A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. There was not a quorum.

B. APPROVAL OF THE SEPTEMBER 15, 2022 MINUTES

Brandon Bundy moved to approve the September 15, 2022 minutes. Sarah Huffine seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ACTION ITEMS: There were no action items.

D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. Reminder: Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Call for Projects Closes October 31, 2022

John Sharp highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. There was no discussion.

2. Reminder: Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Call for Projects Closes October 31, 2022

Jennifer Sebesta said to please let ACOG staff know as soon as possible if they have any problems with their application(s) that are due Monday, October 31.

3. Reminder: ACOG Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Call for Projects Closes October 31, 2022

Jordan Evans said this TAP Call for Projects has the same deadline as the CRRSAA and STBG-UZA applications - Monday, October 31.

4. National Drive Electric Week Recap

Eric Pollard said ACOG co-hosted three events for National Drive Electric Week, which were held from September 17 to October 1, 2022. He gave a presentation, which can be viewed here: https://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/10/MPO-TC-NDEW-Presentation-20221013.pdf

5. Watch for Me OK Program Update

Jordan Evans gave the following presentation: https://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/10/Watch-For-Me-Program-Update.pdf.

Chair Sharp asked if the committee members ever present crash data to their Council, showing locations that are dangerous. Brandon Bundy said he has talked to the police department, asking them to notify him when there is a crash related to road design, but they never notify him. Chair Sharp wondered how they could broach this subject since the federal government wants regions to get to Vision Zero on safety – a very lofty goal. He said it will take a lot of education for everyone – councils, police departments, design engineers, etc. Justin Henry said Oklahoma City has councilmembers who are very concerned about the crash data, and they will be working on the Vision Zero Plan for safety next year. They will provide frequent reporting to their traffic commission about what crashes were seen and which ones could have been affected due to road design. Mr. Sharp said there needs to be a more accurate collection of GPS locations for crashes as well.

6. Regional Snow Routes for 2022-2023

Jennifer Sebesta said the snow routes map did not get completed in time for this meeting, as there are still changes being made. She said it will be completed soon, but if they have further changes that need to be made, to please let ACOG staff know. Mr. Sharp reminded the committee that last year, our region had its first ice storm in October, so that is why the map is being updated now. So far, the only additions are the Kickapoo on the east side and the Kilpatrick Turnpike extension in the southwest area by the airport, plus Norman has some changes.

7. ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area Line Item Projects and Administrative Modifications

Lauren Wood said this month for FFY 2022 projects, there were two new line item projects and three new administration modifications added by ODOT. She also noted that this month for FFY 2023, there were no statewide line item projects and no administrative modifications. Ms. Wood said if they have any questions, to please contact ACOG staff.

8. Status of Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), and Transportation Enhancement (TE) Projects in the ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area (TMA)

John Sharp said today there would be a quarterly discussion following this meeting when the entities can ask ODOT Local Government staff questions they might have about their projects.

Mr. Sharp asked if there was any new business to present. No new business was presented.

EDMONDSHIFT LONG-RANGE MOBILITY PLAN PRESENTATION

INFORMATION:

In October 2022, the City of Edmond Council approved the EdmondShift Long-Range Mobility Plan. The EdmondShift Plan modernizes and brings together planning and prioritization for riding transit, walking, biking, driving, ride sharing, and all other modes of transportation. The primary function of EdmondShift is to reconcile, update, and modernize existing plans and consolidate previous recommendations into one comprehensive document for the city to use for all future mobility investment decisions.

The planning process began in August 2021 with data collection, existing plan review, and public feedback on existing conditions and priorities. An Advisory Committee was tasked with guiding the process, creating the vision and goals, and ensuring the plan reflected the vision goals throughout. The Advisory Committee met 8 times over the course of 13 months.

Ken Bryan, Long-Range Planner with the City of Edmond, will provide the committee with an overview of the plan and then discuss the planning process.

2022 OZONE SEASON UPDATE

INFORMATION:

During the 2022 ozone season (April through November) there were eight (8) Ozone Alert Days and seventeen (17) instances of monitors exceeding the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) ozone standard of 70 parts per billion (ppb).

The 2022 regional design value for Central Oklahoma is 73 ppb – a violation of the ozone standard. The design value is the highest 8-Hour average registered as a fourth highest average at any of Central Oklahoma's monitoring sites.

EPA's ozone pollution standard uses a three-year average to determine compliance and the current standard is set at 70 ppb. At the end of the 2022 ozone season, our three-year average is 70 ppb.

There is significant risk of the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Area violating the ozone pollution standard and being designated 'nonattainment' by the EPA.

The ACOG Cost of Nonattainment Study for the Oklahoma City Area has estimated \$9.6 - \$15.2 billion in negative fiscal impact to the region if it is designated 'nonattainment.'

2021 CENTRAL OKLAHOMA CLEAN CITIES COALITION (COKCC) TRANSPORTATION TECHNOLOGY DEPLOYMENT REPORT

INFORMATION:

Every year, COKCC submits to the US Department of Energy (DOE) an annual report of its activities and accomplishments for the previous calendar year.

ACOG staff provides data to the National Renewable Energy Lab (NREL) on the sales of alternative fuels, deployment of alternative fuel vehicles and hybrid electric vehicles, idle-reduction initiatives, fuel economy activities, and programs to reduce vehicle miles traveled.

NREL and DOE analyze the data and translate them into fuel conservation and emission reduction impacts for ACOG and COKCC.

In 2021, the coalition reported the following:

- 6,563 pounds of nitrogen oxides (NOx) reduced; 65,857 pounds of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) reduced
- 12.8 million gallons of gasoline equivalent reduced
- 33,011 tons of greenhouse gases reduced

2023 OKLAHOMA RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM

INFORMATION:

The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a federal-aid program administered by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department (OTRD). This grant program is part of the Transportation Alternatives formula funding. The RTP provides for 80 percent federal share and requires a 20 percent local match for all projects. The match may be either in cash or in value of documented contributions. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for the match up to 95 percent of the total project cost.

The application deadline is 4 p.m. on Tuesday, January 31, 2023. The application and further information are available on the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department website, https://otrd.travelok.com/about-otrd/get-involved/. This year, the maximum grant amount is \$300,000 (with at least a \$75,000 match), for a total project cost of \$375,000.

Please carefully read the application forms for specific requirements. Additional information will be required for applications involving land acquisition.
