MINUTES

A. CALL TO ORDER

Dustin Downey called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. A quorum was present.

B. APPROVAL OF THE MARCH 17, 2022, MEETING MINUTES

Jan Fees made a motion to approve the March 17, 2022, minutes. Petya Stefanoff seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. Green & Energy Efficient Building Codes Presentation

Eric Pollard introduced Dr. Lee Fithian to the committee to provide an overview on green building trends and activity in Oklahoma to APTAC members who are interested in exploring partnership opportunities.

Dr. Fithian has a PhD in Engineering, is a Licensed Architect, a Certified Planner, and a LEED AP professional with over 35 years progressive design and project management experience. More on Dr. Fithian from the 'About' section of the University of Oklahoma Christopher C. Gibbs College of Architecture website:

Dr. Fithian's research and teaching efforts focus on the application of biological and ecological models to architectural design. She builds connections between interdisciplinary research and architectural design to conserve and regenerate air and water in urban and suburban environments. Each of her studios carries a strong focus on the technical development and integration of analytical visualizations in order to develop "green" architecture.

2. 2022 Planning and Zoning Application Fees Survey Results

John Sharp said ACOG periodically conducts a building permit fee survey to determine the costs of residential and business permits throughout the region. Mr. Sharp said ACOG was asked to conduct a zoning and application fee survey for the first time to see how much each municipality in the region charges for zoning, specific use permits, subdivision plats, and other types of applications. A detailed survey was presented to the committee where fourteen municipalities completed the survey.

Dustin Downey thanked ACOG for putting the permit fee survey together and the municipalities that participated.

D. UPDATES FROM MEMBERS

Julie Shannon with Yukon said they are getting into more redevelopment. Yukon is updating their development code and reviewing the final draft.

Erik Brandt with Oklahoma County said there are some developments but nothing specific. They are updating their stormwater plan.

Marc Hader with Canadian County said they have a few housing divisions going into place. They are having water challenges because of the number of homes in concentrated areas.

Scherri Pidcock with Luther said there is a housing shortage in Luther because of the influx of people moving in that direction. They are updating their comprehensive plan.

Ryan Conner with Mustang said they have a large residential and commercial development starting. At the town meeting, citizens expressed frustrations on the traffic issues caused by the development.

Sasha McCrone with Oklahoma City said they are updating their codes. The transportation department is updating bikewalkok - adding more sidewalks, parks, and traffic stop signs. She said Oklahoma City recently participated in BikeFest. They will be participating in the Bike to Work Day on May 20, 2022.

Petya Stefanoff with Midwest City said they are continuing the completion of bond projects that were started several years ago. They are expanding their recreational trail system. She said May 24, there will be a ribbon cutting ceremony for a new trail.

Jan Fees with Edmond said they are working on an RFP to update zoning and stormwater regulations. Their permit system is now online, and you cannot bring applications for permits into the office.

Purvi Patel with Choctaw said they are extending utilities efforts due to DEQ mandates. They are updating their building codes and working with Johnson & Associates to review drainage systems.

Casey Jones with the Zoning Commission said every few years they are subject to the Sunset Review. The Governor approved allowing the commission to continue for another three years.

Dustin Downey with El Reno thanked ACOG for the CERI symposium project. He said El Reno is seeing job growth coming back. They completed a study for recreational trails. He also said El Reno is increasing their fees effective July 1.

INFORMATION:

In October 2022, the City of Edmond Council approved the EdmondShift Long-Range Mobility Plan. The EdmondShift Plan modernizes and brings together planning and prioritization for riding transit, walking, biking, driving, ride sharing, and all other modes of transportation. The primary function of EdmondShift is to reconcile, update, and modernize existing plans and consolidate previous recommendations into one comprehensive document for the city to use for all future mobility investment decisions.

The planning process began in August 2021 with data collection, existing plan review, and public feedback on existing conditions and priorities. An Advisory Committee was tasked with guiding the process, creating the vision and goals, and ensuring the plan reflected the vision goals throughout. The Advisory Committee met 8 times over the course of 13 months.

Ken Bryan, Long-Range Planner with the City of Edmond, will provide the committee with an overview of the plan and then discuss the planning process.

INFORMATION:

The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a federal-aid program administered by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department (OTRD). This grant program is part of the Transportation Alternatives formula funding. The RTP provides for 80 percent federal share and requires a 20 percent local match for all projects. The match may be either in cash or in value of documented contributions. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for the match up to 95 percent of the total project cost.

The application deadline is 4 p.m. on Tuesday, January 31, 2023. The application and further information are available on the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department website, https://otrd.travelok.com/about-otrd/get-involved/. This year, the maximum grant amount is \$300,000 (with at least a \$75,000 match), for a total project cost of \$375,000.

Please carefully read the application forms for specific requirements. Additional information will be required for applications involving land acquisition.
