#### A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. There was a quorum.

#### B. APPROVAL OF THE APRIL 15, 2021 MINUTES

Harry Fenton moved to approve the April 15, 2021 minutes. Brandon Bundy seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### C. ACTION ITEMS:

 Preliminary FFY 2022-2025 Oklahoma City Area Regional Transportation Study (OCARTS) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Jennifer Sebesta said the Preliminary TIP was released on April 30 for public review and comment. Anyone wishing to submit a written comment may do so through May 31. She said the final document will be provided to the committee for consideration in June.

Harry Fenton moved to recommend that the ITPC approve the *preliminary* document for final consideration in June 2021. Stuart Chai seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Request for Amendments to the Federal Functional Classification System in the City of Midwest City

Lauren Wood highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. Harry Fenton asked if our region will still be well under the cap when including this reclassification list. Mr. Sharp said there is no longer a cap, so now, with these Federal Functional Classification System additions, there will be more miles of functionally classified streets with the same amount of federal funding.

Harry Fenton moved to recommend that the ITPC approve the Federal Functional Classification amendments requested by the City of Midwest City. Julie Shannon seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Request for Amendment to the FFY 2021 Transit Element of the FFY 2020-2023 OCARTS Area TIP by COTPA

Jennifer Sebesta said this is a standard amendment that COTPA presents in the spring, which allows them to program their FTA funds once they know how the funds will be used.

Brandon Bundy moved to recommend that the ITPC amend the FFY 2021 Transit Element for the FFY 2020-2023 OCARTS Area TIP with the attached programs of projects from COTPA and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Harry Fenton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

#### 1. Encompass 2045 Land Use Scenarios

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda and then gave a presentation which can be viewed at: <a href="http://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/05/Encompass-2045-Land-Use-Scenarios.pdf">http://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/05/Encompass-2045-Land-Use-Scenarios.pdf</a>.

Lakesha Dunbar asked how ACOG plans to compare its analysis to what other jurisdictions have done in their local plans. Ms. Nolen said they incorporate the future land uses identified in comprehensive plans when developing input data.

John Sharp said the reason the sewer boundary is important is that when a city looks at the cost of development inside their service area, rates are so much cheaper than when they have to extend the sewer or water line half a mile down the road to a new development. He said it is more likely that they would develop inside the boundary. He said this scenario data feeds into the travel demand model and generates future trips. The future trip data is then allocated to the road network to see if congestion is increased in the future.

Mr. Sharp said these land use scenarios are a suggested planning requirement of the federal government, so ACOG will continue to show different options available in the future for growth of the region.

#### 2. People For Bikes Community Grant Program

Jordan Evans highlighted the grant program information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. He said the grant supports bicycle infrastructure projects that make it easier and safer for people of all ages and abilities to ride. He said the online application opens June 14, 2021 and letters of interest are due July 23, 2021.

#### 3. Bike Month 2021

Jordan Evans said the entire month of May is Bike Month. He recounted that on Saturday, May 8, ACOG partnered with Riversports for the Central Oklahoma Bicycle Expo that drew over 400 people with nine organizations participating. Other Bike Month activities were listed in the agenda memorandum.

#### 4. Watch for Me OK Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Campaign

Jordan Evans highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum regarding the Watch For Me OK Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Campaign, which launches the week of May 17-23. He said its mission and other information can be viewed at this website link: <a href="https://www.watchformeok.org/">https://www.watchformeok.org/</a>.

Chairman Sharp said the hope is that this campaign will be ongoing. Funding is anticipated for next fiscal year so ACOG can continue to promote this campaign in the region. He suggested that the communities include the campaign as a flyer in their utility bills. He said it could be a seasonal campaign - one push in the spring and again in the fall.

 Federal Highway Administration Alternative Fuel Corridor Round 5 Designations – I-40, US-81, and US-62

Eric Pollard said for many years, Oklahoma has been the number one state, per capita, in compressed natural gas (CNG) stations available. Last year, Oklahoma was number two in the nation, per capita, in electric vehicle (EV) charging. Mr. Pollard said in FY 2016, FHWA started the process of receiving nominations and designating alternative fuel corridors across the country. Oklahoma was the first state to have all of its interstate corridors CNG-ready and is also close to having them EV-ready. He said in February 2021, ACOG staff partnered with ODOT, INCOG, SWODA, and NODA to submit a successful nomination of three new corridors, as itemized in the agenda memorandum, to make Oklahoma more competitive for existing and future federal funding for charging and fueling infrastructure. He said ODOT is working on signage to show fueling infrastructure options available to drivers.

#### 6. Ozone Alert Days

Eric Pollard highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum regarding ozone season, noting that there is an <u>electronic flyer available on the ACOG website</u> to share in newsletters, bill inserts, and social media to get the word out when there are alert days.

7. Oklahoma City Area Regional Transportation Study (OCARTS) Area Line Item Projects and Administrative Modifications

Lauren Wood said this is a monthly update to the line items and administration modifications from ODOT on active projects in the OCARTS area. She said for FFY 2021, this month there were no line items and one administrative modification added by ODOT.

8. Status of Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), and Transportation Enhancement (TE) Projects in the OCARTS Transportation Management Area (TMA)

Chairman Sharp said these are the STBG-UZA, TAP, and TE projects in the OCARTS TMA. He said if they have any issues or questions about their projects, to please discuss them with Melissa Davis of ODOT after this meeting, and she can take back their concerns to ODOT to find answers for them.

#### E. NEW BUSINESS

#### June ITTC Meeting to be Held in ACOG Board Room

Mr. Sharp said that since Oklahoma County will need the Ballroom in June, the June ITTC meeting will be held in the ACOG Board Room, where the seating will be modified to make it more comfortable for everyone.

#### Introduction of UCO Summer Intern

Mr. Sharp said ACOG is fortunate to have an intern this summer from the University of Central Oklahoma. Ms. Kennedy Rozneck will be working to help ACOG on bike-ped projects and the Watch For Me campaign.

#### **INFORMATION:**

Federal surface transportation law requires that Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) develop a Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) that is financially realistic by demonstrating that the cost of improvements included in the plan (both capital and maintenance) can be paid for from revenues reasonably anticipated to be available over the planning period.

Estimated unit costs for the Encompass 2045 transportation network are based on recent construction information provided by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and local entities.

The attached table provides a summary of the unit costs proposed for estimating roadway construction, maintenance, and right of way acquisition for Encompass 2045:

- Unit costs for construction include costs for engineering, grading, drainage, surface and base improvements, utility relocation, sodding, signing, and structure costs (such as bridges, interchanges, curbs, and gutters).
- Unit costs for maintenance on interstates, turnpikes and freeways involves resurfacing with concrete, and unit costs for maintenance on arterials and collectors includes base repair and resurfacing with a two-three inch asphalt overlay.
- Unit costs of each road segment vary based upon functional classification and location, urban or rural.

The four functional classifications considered as part of the OCARTS network include: 1) interstates/turnpikes/freeways, 2) principal arterials, 3) minor arterials, and 4) urban collectors. Since the costs for construction and maintenance of interstate and freeway facilities are generally greater than the other classifications, those unit costs will be applied separately.

Typically, it is more expensive to build and expand roadways in the urban area than in rural areas due to increased development, utilities, and encroachments. As a result, unit costs have been derived for both urban and rural facilities. The urban/rural designation is based on the Oklahoma City Urban Area Boundary map, as approved by the MPO and the Federal Highway Administration in spring 2013.

The proposed unit costs reflect Encompass 2045 base year dollars (2015). To determine the final plan cost, the data will be factored to account for short-term (2015-2025), medium-term (2026-2035), and long-term (2036-2045) inflation, depending on which period the network

improvement and maintenance activity falls. Maintenance is assumed to occur every ten years.



ACOG staff completed a preliminary review of projects submitted by OCARTS member entities for inclusion in the Encompass 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). In total, 231 projects were submitted during the initial call for projects. Staff also met with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to identify its long-range projects for the state highway system in the OCARTS area. Submitted projects have been reviewed and will be classified into three categories based on their eligibility for inclusion in the Encompass 2045:


- Eligible Projects\* Projects that meet all project selection criteria.
- Ineligible Projects Projects deemed ineligible based on one or both of the following criteria: 1) the facility was not functionally classified and/or 2) the level of service (LOS) of the facility was less than LOS D. At this time, no projects have been deemed ineligible.
- Other Projects Projects submitted for maintenance, special studies, intersection modification, or signalization upgrades are not needed for modeling. Maintenance will be factored into overall plan cost.

\*Please note that additional stand-alone bicycle, pedestrian, and transit projects could be brought to the ITTC at a later date.

The suballocation of funds to the OCARTS Transportation Management Area used in the attached tables reflects an FFY 2021 obligation authority of \$63,615,829.48. See the table below for more details.

Table 1 lists all transactions affecting the region's STBG-UZA, TAP, and CMAQ funds during the first half of FFY 2021, as provided by the ODOT Finance Division. The column entitled "Change in Federal Funds" reflects cost overruns and underruns associated with STBG-UZA projects previously awarded, as well as the estimated federal share for FFY 2021 projects authorized by the Federal Highway Administration prior to bid letting.

<u>Table 2</u> takes the estimated balance of FFY 2021 unobligated funds from Table 1 (\$58,396,640.08) and reflects the estimated change in funds that will occur if all unauthorized projects included in the FFY 2021 element of the TIP are authorized by September 30.

<u>Table 3</u> combines the information provided in Tables 1 and 2 by reflecting obligated funds and funds anticipated for obligation, by each local government, through the end of the federal fiscal year.
