompass 2045 Goals.

Councilmember Josh Moore seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Proposed Encompass 2045 Project Selection Criteria

Hayden Harrison highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. Click on this link to view the presentation.

Mayor Matt Dukes had a security concern about two deficient bridges at the Tinker Air Force Base points of access – at 29th Street. He was wanting to know if a letter is needed from the base to increase the criteria points due to crashes and security concerns to protect the base, from a federal standpoint. Ms. Harrison said a letter would not change the points. Mayor Dukes said they should look into that.

Councilmember Chris Powell asked for the Call for Projects deadline. Ms. Harrison said it opens March 1 with an email being sent to the ITTC members with the required documentation, and it closes March 31.

Councilmember Josh Moore moved to approve the proposed Encompass 2045 Project Selection Criteria. Vice-Mayor Mike Fullerton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Safety Performance Measures Trends and Targets for CY 2021

Councilmember Josh Moore moved to approve the selected safety target options and submit the same to ODOT. Mayor David Bennett seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

4. Transportation News and Update Report

John Sharp presented the following transportation news and updates:

Snow Routes Map

Who knew our snow routes map would get so much use? There were a number of inquiries last week concerning snow removal and ACOG staff answered them as best they could. The demand for snow removal was so great, remembering that most snow routes are section line roads and not internal streets. Mr. Sharp said if anyone had any problems with snow clearing on the designated routes, to please let ACOG know.

Census 2020

The census maps are out, but the data associated with it will not be available for some time. In April, the population counts used for apportionment will be delivered to the President. In September, the Census Bureau will send the redistricting data to the states. This means that developing new ward boundaries will have to wait until the fall.

Coordination Meeting

ACOG had a productive coordination meeting with ODOT, FHWA, and other MPOs to discuss current projects that they are working on to make sure they are all on the same page. Then, there was a more detailed meeting to discuss the Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) grant funding with ODOT Finance, trying to find ways to streamline billing and grants management.

FY 2022 UPWP Planning Process Begins

ACOG is starting the planning process for next year's Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) and will be holding a meeting tomorrow to discuss the status of the current year's tasks.

Encompass 2045 Plan Stakeholder Advisory Group Meeting

ACOG continues to move forward with the 2045 Plan update and yesterday held its second Stakeholder Advisory Group meeting. ODOT is allowing ACOG to utilize their MetroQuest software, which offers polling and surveys, so it will be used for the Encompass 2045 Plan public outreach efforts.

Quarterly State Transportation Innovation Committee (STIC) Meeting

ACOG staff attended the quarterly STIC meeting. ODOT, FHWA, and MPO staff attend these meetings to discuss current efforts to bring new ideas and technology to transportation planning.

Oklahoma Highway Safety Office Safety Grant

Mr. Sharp said the pedestrian and bike safety campaign is moving forward, as some initial materials have been received from the consultant. The goal is to launch the safety campaign this spring.

CARES Act Funding

Mr. Sharp said there will be a meeting with ODOT staff tomorrow to discuss some additional funding that came from the CARES Act – nearly \$9 million in federal STBG funding, which will be in addition to the \$22 million ACOG receives per year. ACOG will have discussions with the OCARTS local government staff regarding how to use this funding and how flexible it can be. It may include addressing some safety concerns in our communities.

EV Coalition Meeting

ACOG hosted an EV Coalition Meeting in early February. There was a great deal of discussion concerning this year's legislation.

Aerial photography and other Aerial Products

Sanborn was chosen as the contractor for the 2021 regional aerial photography project. The flights should be underway in early March before the trees start to bud out, so this is a time sensitive project.

Chairman Gentling asked if there was any new business to present. No new business was presented.

INFORMATION:

On March 1, 2021, ACOG opened a call for all regionally significant transportation projects to be included in the next Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Encompass 2045. **Funds are not distributed as a result of this call for projects**. However, there are many reasons to submit projects, including:

- For all federal transportation programs (including STBG-UZA) administered by ACOG, only projects that are included in, or are consistent with, Encompass 2045 are eligible to receive funding
- Regionally significant roadway projects, from any funding source, need to be modeled to determine their impact on future mobility
- The identification of regional transportation priorities will direct the investment of federal funds
- Being listed in the MTP will help communicate to the public information concerning projects planned in each community

If your entity wishes to submit a project(s) for inclusion in the Encompass 2045 Plan, the following information will need to be received by ACOG by **Wednesday**, **March 31**, **2021**:

- A MTP eTRACKER application form for each project, which identifies the proposed project type, location, and estimated cost. Note: ACOG will assign estimated costs based on project type after the Call for Projects closes. Entities should assign at least one dollar of funding in the appropriate cell and ACOG staff will update at a later date
- The appropriate Encompass 2045 Project Scoring Worksheet for each project
- A map of each proposed project showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and the names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to eTRACKER

INFORMATION:

ACOG staff will soon be preparing the CY 2020 Network Monitoring Report, as called for by the Unified Planning Work Program. The purpose of this report is to maintain current information on the implementation of multimodal transportation improvements in the OCARTS area in conformance with the goals of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), as well as to update the regional transportation model. The report will identify all projects completed in 2020 resulting in increased transportation choices, improved traffic flow, and/or increased street/highway network capacities in the region. This information will also be used for crash analyses to determine the relationship between network improvements and crash rates.

Your assistance is requested in identifying all transportation projects within your jurisdiction that were completed/implemented during calendar year 2020, regardless of the source of funding or party responsible for construction. A representative of each entity was emailed a survey (Excel file) and asked to provide information about roadway, transit, and bicycle/pedestrian improvements completed within their jurisdiction during the past year.

The attached list provides the contact person at each entity who received the survey. Entities that have submitted data as of Wednesday, March 3, are highlighted yellow. As noted in the survey, in the event there were no applicable projects completed in your entity during 2020, a response to that effect would be appreciated as well.

INFORMATION:

Functional classification is the process by which streets and highways are grouped into classes, or systems, according to the character of service they provide. Federal, state, and local governments use these groupings to assign jurisdictional responsibility, allocate funds, and establish design standards.

The current Federal Functional Classification System for the Oklahoma City Urban Area was approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) on August 5, 2014. On this system, streets are classified as interstate, freeway/expressway, principal arterial, minor arterial, collector, or local. Only streets classified as collector or above are eligible for federal-aid highway funds.

The City of Norman has requested the following amendment to the Federal Functional Classification System.



Dear Mr. Sharp:

The City of Norman is requesting an agenda item for consideration by the Intermodal Transportation Technical and Policy Committees asking for approval of a revision to the urban functionally classified roadway system. The specific segment of roadway under consideration, its length and the requested action are as follows:

▶ James Garner Avenue, from Acres Street to Main Street – 0.38 Miles Action Requested – Reclassification from Local Street to Minor Urban Arterial

This change is necessary in order to better align the City's Major Thoroughfare Plan, which was adopted by the City Council as part of Norman's Comprehensive Transportation Plan on May 13, 2014, with the OCARTS Regional Transportation Plan and ODOT's Urban Area Boundary and Functional Classification Map.

The Norman Comprehensive Transportation Plan designates James Garner Avenue, between Flood Avenue and Boyd Street, as a special planning corridor. The design objectives for the corridor fit most closely into the Minor Urban Arterial classification as the majority of the street will be designed as a two-lane median-divided cross-section. On the other hand, ODOT's Urban Area Boundary and Functional Classification Map depicts the section of James Garner Avenue between Acres Street and Main Street as a Local Street. This roadway is being planned as a major connector to downtown Norman and the University of Oklahoma Campus from the north. Traffic demand on the corridor is expected to reach 16,000 vehicles per day at full build out.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA, CHANGING THE FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION OF JAMES GARNER AVENUE BETWEEN ACRES STREET AND MAIN STREET FROM A LOCAL STREET TO A MINOR ARTERIAL IN NORMAN

- § 1. WHEREAS, James Garner Avenue is identified in the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) adopted by the Norman City Council on May 13, 2014 as the primary north-south route into and out of downtown Norman and providing connection to the north side of the University of Oklahoma Campus; and
- § 2. WHEREAS, the CTP identifies the James Garner Avenue corridor as a Special Context Sensitive Corridor signifying that it does not fit exactly into a specific roadway classification; and
- § 3. WHEREAS, the planned cross-section to be used in the James Garner Avenue corridor is a two-lane median divided section which most closely associates with the Minor Arterial classification with the City's CTP; and
- § 4. WHEREAS, the portion of James Garner Avenue from Main Street south to Duffy is already on the functionally classified system; and
- § 5. WHEREAS, the portion of James Garner Avenue from Acres Street north, across Robinson Street, to Flood Avenue is planned for future construction in FFY 2022; and
- § 6. WHEREAS, the remaining, unclassified portion of James Garner Avenue from Acres Street south to Main Street is approximately 0.38 miles in length; and
- § 7. WHEREAS, the CTP shows a projected 2035 average daily traffic volume of 16,000 vehicles per day on the unclassified portion of James Garner Avenue; and
- § 8. WHEREAS, the CTP shows a significant redistribution of traffic from both Flood Avenue and Porter Avenue once James Garner Avenue is completed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORMAN, OKLAHOMA:

§ 9. That the Oklahoma Department of Transportation is hereby requested to concur in the reclassification of James Garner Avenue between Acres Street and Main Street from Local Street to Minor Arterial and to submit same to the Federal Highway Administration for their approval.


