2. Air Quality Small Grant Program Call for Projects

Hannah Nolen said ACOG is continuing its Air Quality Small Grant Program with a FY 2022 Call for Projects this fall. This grant program seeks to improve air quality in Central Oklahoma by funding small infrastructure projects and congestion relief efforts. 5. Status of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) and Transportation Enhancement (TE) Projects in the ACOG Transportation Management Area (TMA)

Jordan Evans highlighted the information provided in the agenda memorandum. Mr. Evans provided the committee with tables that included TAP and TE projects brought forward to FFY 2020 and 2021 of the FFY 2020-2023 TIP. Mr. Evans advised the committee to review the tables and to let ACOG know of any changes.

John Sharp asked Shelby Templin if there was any truth to the rumor that ODOT was thinking about holding a TAP call for projects and would be releasing information soon. Ms. Templin said she heard the same rumor, but TAP is a completely different division than the one she is in, and she could not confirm when that call would occur.

D. NEW BUSINESS

Hannah Nolen reminded the committee that the Encompass 2045 Plan Summary is available on ACOG's website, and the public comment period is open through November 12, 2021. There is also a public survey open until November 15. Ms. Nolen encouraged the committee to share the survey.

Jordan Evans said there are Watch For Me stickers on the table in the back of the room and everyone is welcome to take one.

Shelby Templin said the U.S. Route 66 project is in a holding pattern because ODOT could not get all parties to agree on the route. ODOT is looking at spring 2022 for a decision and they are trying hard not to do a reroute, but there is a possibility they will have to. Ms. Templin said there is a lot of politics involved.

INFORMATION:

On November 15, 2021, the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law. This bill increases the amount of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding for states and Metropolitan Planning Organizations by nearly 70 percent over a 5-year period. In anticipation of receiving these funds, ACOG has begun reevaluating the TAP criteria from the 2017 Call for Projects.

Staff sent a survey on January 5, 2022 to BPAC and ACOG MPO Technical Committee (formerly ITTC) members to gather feedback and suggestions on the current scoring criteria. Jordan Evans will give a presentation on the survey results and ACOG staff's recommendations for the upcoming Call for Projects. The presentation can be viewed here:

INFORMATION:

The FY 2022 funding cycle of ACOG's Air Quality Small Grant Program closed Friday, November 19, 2021. The program sets out to fund air quality-related small transportation infrastructure projects and congestion relief efforts using Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds. ACOG received ten applications requesting a total of \$921,874.

Applications were reviewed and scored by a committee consisting of ACOG staff and representatives from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ), and the Oklahoma City Community Foundation (OCCF).

Projects selected for funding can be found in the table on the following page. The top four scoring projects are funded in full, at a total of \$364,241. The remaining funds were awarded to the next highest scoring project, Adair Blvd. Active Transportation Improvements in Midwest City, for partial funding. The ACOG MPO Policy Committee approved additional \$22,511 in CMAQ funding from the Public Fleet Grant Program which was awarded to this project as well, bringing the project award amount to \$58,270 and the total program award amount to \$422,511.

HB 3668 - Rep. Mauree Turner - Oklahoma Pedestrian Safety Act

HB 3852 - Rep. Judd Storm - Removes wattage restriction from E-bikes and scooters

This bill would remove the maximum power output of 750 watts for E-bikes and 1,000 watts for scooters.
