#### A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:09 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. A quorum was not present. However, Article IV (3) of the ACOG MPO Technical Committee Bylaws states that "business conducted in the absence of a quorum shall be forwarded to the ACOG MPO Policy Committee in the same manner as business conducted with a quorum, except the number of cities and counties represented shall be noted (in the minutes and in the transmittal to the ACOG MPO PC) along with the statement that a quorum was not present."

#### B. APPROVAL OF THE NOVEMBER 10, 2021 MINUTES

Brandon Bundy moved to approve the November 10, 2021 minutes. David Riesland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### C. ACTION ITEMS:

1. Selection of FY 2022 ACOG Public Fleet Clean Air Grants Projects

Eric Pollard listed the four applications that were selected and recommended for award. He said they are projected to reduce criteria pollutants by 224 lbs. annually. There being no discussion, David Riesland moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO PC approve the four projects listed for funding (\$527,489), utilizing CMAQ funds allocated to ACOG's Public Fleet Conversion Grant (CLEAN AIR Grants) Program. Erik Brandt seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Sharp then entertained a motion to move the remainder of the funding (\$22,511) to the Air Quality Small Grant Program. Erik Brandt moved to have the remaining funding go into the AQ Small Grant Program. David Riesland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### 2. Air Quality Small Grant Program Project Selection

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information in the agenda memorandum, noting that with the available funding, four projects could be fully funded and one partially funded thanks to the additional \$22,511 from the Public Fleet Clean Air Grant that was just recommended for approval. She said also included are two backup projects if additional funding becomes available.

Brandon Bundy moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve funding for the FY 2022 Air Quality Small Grant Program project list (\$364,241) and allocate any remaining funds to the next highest scoring project(s) - \$58,270, for a total of \$422,511 in funding. David Riesland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

#### 1. Proposed I-240 Loop

Jennifer Sebesta said Matt Swift of ODOT would be presenting this item. Mr. Swift said this is a signage request to designate an urban interstate loop (I-240) in the Oklahoma City metropolitan area. He referred to a map in the agenda, showing how I-240 would loop around the metro and showed that a portion of SH-152 would be

redesignated as I-240. Chairman Sharp said ACOG and ODOT have talked with the Federal Highway Administration about this designation, and they are in agreement. Mr. Swift said as soon as ODOT receives FHWA's written approval, they will begin the process of installing signage. He said the State Highway map will show this loop as I-240 and said that any route which shows dual designation, there will be one predominant route. For example, on the northeast side where you have both I-44 and I-240, the main route will be I-44 and I-240 will be added as a follow (secondary) route.

2. Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Funds

John Sharp said the CRRSAA funding apportionment for the ACOG MPO is \$8,980,567, to be spent on projects that are eligible for STBG program funding. He said this 100 percent federal share funding is available for obligation until September 30, 2024 and must be spent by 2029. ACOG staff has recommended that a workgroup be created to discuss how this funding can be distributed in an equitable way to the membership. The first meeting would be held on January 21. Mr. Sharp said that if there is a group of "like" projects, they could possibly be bundled together, which would help with mobilization costs for the projects.

3. Preparation of CY 2021 Network Monitoring Report

Lauren Wood highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum, requesting assistance from the committee in identifying all transportation projects within their jurisdiction that were completed/implemented during calendar year 2021. Mr. Sharp said a list of contacts who would be receiving the survey was attached to the memorandum, and if the contact name was incorrect, to please let ACOG staff know.

4. 2022 Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program

Jordan Evans said the maximum Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program grant amount is \$300,000 with a 20 percent match. He said funds can be used for a number of items, including new trails, maintenance rehabilitation, trailheads and trail amenities, and more. Mr. Evans said the application deadline has been extended this year to Monday, February 28. He said if they need help with the application, to reach out to Susan Henry, the Grant Administrator, whose contact information is available in the agenda, or contact him at <a href="mailto:ievans@acogok.org">ievans@acogok.org</a>.

5. ACOG Transportation Management Area Line Item Projects and Administrative Modifications

Lauren Wood said this month, there are two new line item projects and three new administration modifications added by ODOT. She said if they have any questions, to please contact ACOG staff.

6. Status of Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), and Transportation Enhancement (TE) Projects in the ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area (TMA)

John Sharp said to please review the projects and if they have questions, to contact ODOT Local Government. He said that in March, hopefully there will be a quarterly meeting whereby ODOT Local Government staff will be available to answer questions the committee members might have about their projects.

#### 7. FY 2021 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Reports

John Sharp said several FY 2021 UPWP reports were available for review online. He said in the agenda memorandum, there are links provided in the list of reports.

#### **E. NEW BUSINESS**

#### New ACOG Employee

Chairman Sharp said ACOG has a new employee, Scott McThompson. He has a Bachelor's and Master's degree from OU, where he majored in Geography and GIS and will be helping with land use and socio-economic data. He is also a 20-year veteran from the US Navy and an expert in avionics.

#### New Snow Routes Map

Mr. Sharp said ACOG has a new snow routes map which is available as a handout at the table, and it is also available online.

#### Upcoming Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant Cycle

Jordan Evans said the committee members should have received an email recently, requesting that they take a short survey to learn more about their priorities for TAP funding. He said ACOG is starting to look at updating its TAP criteria for the upcoming grant cycle, to also include information about the new bill, and said if they did not receive the survey by email, to please contact him.

#### New Bill Information

Chairman Sharp asked Matt VanAuken if he had any additional information on how this new bill is moving forward. Mr. VanAuken said ODOT is still reading the new bill, trying to figure out where the funding is and how to move forward. He said this will not affect ACOG, but the population breakdown for TAP is a little different than it was previously. Mr. Sharp added that TAP funding has two pots of money, rather than the three they had last time. He said for TAP, CMAQ, and STBG, there is the potential for more funding, which is helpful.

Name Change Updates to Bylaws and Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Davis Riesland asked if the Bylaws will need to be updated with the new ACOG MPO name. Mr. Sharp said yes, not only the Bylaws, but also the MOU will need to have administrative changes made, and that information will be brought forth to this committee soon.

#### Update to STBG Project Scoring Information

Brandon Bundy asked if there is an update to the STBG project scoring. Mr. Sharp said the projects will be brought to the Committee with the scoring during its regularly scheduled meeting on February 10, and Ms. Sebesta said a scoring sheet will be sent out before the meeting.

#### F. ADJOURN

There being no further business, Chairman Sharp adjourned the meeting at 10:40 a.m.

#### **INFORMATION:**

The City of Norman has submitted a revised program of projects for the Norman transit system to amend the FFY 2022 Transit Element of the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

The City of Norman is requesting the amendment (see letter on next page) in order to include a portion of their available American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. The funds will be used for the construction of a vehicle wash facility for the city's transit vehicles. Since the funds will be utilized for a capital project, they are required to be included in the TIP/Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

This amendment will ensure consistency among the TIP, STIP, and the grant awards. Upon approval, the <u>attached program of projects</u> will supersede and replace the FFY 2022 City of Norman Transit Element of the FFY 2022-2025 TIP.

The City of Norman is requesting an amendment to the Transit Element of the FFY 2022 TIP. Please place this request on the agendas for the next meetings of the ACOG Intermodal Transportation Technical Committee (ITTC) and ACOG Intermodal Policy Committee (ITPC). The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) has released the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) apportionment tables, and the City's FFY2022 TIP Amendment No. 2 includes a portion of the available ARPA funds. According to ARPA guidance, these funds are required to be in the TIP/STIP only if they are utilized for capital projects that involve substantial changes to the function, location, or capacity of the asset(s) involved. These ARPA funds will be used to enhance the City's transit program through the construction of a vehicle wash facility. Please see the attached table showing the City's update to the Transit Element of the FFY 2022 TIP if the amendment is approved.

If this amendment is approved by the ACOG ITTC and ITPC, we ask that it be forwarded to ODOT for inclusion in the STIP.

#### **INFORMATION:**

Performance-based planning and programming continues to be a national emphasis per federal transportation legislation. Federal planning requirements direct metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) to coordinate with their respective state department of transportation and area public transportation providers in developing 14 performance measures and targets to track and maximize the benefits of transportation planning decisions and infrastructure investments.

Recently, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) submitted the five required safety targets to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Now, ACOG as an MPO, needs to identify and submit regional safety targets for those same five performance measures by February 25, 2022. Federal guidance states that MPOs may either support the targets of the state, or may submit their own targets based on the data from our region. In either instance, ACOG will need to report on the measures and the targets, and eventually explain how the region is making progress towards reaching those targets. This occurs through both ACOG's short-range plan (TIP) and Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). In particular, projects should be selected using criteria which help support the goals, measures, and targets established by the region in the MTP.

A presentation will be given at the February meeting to review possible options for the regional safety targets, as summarized in the attachment, and provide staff recommendations.

On November 15, 2021, the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law. This bill increases the amount of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding for states and Metropolitan Planning Organizations by nearly 70 percent over a 5-year period. In anticipation of receiving these funds, ACOG has begun reevaluating the TAP criteria from the 2017 Call for Projects.

Staff sent a survey on January 5, 2022 to BPAC and ACOG MPO Technical Committee (formerly ITTC) members to gather feedback and suggestions on the current scoring criteria.
