- **REAP:** COGs will receive \$15,475,000.00 from ODOC. ACOG will receive \$117,076 more for FY22 which is an increase of 15.31% from FY21.
- **SUB-STATE:** In conjunction with COEDD, we have contacted Representative Wallace concerning ODOC restoring a portion, if not all of the sub-state funding to COGs
