3. Transportation News and Update Report from John Sharp:

Call For Projects

Since the call for projects opened, ACOG is currently monitoring more than 130 project applications. ACOG has been assisting some of the communities that have asked for help. The application deadline is Monday, October 31, 2022, at 4:00 p.m.

ODOT

Next week, ACOG will meet with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to discuss recent transportation initiatives and funding.

Environmental Justice

ACOG had a meeting with ODOT staff to discuss Environmental Justice practices. We shared how ACOG has used this process in our past transportation plans.

Greater OKC Chamber

This month, ACOG attended the Greater Oklahoma Chamber's Legislative Transportation Committee meeting to discuss their initiatives for the next legislative session.

SkyTran

ACOG had a Zoom meeting with this company who is developing a maglev high speed transportation option. This is an on-demand personal transportation option that is up in the air and each pod/cabin will carry 4-6 people. They are currently in their testing phase.

Oklahoma Turnpike Authority (OTA)

ACOG has been fielding questions from the Norman Transcript regarding the OTA and the interaction between ACOG and OTA. The Transcript has been publishing several articles providing background information to their readers.

Air Quality Advisory Committee

ACOG staff attended the 2022 Air Quality Advisory Committee meeting at the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ).

Alternative Energy

ACOG staff is keeping track of the new solar and hydrogen initiatives that are currently being discussed. There has been a solar campaign for Oklahoma residents and will continue for commercial sign-ups. ACOG is participating in efforts led by the Oklahoma Secretary of Energy & Environmental on the development of an application for the US Department of Energy to make Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana a hydrogen hub (dubbed HALO) for new market and infrastructure development. The application is due in early November.

National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure

ACOG is assisting the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) in its National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) program. The first round of funding is for \$20 million (out of \$66 million total). ACOG's Electric Vehicle Coalition working group has partners that can discuss this topic and share valuable information with ODOT staff.

Electric School Bus

The first round of the national school bus funding is completed. Oklahoma school districts will be awarded \$29 million. The demand was massive and there is a wait list. ACOG will let you know if there is further funding for a second round.

INFORMATION:

In October 2022, the City of Edmond Council approved the EdmondShift Long-Range Mobility Plan. The EdmondShift Plan modernizes and brings together planning and prioritization for riding transit, walking, biking, driving, ride sharing, and all other modes of transportation. The primary function of EdmondShift is to reconcile, update, and modernize existing plans and consolidate previous recommendations into one comprehensive document for the city to use for all future mobility investment decisions.

The planning process began in August 2021 with data collection, existing plan review, and public feedback on existing conditions and priorities. An Advisory Committee was tasked with guiding the process, creating the vision and goals, and ensuring the plan reflected the vision goals throughout. The Advisory Committee met 8 times over the course of 13 months.

Ken Bryan, Long-Range Planner with the City of Edmond, provided the ACOG MPO Technical Committee with an overview of the plan and then discussed the planning process.

INFORMATION:

Every year, COKCC submits to the US Department of Energy (DOE) an annual report of its activities and accomplishments for the previous calendar year.

ACOG staff provides data to the National Renewable Energy Lab (NREL) on the sales of alternative fuels, deployment of alternative fuel vehicles and hybrid electric vehicles, idle-reduction initiatives, fuel economy activities, and programs to reduce vehicle miles traveled.

NREL and DOE analyze the data and translate them into fuel conservation and emission reduction impacts for ACOG and COKCC.

In 2021, the coalition reported the following:

- 6,563 pounds of nitrogen oxides (NOx) reduced; 65,857 pounds of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) reduced
- 12.8 million gallons of gasoline equivalent reduced
- 33,011 tons of greenhouse gases reduced

INFORMATION:

The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a federal-aid program administered by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department (OTRD). This grant program is part of the Transportation Alternatives formula funding. The RTP provides for 80 percent federal share and requires a 20 percent local match for all projects. The match may be either in cash or in value of documented contributions. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for the match up to 95 percent of the total project cost.

The application deadline is 4 p.m. on Tuesday, January 31, 2023. This year, the maximum grant amount is \$300,000 (with at least a \$75,000 match), for a total project cost of \$375,000.

2022 OZONE SEASON UPDATE

INFORMATION:

During the 2022 ozone season (April through November) there were eight (8) Ozone Alert Days and seventeen (17) instances of monitors exceeding the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) ozone standard of 70 parts per billion (ppb).

The 2022 regional design value for Central Oklahoma is 73 ppb - a violation of the ozone standard. The design value is the highest 8-Hour average registered as a fourth highest average at any of Central Oklahoma's monitoring sites.

EPA's ozone pollution standard uses a three-year average to determine compliance and the current standard is set at 70 ppb. At the end of the 2022 ozone season, our three-year average is 70 ppb.

There is significant risk of the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Area violating the ozone pollution standard and being designated 'nonattainment' by the EPA.

The *ACOG Cost of Nonattainment Study for the Oklahoma City Area* has estimated \$9.6 - \$15.2 billion in negative fiscal impact to the region if it is designated 'nonattainment.'
