A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:09 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. There was a quorum.

B. APPROVAL OF THE OCTOBER 13, 2022 MINUTES

Erik Brandt moved to approve the October 13, 2022 minutes. Justin Henry seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ACTION ITEM:

1. ACOG MPO Technical Committee Meeting Schedule for CY 2023

John Sharp presented the proposed meeting schedule for CY 2023. David Riesland moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve the proposed CY 2023 ACOG MPO Technical Committee meeting schedule. Joshua Johnston seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. EdmondShift Long-Range Mobility Plan Presentation

Jordan Evans introduced Ken Bryan, Long-Range Planner with the City of Edmond, to present EdmondShift. The presentation can be viewed here: https://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/11/EdmondShift ACOG Presentation 20221110.pdf

Mr. Bryan said EdmondShift was an effort to modernize and integrate all the different modes' specific transportation plans the City of Edmond had approved over time. The City was assisted in this process by an advisory committee populated with citizens-at-large and representatives from other boards, committees, and commissions.

Justin Henry noted that maintenance was one of the main focuses in EdmondShift, and wondered how they dealt with sidewalk maintenance. Mr. Bryan said Edmond handles that in one of two ways. In the downtown area, the city takes responsibility for maintaining the sidewalks. In areas other than downtown, it is the property owners responsibility. There is a cost-sharing program, which is not well utilized, and a relatively new formal program called "Fill the Gap" which requires developers to put in sidewalks, but there are a lot of gaps since that rule is not as old as the city. Edmond also sends its crew around to complete sidewalks and work on ramps.

Matt VanAuken asked if the developers can pay a fee to not have to create sidewalks. Mr. Bryan said they can, but that is not done often. Melissa Davis asked about sidewalks along the main road and Mr. Bryan said the programs apply to sidewalks everywhere.

Justin Henry asked about establishing the high injury network, noting that Oklahoma City is discussing collisions resulting in injuries and fatalities, which are very different maps, and the traffic engineers have never looked at it before. Mr. Bryan said they place injuries and fatalities on the same map. They have two sources of crash data – the police report and the transportation planning group utilizes Crash Magic, and they perform some basic analysis. Once on the map, that is their high injury network.

Julie Shannon said, regarding the scoring criteria, if they are successful with their Vision Zero, they will not receive any more federal money due to the criteria. She suggested to look at the criteria for projects like this so it is not based on fatalities. Mr. Sharp said ACOG

may revise its current scoring in regard to safety. With the STBG-UZA funding, ACOG can possibly make it more attractive to apply for these safety projects.

Mr. Bryan said his understanding is that a Vision Zero resolution is required if successful with Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) implementation projects. Matt VanAuken asked for the time frame for the Vision Zero resolution in Edmond. Mr. Bryan said they should be able to get that to City Council before the end of this year or early next year. He said the EdmondShift Plan is the stand-in for the Safety Action Plan that is part of SS4A, so they were able to apply for project funding as opposed to plan funding in this first round. Mr. Sharp said the safety implementation funding grant that can be applied for has a suggested minimum of \$5 million. To apply for the implementation funding, a safety action plan must be completed first. The plan grant is for a suggested minimum of \$250,000 (80/20 match), and that may be too expensive for some of our region's smaller cities.

Mr. Sharp said in the spring, there will be a presentation about how long it takes to complete a TAP or STBG project after it is awarded by ACOG. He said when federal funds are used, it takes longer since NEPA and other federal requirements need to be met.

2. 2022 Ozone Season Update

Eric Pollard gave a presentation, which can be viewed here: https://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/11/2022-Ozone-Season-Recap-Presentation-V2.pdf

Mr. Pollard said when thinking about air quality in Oklahoma, the two main EPA regulated pollutants ACOG is concerned about are ozone and particulate matter, which could translate into increased risk of asthma attacks, heart attacks, and other negative public health impacts. ACOG partners with ODEQ in the monitoring network they have around the state, with our region being regulated at four sites. He noted that 0.070 parts per billion (ppb) is the current national standard.

Mr. Pollard said it depends upon weather conditions, the time of year, and time of day as to whether the region has good ozone readings. High readings of nitrogen oxide, volatile organic compounds, and extreme sunlight can equal ozone problems. He said our region is in violation for this year, but EPA looks at a three-year average, so if EPA would look at the chart now, our region would be right at 0.070 ppb. EPA will probably not have another round of designations until 2025. The issue for next season is that the critical value for the OKC North site could be 0.072 ppb.

Mr. Pollard said ODEQ has monitoring sites from which they take samples, and the specific locations are shown on their website. Sarah Huffine asked if there is only one site in Choctaw. Mr. Pollard said yes, and ODEQ takes a sample once an hour over a 24-hour period.

Sasha McCrone asked what measures are being taken to remedy the chance of nonattainment, and is there something that can be done with our federal funds in a way that helps. Mr. Pollard said in the long-range plan, this issue is addressed – active transportation, fleet electrification, land use planning, etc. He said ACOG leans heavily on its member communities and the private sector for help.

Mr. Sharp said if the region goes into nonattainment, it will cost about \$9-\$15 billion. The funds will come from additional permitting fees and may take longer to receive. Construction of new roads could become more complicated and expensive. He said conversely, the vehicle fleets are getting cleaner, and the gas mileage is improving.

Melissa Davis said that ODOT has been tasked to create a task force to look at how they will fund roads and bridges, and there will be a pilot study for those who own electric vehicles, so that funding is not lost.

Mr. Pollard said the Cost of Nonattainment Study, which provides additional information, can be found on ODEQ's website.

3. 2021 Central Oklahoma Clean Cities Coalition (COKCC) Transportation Technology Deployment Report

Jordan Evans highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. He encouraged the committee members to begin the process now, as some of the application requirements take some time.

5. Status of Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), and Transportation Enhancement (TE) Projects in the ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area (TMA)

John Sharp said to please review the projects and if they have questions, to contact ODOT Local Government. He said that by September 2023, many of the older TAP projects must be let, or the funding will be lost.

E. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Sharp asked if there was any new business to present. No new business was presented.

F. ADJOURN

There being no further business, Chairman Sharp adjourned the meeting at 11:05 a.m.

INFORMATION:

The following amendment has been proposed for the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program:

The Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA) has submitted a request to amend the FFY 2023 Transit Element of the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). COTPA is requesting the amendment (see letter on next page) in order to program FFY 2022 FTA Section 5339(b) Bus and Bus Facilities funds for the purchase of ten 40' CNG buses and twelve paratransit vans. COTPA is also requesting to program FFY 2022 FTA Section 5337 State of Good Repair funds to be used for dredging of the Oklahoma River. This amendment will not supersede COTPA's previous amendments but adds to the program of projects.

This amendment will ensure consistency among the TIP, STIP, and the grant awards. Upon approval of the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, the request will be forwarded to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and then to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)/Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for final approval.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Consider recommending that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee amend the FFY 2022-2025 TIP by updating COTPA's FFY 2023 Transit Element with the attached program of projects and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

This TIP Amendment One is to program the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339(b) Bus and Bus Facilities competitive funds for FFY 2022 for COTPA. These funds will be used to purchase 40' CNG Buses (10) and Paratransit Vans (12). The Amendment One will also program FTA Section 5337 State of Good Repair funds for FFY 2022. These funds will be used for Dredging the Oklahoma River. This Amendment does not supersede COTPA's FFY 2022 TIP Amendment Two, but it adds to what was previously programmed in Amendment Two.

The match may be either in cash or in value of documented contributions. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for up to 95 percent of the total project cost as matching funds.
