A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:15 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. A quorum was not present. However, Article IV (3) of the Intermodal Transportation Technical Committee Bylaws states that "business conducted in the absence of a quorum shall be forwarded to the ITPC in the same manner as business conducted with a quorum, except the number of cities and counties represented shall be noted (in the minutes and in the transmittal to the ITPC) along with the statement that a quorum was not present."

B. APPROVAL OF THE JUNE 10, 2021 MINUTES

David Riesland moved to approve the June 10, 2021 minutes. Brandon Bundy seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ACTION ITEMS:

 Request for Amendment to the FFY 2022 Transit Element of the FFY 2020-2023 OCARTS Area TIP by the City of Norman

Jennifer Sebesta said the City of Norman was requesting an amendment to the FFY 2022 Transit Element of the TIP to revise the program of projects for the Norman transit system, as detailed in the agenda memorandum and attachments.

David Riesland moved to recommend that the ITPC amend the FFY 2020-2023 OCARTS Area TIP by replacing the City of Norman FFY 2022 Transit Element with the attached program of projects and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Max Harris seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. STBG-UZA Call for Projects Opens September 1, 2021

Jennifer Sebesta said that the STBG-UZA Call for Projects opens September 1, 2021, and the deadline for submission of projects is October 22, 2021. Ms. Sebesta said there have been no criteria updates since last year. She then highlighted the information for the project submission process as detailed in the agenda memorandum.

Ms. Sebesta said there would not be a workshop this year, but members are encouraged to contact ACOG staff if they have questions or would like to schedule a meeting to discuss their proposed projects. She said an email will be sent out on September 1 providing links to the submission documents.

2. Air Quality Small Grant Program

Hannah Nolen provided information about how to apply for Air Quality Small Grant Program funding. Her presentation can be viewed at this link: http://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/08/FINAL-AQ-Small-Grant-Program-Promotion.pdf.

Ms. Nolen said if anyone has questions about eligibility, to please contact her at hnolen@acogok.org or (405) 234-2264. John Sharp added that the funding was increased from \$200,000 to \$400,000 to attract more projects.

3. Bicycle Infrastructure Standards - The City of Oklahoma City

Jordan Evans introduced Max Harris, an Associate Planner, and James Welch, an Engineer, from the City of Oklahoma City. Mr. Harris and Mr. Welch presented on Oklahoma City's bicycle infrastructure standards. The presentation can be viewed at this link: http://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/08/OKC-Bicycle-Infrastructure-Standards-Presentation.pdf

Commissioner Rod Cleveland asked if there are plans for a trail to get from I-35 to Draper Trail. Mr. Harris said at bikewalkokc.org, in the master plan, it shows the full network with all the connections that are planned for Lake Draper to the adjacent neighborhoods and to the larger trail system as well. He said SE 104th St. is planned as a trail but is not currently funded. Right now it is marked by sharrows. He said there is a project at SE 59th St. where it connects to Air Depot Blvd. with a bike facility, and the western connection is over to Eastern Ave. and up to the S. Grand Trail. The funding for this project has not been secured and construction costs are up to \$1.5 million to build the trail.

Further discussion followed.

4. Bicycle Commuting 101 Webinar Series

Jordan Evans announced that ACOG will host a free virtual webinar series about bicycle commuting as detailed in the agenda memorandum. The webinars will be held every Tuesday in September and will start at 7 p.m.

5. Proposed ACOG Complete Streets Policy

Jordan Evans explained the transportation planning process that ACOG went through in preparing the ACOG Complete Streets Policy. The presentation can be viewed at: http://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/08/Complete-Streets-Policy-Presentation-Updated-1.pdf

Mr. Evans said ACOG will continue to reevaluate this policy every five years, in coordination with the long-range plan update, and there will be performance measures to be presented to this committee every year.

Brandon Bundy referred to page 2 of the Complete Streets Policy, under Applicability, the paragraph that says "If the planned facility currently has fixed-route transit or is proposed to have fixed-route transit in the MTP or an approved Locally Preferred Alternative (route), then the project sponsor **shall** request comments from the local transit agency..." Mr. Bundy asked that it be changed from "shall" to "should" whereby you do not have to do it, but it is highly recommended for coordination purposes. Chairman Sharp said this item is for information only today, but the Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee approved this Complete Streets Policy yesterday and it will go to the ITPC for approval on August 26. He said if they wish to have changes, to please contact their delegate before the ITPC meeting.

6. National Drive Electric Week Central Oklahoma

Angela Hankins highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. The event will take place on Saturday, September 4. There will be 25-35 electric vehicles displayed and various dealerships will be present to answer questions.

7. Oklahoma City Area Regional Transportation Study (OCARTS) Area Line Item Projects and Administrative Modifications

Lauren Wood said this is a monthly update to the line items and administration modifications from ODOT on active projects in the OCARTS area. This month there were four new line items and one new administrative modification added by ODOT for FFY 2021.

8. Status of Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), and Transportation Enhancement (TE) Projects in the OCARTS Transportation Management Area (TMA)

Chairman Sharp said these are the STBG-UZA, TAP, and TE projects in the OCARTS TMA. He said if members have any issues or questions about their projects, to please discuss them with ACOG or ODOT.

E. NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Sharp said he saw news about the Kickapoo Turnpike, State Highway 152, and the John Kilpatrick Turnpike all being renamed I-240. This might be confusing to drivers because some of these segments are free and some are toll roads.

Mr. Sharp asked if there was any additional new business to present to the committee. No additional new business was presented.

INFORMATION:

The City of Norman has requested an amendment to the FFY 2023 element of the FFY 2022-2025 OCARTS Area Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to replace the Jenkins Avenue Widening Project (TIP ID: 11234) with the Gray Street Two-Way Conversion Project (TIP ID: 11235).

The request is to substitute the previously approved project for the next highest scoring, eligible project, the two-way conversion of Gray Street from Porter Avenue to University in the City of Norman. The associated \$1,765,853 in Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) allocated funds from the Jenkins Avenue Widening Project would transfer to the Gray Street Two-Way Conversion Project. The federal funding amount would remain unchanged, and the City of Norman would be responsible for any funding overmatch. The City of Norman has requested this amendment based on the issues listed in the attached letter. This amendment is consistent with the procedures governing the STBG-UZA program.



RE: TIP AMENDMENT FOR GRAY STREET TWO-WAY CONVERSION

Dear Mr. Sharp:

At its June Meeting, the ITPC approved the FFY 2022-2025 OCARTS Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). That document features locked years for FFY 2022 and FFY 2023. The last STBG-UZA project in FFY 2023 was a City of Norman project on Jenkins Avenue from W. Lindsey Street to Imhoff Road. Prior to the submittal for the 2020 Call for Projects, Norman Staff made the conscious decision to combine the Jenkins Avenue project with another project on Constitution Street between Jenkins Avenue and Classen Boulevard. This proved to be an unfortunate decision as we have had difficulty allocating the funds, both internal and external to cover one very large project. In retrospect, the Jenkins Avenue and Constitution Street projects should probably never have been combined.

The next project ranked just below the Jenkins Avenue project in the final FFY 2023 rankings was another City of Norman project on Gray Street to convert from one-way operation to two-way operation between Porter Avenue and University Boulevard. This project scored 0.45 points behind the Jenkins Avenue project and is estimated to cost significantly less. Location maps for these two projects are attached. The Jenkins Avenue project is depicted in red, and the Gray Street project is shown in blue.

In terms of Safety Performance Measures, the number of fatalities and serious injury collisions will improve because the two-way conversion will act as a traffic calming measure for Gray Street making downtown Norman more visitor and pedestrian friendly. In terms of Non-Safety Performance Measures, the pavement condition on Gray Street will improve as resurfacing is a key element of the project.

In the FFY 2023 locked year of the FFY 2022-2025 OCARTS TIP, the Jenkins Avenue project outlined above was to receive \$1,765,853 in federal funding. The City of Norman requests that this \$1,765,853 be, instead, allocated to the next highest scoring project which would be Norman's project on Gray Street. To accomplish this, the City of Norman submits this request for a TIP amendment to add Gray St: from Porter Ave to University Blvd Two-Way Conversion and to remove Jenkins Ave: from W Lindsey St to Imhoff Rd from the FFY 2023 STBG-UZA Projects. The estimated funding needed for the Gray Street project is \$2,474,440 meaning that an overmatch will still be required. As part of this request, the City of Norman also requests that this TIP Amendment be placed on the ITTC and ITPC Agendas for the August meetings.



INFORMATION:

Under Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21), the National Highway System (NHS) was expanded to include all principal arterials. This Enhanced NHS system added roughly 60,000 miles to the NHS nationwide and 1,120 miles within Oklahoma. As part of the NHS, these facilities are subject to NHS federal requirements, including: design standards, federal project administration oversight, outdoor advertisement and junkyard control, and national performance measure data collection. Due to the burden this action placed on state departments of transportation (DOTs), FHWA issued a memorandum on February 19, 2014 (reissued February 23, 2016) requesting that FHWA division offices work with state DOTs to review the facilities added to the NHS after MAP-21 and identify any modifications that should be made to the Enhanced NHS.

Acting in accordance with the FHWA memorandum, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposed modifications to the NHS within the OCARTS Area in 2017. The requests removed many of the facilities added to the NHS under MAP-21, as well as proposed facilities to be added to the system. The requests, which were approved by the ITPC in March and November 2017, were forwarded to ODOT and FHWA for final approval. Additional modifications to the NHS, to remove portions of SH-3A (Northwest Expressway) and to add the John Kilpatrick Turnpike Extension and Kickapoo Turnpike at the request of ODOT, were approved by the ITPC in August 2018 and April 2020, respectively.

At this time, ODOT is requesting additional modifications to the NHS (see attached letter and map). The request is to keep SH-152 (Airport Rd.), from S. Meridian Ave. to I-44, as part of the NHS but remove the Intermodal Connector designation. With the completion of the John Kilpatrick Turnpike Extension, this segment of SH-152 no longer acts primarily as a connection between a major intermodal facility (Will Rogers World Airport) and other NHS facilities in the region, and therefore, should be upgraded to a non-connector NHS route.

Upon approval by the ITPC, the request will be forwarded to ODOT and then to FHWA for final approval.

Consider recommending that the ITPC approve the modifications to the National Highway System, as requested by ODOT.



In 2009, ACOG developed a Public Fleet Conversion Grants program in response to tightening air quality standards and the prospect of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) nonattainment designation in Central Oklahoma. Alternative fuels and vehicles, as well as advanced vehicle technologies, continue to be viable fleet strategies to mitigate vehicle emissions and the volume of fuel consumed.

To date, ACOG's Public Fleet Conversion Grants program has awarded over \$4 million in Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds to help OCARTS member entities and OCARTS area public entities purchase clean-fuel and clean-emission fleet vehicles, and alternative fueling infrastructure.

ACOG staff plans to release its next Call for Projects under the ACOG CLEAN AIR Grants for OCARTS Area Public Fleets, offering \$550,000 in CMAQ funding.

NREL and DOE analyze the data and translate them into fuel conservation and emission reduction impacts for ACOG and COKCC.

In 2020, the coalition reported the following:

- 124,224 pounds of NOx reduced; 5.365 pounds of VOC's reduced
- 10.7 million gallons of gasoline equivalent reduced
- 18,384 tons of greenhouse gases reduced
