Jennifer Sebesta highlighted the information provided in the agenda memorandum on the amendments to the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program.

Mayor Ray Poland had a question on the dredging of the Oklahoma River. Jason Ferbrache said dredging varies and depends what area gets the most sediment. Mr. Poland asked that COPTA keep in mind that whatever is done on the Oklahoma River affects all the cities downstream.

Chairman Steven Gentling opened the public hearing. There being no response from the public, the public hearing was closed.

Mayor Matt Dukes moved to approve the motion to amend the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program by updating the COTPA FFY 2022 Transit Element with the attached program of projects, replacing the FFY 2024 and FFY 2025 local government Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) projects with the updated project lists, and submitting the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Councilmember Stephen Holman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Proposed Final FY 2023 ACOG MPO Unified Planning Work Program

3. Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act Funding

John Sharp said with the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), the ACOG MPO has received approximately \$8.9 million for transportation projects in the region. CRRSAA funds can be used for projects that are eligible for Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) program funding. This funding is 100 percent federal, so no local match is required. Mr. Sharp said application process opens on September 1, 2022.

ACOG attended the June Oklahoma Road Users Charge meeting chaired by Secretary Gatz. The main discussion item was reviewing pilot programs in other states.

ODOT Freight Advisory Committee

ODOT is updating their freight plan, which is anticipated to be completed by the end of the year. ACOG staff is participating with ODOT in the input and discussion process.

STBG Criteria

ACOG staff is reviewing the process and making modifications and will bring updates to the August meetings.

Quarterly STBG/TAP Projects Status Meeting

ACOG hosted a meeting to coordinate on the status of local transportation projects.

Amenities Guide

ACOG hosted the third meeting in June. This meeting is helping make parks, trails, and sidewalks more user friendly and safe for all users by determining safe and healthy features.

KFOR News Interview

The ACOG staff was interviewed about the recent pedestrian death in Warr Acres. A man was struck walking his dog. He had reflective clothing on while walking in his neighborhood that has no sidewalks. Jordan Evans was interviewed and asked about the Watch For Me campaign and he provided stats that pedestrian deaths have gone up by nearly 20% from 2020-2021.

Transportation Alternative Program funding

ACOG staff is assisting ODOT on their upcoming statewide funding.

The following information was received today from ODOT:

- The State of Oklahoma will receive \$44 million for two years.
- The adjusted Oklahoma City Urbanized Area (UZA), which is administered by ACOG, will receive \$7.5 million for three years with an additional \$9 million for the following three years.
- If your community's population is under 15,000, you can apply for funding through both ACOG and ODOT.
- Projects outside of the adjusted UZA is eligible for ODOT funding only.
- For ODOT's program, the project size can be from \$700,000 to \$1.5 million depending on the size of your community.
- Communities under 5,000 population - ODOT will pay for 100% of the design and 90% of the project.
- ODOT's program starts tomorrow, but the final applications are not due until November.

INFORMATION:

With the passage of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), the ACOG MPO has received approximately \$8.9 million for transportation projects in the region. CRRSAA funds can be used for projects that are eligible for Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) program funding. This funding is 100 percent federal, so no local match is required.

These funds remain available for obligation until September 30, 2024, meaning projects must be selected, designed, and have environmental reviews (NEPA) completed by this time. Obligated balances have to be spent by September 30, 2029. The following requirements must be met for projects to receive CRRSAA funding:

1. All projects must be located on a functionally classified road. Funds cannot be spent on local roads or roads that are part of the state highway system (interstates, turnpikes, U.S. highways, and state highways).
2. In order to meet the obligation deadline, only the following project types are eligible for ACOG CRRSAA funding:
 - a. Safety Projects: Signage, pavement markings (including school zones and crosswalks), pedestrian signals, guardrails, and others that do not require extensive NEPA
 - b. Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects: signage, pavement markings, and others that do not require extensive NEPA
 - c. Minor Resurfacing Projects that do not require extensive NEPA
 - d. Adding CRRSAA funds to a previous selected STBG-UZA or TAP project (the project must have NEPA completed by September 30, 2024)
3. Municipalities can submit project application(s) requesting up to \$500,000. However, project applications may be submitted requesting less funding.

Required Items

- A preliminary cost estimate for each CRRSAA project, prepared, signed, and stamped by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma, and shall include information on materials, quantities, unit prices, etc. Cost estimates must be current within 6 months of the date of the application submission.
- A Council Resolution is required if the CRRSAA funds are used in conjunction with an existing STBG project.
- A map of the project and adjacent area

It is the desire of ACOG MPO Policy Committee members that each eligible municipality within the ACOG MPO area has an opportunity to receive CRRSAA funding. Submitted project applications will be chosen based on quality, need, and ability for the project to be completed within the federally allotted timeframe. It is possible that ACOG will receive more than \$8.9 million in requests. In this instance, priority will be given to smaller communities and those that have not received STBG-UZA funding in the last three years.

INFORMATION:

To ensure that the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) continues to reflect local government priorities that meet federal requirements for authorization, ACOG is inviting each community within the ACOG MPO boundary to submit projects for FFY 2025 funding.

If your entity wishes to submit a project or projects for funding consideration, the following information needs to be submitted to ACOG no later than **4 p.m., Monday, October 31, 2022**.

- **A ProjectTracker (formerly eTRACKER) application form** for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s). Applications submitted during the last Call for Projects (and therefore have an application already created) will be open for editing.
- **A STBG-UZA Programming Resolution** (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).
- **An itemized cost estimate** (construction costs only) for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming CFP submission deadline. Costs associated with engineering, right-of-way acquisition, and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.
- **A map of each proposed project** showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and the names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- **The appropriate Project Rating Worksheet(s)** for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component.
- **ODOT Project Scoping Form** for each project. This form is now a project submission requirement.
- **Any supporting documentation** listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

In order to be eligible for STBG-UZA funding, all prospective applicants must fill out a pre-application form for each project. **The pre-application form was made available on August 10, 2022 and will remain available until September 16, 2022.** This will allow ACOG staff time to review projects and discuss potential revisions with the applicant before beginning the full application process. The pre-application form can be filled out here: <https://arcg.is/04nHH0>.

As a reminder, each STBG-UZA project selected for a locked year must be programmed through ACOG and ODOT, and all proposed federal-aid projects (except bridges) must be located on the approved Federal Functional Classification System for the Oklahoma City Urban Area. Construction projects on the State Highway System (interstates, U.S. highways, and state highways) are not eligible for funding.

Selected projects will be included in the new FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TIP. It should be noted that inclusion of a project in the TIP does not represent a commitment of federal funds. The actual obligation of federal funds is contingent upon processing of all federal requirements, including environmental clearance; right-of-way acquisition; right-of-way, utility and encroachment clearance; completion of right-of-way and design plans; deposit of local matching funds with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation; and availability of federal funds. Additionally, all project funds are capped at the cost estimate plus contingencies and inflation. Any cost overages will be borne by the sponsoring entity.

It is strongly encouraged for prospective applicants to schedule project coordination meetings with ACOG staff before or during the Call for Projects period to discuss projects and address any questions. Please contact ACOG at (405) 234-2264 or TPSgrants@acogok.org to schedule a meeting.

INFORMATION:

On November 15, 2021, the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law. This bill increased the amount of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding for states and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) by nearly 70 percent over a 5-year period. In anticipation of receiving these funds, ACOG has created a guidebook for an FY 2023 call for projects (CFP).

The ACOG TAP intends to provide funding for projects and programs that advance non-motorized transportation opportunities in the Central Oklahoma region. This includes projects such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities, recreational trails, safe routes to school projects, and more. TAP continues to build upon the legacy of the Transportation Enhancements and Safe Routes to Schools Programs by providing funding opportunities for local projects that support additional transportation options, strengthen local economies, improve quality of life, protect the natural environment, and enhance transportation infrastructure.

This will be the first of two ACOG TAP CFPs. There will be a total of **\$7.5 million available** for projects in the ACOG adjusted urbanized area. Eligible organizations may not request more than **\$1.5 million** or less than **\$20,000** in federal funds per project. There is no limit on overall project size. No single entity can receive more than 56 percent of the total available funding for TAP until all entities' projects have been considered. Eligible TAP projects will be funded at a ratio of **80 percent federal funds** and **20 percent local funds** for eligible costs.

In order to be eligible for TAP funding, all prospective applicants must fill out a pre-application form for each project. **The pre-application form was made available on August 10, 2022 and will remain available until September 16, 2022.** This will allow ACOG staff time to review projects and discuss potential revisions with the applicant before beginning the full application process. The pre-application form can be filled out here: <https://arcg.is/04nHH0>.

The full TAP application cycle will open on September 1, 2022 and close on October 31, 2022.

In the coming months, ACOG staff, in cooperation with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA), City of Norman Transit, and each ACOG MPO community, will prepare the next Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Central Oklahoma—the FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TIP (October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2027).

The TIP includes specific transportation projects and services to be funded with federal, state, and local funds over a four-year period, as required by federal law. Other federal requirements are that all projects included in the TIP be consistent with the adopted long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and that the total funds reflected in each year of the TIP be within the limits of federal, state, and local funding anticipated to be available.

Oklahoma's MPOs (including ACOG) prepare new TIPs biennially for their respective metropolitan areas for incorporation into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) prepared by ODOT. Therefore, close coordination between the State and the metropolitan areas is essential in the preparation of these documents.

The following page provides key dates associated with preparation of the ACOG MPO TIP that identify when ACOG will provide local and state partners with TIP-related information, deadlines for returning project information to ACOG, and dates for committee review and action on the preliminary and final FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TIP.

The USDOT Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) is a new competitive grant program part of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL). The grant program will be used to fund demonstration projects focused **on advanced smart city or community technologies and systems in order to improve transportation efficiency and safety.**

The FY 2022 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) will open in September 2022.

Provides \$100 million annually from FY 2022 – 2026 to eligible projects. There is no matching requirement.

The grant program criteria is outlined as follows:

Anticipated Program Structure – 2 stage program:

- Stage 1: Planning and Prototyping Grant: up to \$2 million over 18 months
- Stage 2: Implementation Grant: up to \$15 million over 36 months

Who is eligible to apply?

- A State
- A political subdivision of a State
- A Tribal government
- A public transit agency or authority
- A public toll authority
- A metropolitan planning organization
- A group of 2 or more eligible entities detailed above, applying through a single lead applicant

- Sensors
- Systems Integration
- Delivery/logistics
- Innovative aviation
- Smart grid
- Traffic signals

ARTICLE 1 .	GENERAL
ARTICLE 2 .	PURPOSE

ARTICLE ~~1~~. GENERAL

SECTION ~~A~~1. **NAME.** This committee shall be known as the Bicycle-Pedestrian Active Transportation Advisory Committee (BPAG ATAC) of the Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG).

SECTION ~~B~~2. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** The effective date of these bylaws shall be upon adoption by the Intermodal Transportation Policy Committee (ACOG MPO Policy Committee) ~~(ITPC)~~ and endorsement by the ACOG Board of Directors on March 27, 2008.

SECTION ~~C~~3. **AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS.** These bylaws may be amended by majority vote of the ITPC-ACOG MPO Policy Committee and endorsed by the ACOG Board of Directors on their own motion or in response to recommendations forwarded to the ITPC Policy Committee by the Bicycle-Pedestrian Active Transportation Advisory Committee (BPAG ATAC)

ARTICLE ~~2~~. PURPOSE. The purposes of the ATAC shall include:

~~SECTION 1.~~ **PURPOSE.** The purposes of the BPAG ATAC shall include:

- ~~1)a.~~ To update and maintain the regional bicycle and pedestrian system and serve in a planning and technical advisory capacity to the ACOG Board of Directors.
- ~~2)b.~~ To supplement and aid the functions and purposes of ACOG, as defined in the **Agreement Creating the Association of Central Oklahoma Governments**, effective February 16, 1977, as amended.
- ~~3)c.~~ To generate public interest in, and bring attention to, various elements of bicycle and pedestrian planning in the ACOG Region; and to coordinate with local bicycle and walking clubs, local, state, and federal agencies related to bicycle and pedestrian planning.
- ~~4)d.~~ To provide the ITPC-ACOG MPO Policy Committee and the ACOG Board of Directors with advisory recommendations in matters related to bicycle and pedestrian development.
- ~~5)e.~~ To act in any way reasonably related to any of the above-mentioned purposes.

ARTICLE ~~3~~^{III}. MEMBERSHIP AND STRUCTURE

SECTION ~~A~~¹. **REPRESENTATION.** The BPAC-ATAC shall consist of, but not limited to, representatives of the following groups:

- ~~1) a.~~ Local Government – One official staff member from each of the member local governments within the OCARTS-Central Oklahoma Transportation Management Area (TMA) representing any of the following disciplines: Planning, Engineering, or Parks and Recreation. In the absence of these staff, the Chief Executive officer or designee may serve on the committee. (1 Vote each)
- ~~2) b.~~ Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) (1 Vote)
- ~~3) c.~~ Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA) (1 Vote)
- ~~4) d.~~ City of Norman, Oklahoma Transit | ~~Cleveland Area Rapid Transit (CART)~~ (1 Vote)
- ~~5) e.~~ Oklahoma Department of Health (1 Vote)
- ~~6) f.~~ Bicycling clubs and/or associations (2 Votes)
- ~~7) g.~~ Walking and Running clubs and/or associations (2 ~~votes~~^{Votes})
- ~~8) h.~~ Citizens Residents or Neighborhood Associations (2 Votes)
- ~~9) i.~~ Other Federal, State, and Local agencies shall serve in an advisory, non-voting capacity.
- ~~10) j.~~ Other groups, associations, or persons, as approved by the BPAC-ATAC Committee.

SECTION ~~B~~². **ALTERNATES.** Alternate representatives may be designated to act on behalf of voting and non-voting members with all the privileges accorded thereto provided the alternate fulfills the representation requirements under Section 1. The BPAC-ATAC Chair shall be notified in writing of the appointment, reappointment, or replacement of a member's alternate. An ~~the~~ alternate may serve for more than one member, but may only serve as an alternate for one member at a time.

SECTION ~~C~~³. **PROXIES.** Each member shall have the power to appoint a proxy who is not already a member or alternate of the BPAC-ATAC to act in the member's capacity at any meeting in the event the member or alternate cannot attend, if the proxy designation is made:

- a. In writing for a specific period of time, or
- b. By telephone or personal contact with the ACOG Executive Director or designee for one meeting.

A designated proxy, as provided in this section, shall have the right to exercise one vote in all individual proceedings and shall not be permitted to exercise one or more proxies on behalf of other members or alternates.

SECTION ~~D~~⁴. **APPOINTMENT.** The members and alternates of the BPAC-ATAC shall be confirmed by the ITPC-ACOG MPO Policy Committee and endorsed by the ACOG Board of Directors.

SECTION ~~E~~⁵. **TERMS.** Members of the BPAC-ATAC shall be appointed for an indefinite term, to serve as long as qualified under Section ~~4~~¹, above.

SECTION F6. **VACANCIES.** In the event of a vacancy on the BPAG-ATAC, the vacancy shall be filled according to the procedures of ARTICLE III3, Sections 1A and 4D. Vacancies shall be deemed to exist in any of the following cases:

1)a. A member resigns.

2)b. A member, or his/her designated alternate, who has not attended three (3) consecutive meetings shall be considered an inactive member. An inactive member will be notified of his/her/their status and may be considered for replacement by the ITPC-ACOG MPO Policy Committee and ACOG Board of Directors should he/shethey fail to attend subsequent meetings of the BPAG-ATAC.

SECTION G7. **MEMBERS' OBLIGATION.** Each member of the BPAG-ATAC is charged with the responsibility of assisting the ITPC-ACOG MPO Policy Committee and the ACOG Board of Directors and other elected and appointed officials with their decision-making responsibility by making recommendations on important bicycle and pedestrian active transportation issues. As part of the above responsibility, members should foster a constructive interchange of views and attempt to develop an areawide agreement on bicycle and pedestrian active transportation planning efforts.

SECTION H8. **CHAIRMAN.** The Chairman of the BPAG-ATAC shall be the ACOG Executive Director or his/her/their designee.

SECTION I9. **SUBCOMMITTEES.** The BPAG-ATAC shall have the power to create standing committees. Appointment of members to subcommittees shall be by the Chairperson, subject to approval of the membership, and shall not be limited to BPAG-ATAC members. The Chairperson of a subcommittee shall be appointed by the BPAG-ATAC Chairperson and shall be someone who is a member of the BPAG-ATAC.

ARTICLE 4IV. MEETINGS

SECTION A1. **MEETING TIME AND PLACE.** Regular bi-monthly quarterly meetings of the BPAG-ATAC shall be held on the second or third Wednesday of February, March, April, June, August, September, October, and December (or as determined by a majority vote of the Committee) at 109:00 a.m. in the ACOG Oklahoma Conference Board Room, 21 E. Main St, Suite 1004205 N. Lincoln Blvd., except when this date conflicts with holidays or the BPAG-ATAC or Board of Directors requests a change. Meetings may be cancelled or special meetings called at the discretion of the BPAG-ATAC Chairman or the ACOG Executive Director.

SECTION ~~B2~~. **MEETING NOTICES AND MINUTES.** ACOG staff will send out a meeting notice to all members, by mail or email, approximately one week in advance of each meeting. Minutes of each ~~BPAG-ATAC~~ meeting, based on notes and ~~taped~~ recordings of the meeting, will be prepared by ACOG staff. Such minutes shall accurately reflect the conduct of the meeting, all activity and relevant discussion occurring at the meeting and a record of all votes taken, including a discussion of minority points of view. ~~Tape~~ ~~Recordings~~ of all ~~BPAG-ATAC~~ meetings shall be preserved at least twelve (12) months from the date of the meeting and be available for review by any interested party.

SECTION ~~C3~~. **QUORUM.** A quorum shall consist of one-third of the current appointments from designated voting membership. Business conducted in the absence of a quorum shall be noted with a statement that a quorum was not present.

SECTION ~~D4~~. **OPEN MEETINGS.** All meetings of the ~~BPAG-ATAC~~ shall be conducted with no restrictions on the attendance of observers, citizens, or press, and in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act.

SECTION ~~E5~~. **CONDUCT OF MEETINGS.** All meetings of the ~~BPAG-ATAC~~ shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

SECTION ~~F6~~. **VOTING; MAJORITY.** Each ~~BPAG-ATAC~~ member, or properly designated alternate, other than those listed in Article ~~III~~3, Section ~~1A~~ (~~19~~) above, shall have the right to exercise one vote in all individual proceedings of the ~~BPAG-ATAC~~. Majority vote shall consist of a majority of those members and alternates present and voting.

ARTICLE ~~5V~~. ADVISORY ROLE

SECTION ~~A1~~. **ADVISORY FUNCTION.** ~~BPAG-ATAC~~ may, on its own motion, bring important matters relative to bicycle and pedestrian planning to the attention of the ~~ITPG-ACOG MPO Policy Committee~~ and the ACOG Board of Directors.

SECTION ~~B2~~. **SPECIAL PROJECTS.** ~~BPAG-ATAC~~, on its own motion, or on a motion by a member of the ~~ITPG-ACOG MPO Policy Committee~~, may undertake special projects, programs, or studies of policy areas, utilizing the available resources of ~~BPAG-ATAC~~.

ARTICLE ~~6VII~~. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

~~SECTION 1.~~ **SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of these bylaws are severable, and if any part hereof shall be held void by the ~~ITPG-ACOG MPO Policy Committee~~ and the ACOG Board of Directors, such holding shall not affect or impair any of the remaining parts.

On June 28, the STBG-UZA Criteria Subcommittee met to address questions raised by City of Oklahoma City staff and discuss any potential changes or updates to the criteria and STBG-UZA program procedures. The following changes were suggested by subcommittee members and recommended for approval by the ACOG MPO Technical Committee at its August meeting.

Suggested Criteria Change:

- To receive full points for C6: *Does this project provide benefits for multiple communities or leverage other investments?* when partnering with separate entity (non-city related trust, school, university, business district, Tinker AFB, etc.), the partnering entity must provide a financial contribution (property or cash, no in-kind) to the project (documentation will be required). Projects will continue to receive full points for the examples currently listed in the Guidebook.

Suggested Procedures Change:

- Provide detailed table of scores for all STBG-UZA projects to members of the ACOG MPO Technical Committee after projects have been approved for funding.

Any approved modifications will be incorporated into the STBG-UZA Procedures and STBG-UZA Scoring Criteria for consistency between the documents. The updated procedures and criteria will be in effect during the upcoming Call for Projects and the updated documents will be posted to the STBG-UZA Project Scoring Criteria Dashboard:

INFORMATION:

In 2017, ACOG was asked to provide some suggested Critical Urban Freight Corridors (CUFCs) within the MPO boundary. Staff reached out to the ACOG MPO Technical Committee for suggestions – see attached [map](#) and [table](#) for additional information. Nearly 40 miles were added to the Critical Urban Freight Corridors inventory.

The National Highway Freight Network Mileages were updated in February 2022 by FHWA. https://ops.fhwa.dot.gov/freight/infrastructure/nfn/maps/nhfn_mileage_states.htm. The MPO area is now allowed to have up to 75 miles designated as Critical Urban Freight Corridors. 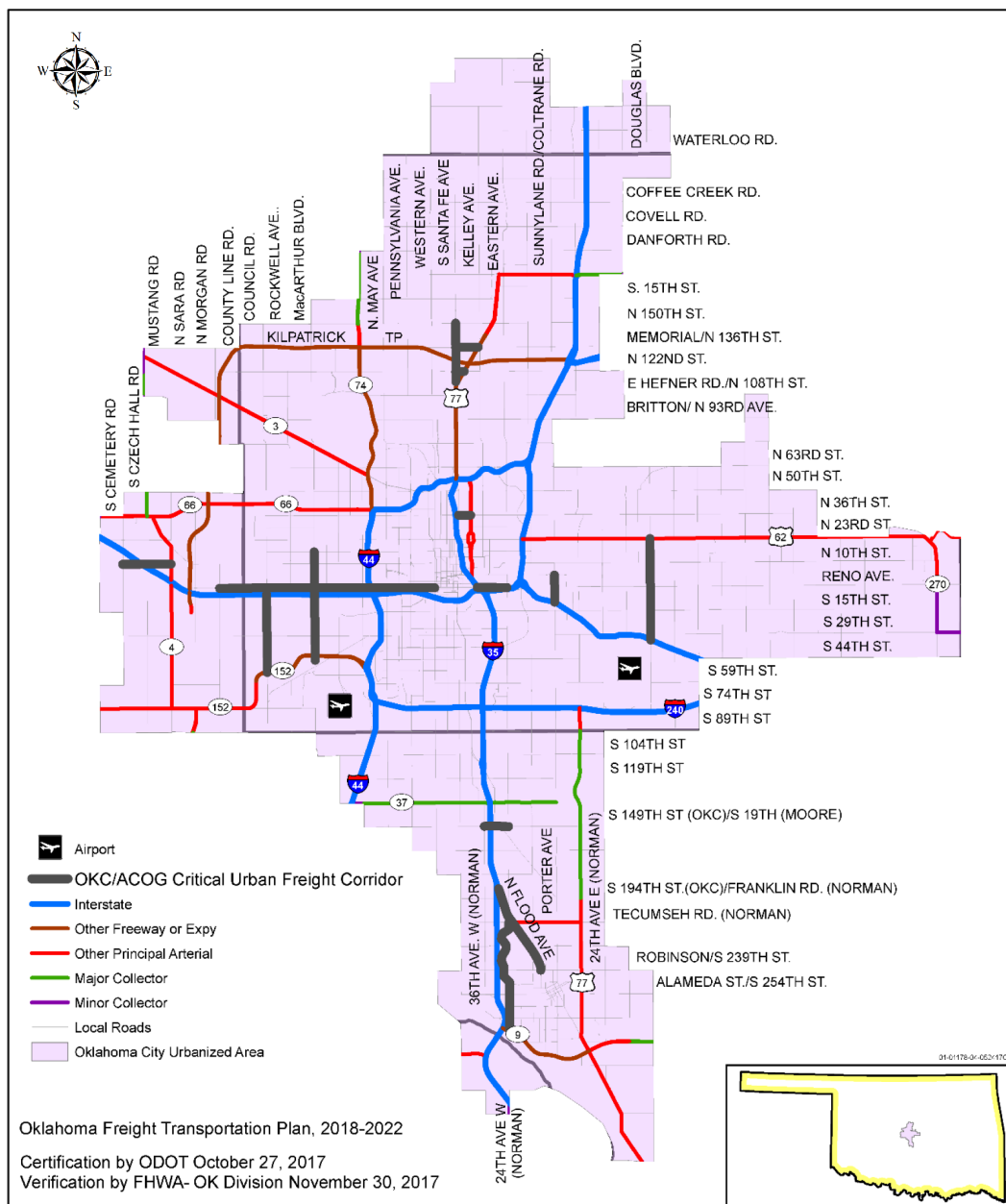
