#### **Grant Applications**

ACOG staff held an initial review of the project applications that were submitted for the three transportation grant programs.

#### Oklahoma Turnpike Authority (OTA)

ACOG had a positive interview with a reporter from the Norman Transcript on our interaction with the OTA. Most of the interview was spent providing information on ACOG's transportation programs.

#### **Safety Grant Application**

ACOG was asked by the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) to discuss our Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) safety grant application, along with Guthrie and Oklahoma City. USDOT staff were concerned that we were asking for funding for the same thing and that our geographies overlapped. The three entities had a chance to discuss project goals and decided to go ahead with our original three separate grant applications.

#### FHWA/ODOT Coordination

ACOG staff attended a coordination meeting with FHWA and ODOT along with INCOG, the MPO in Tulsa. We discussed FHWA transportation initiatives and funding and decided to have quarterly meetings going forward.

#### **Traffic Counts**

Several of our cities have been collecting traffic counts, that also includes bike/pedestrian counts.

#### Regional Air Quality Plan

ACOG staff is developing the outline for a Regional Air Quality Plan, which is the follow-up to the Cost of Nonattainment Study.

#### Oklahoma Dept. of Environmental Quality

ACOG staff attended an annual review of the current year's air quality numbers for the state.

#### **Clean Cities Training Workshop**

ACOG staff attended the training workshop in Denver.

#### **Transit News**

EMBARK's Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) is scheduled to launch in October 2023. They will be constructing stations/platforms similar to the streetcar. This will run from the Transit Center in downtown Oklahoma City to Classen Blvd., then to N.W. Expressway out to Meridian Ave.

#### **Norman Transit**

This week Norman Transit has been hosting meetings to gather feedback on future route changes and system modifications.

ACOG is continuing the Clean Air for Public Sector Fleet Grant with a FY 2023 Call for Projects this spring. This grant program strives to improve air quality in Central Oklahoma by funding alternative fuel infrastructure and electric vehicle charging infrastructure, alternative fuel vehicles, electric vehicles, hybrid vehicles, alternative fuel off-road equipment, and electric off-road equipment. Funding for the Public Fleet Grant Program will be provided through the federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) and the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP).

To date, ACOG's Public Fleet Conversion Grants program has awarded over \$4.5 million in CMAQ funds to help ACOG members and other public entities reduce fleet and equipment emissions.

#### **INFORMATION:**

#### **INFORMATION:**

The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a federal-aid program administered by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department (OTRD). This reimbursement-type grant program is part of the Transportation Alternatives formula funding. The RTP provides for 80 percent federal share and requires a 20 percent local match. The match may be either in cash or in value of documented contributions. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for up to 95 percent of the total project cost as matching funds.

The application deadline is 4 p.m. on Tuesday, January 31, 2023. The application and further information are available on the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department website, <a href="https://otrd.travelok.com/about-otrd/get-involved/">https://otrd.travelok.com/about-otrd/get-involved/</a>. This year, the maximum grant amount is \$300,000 (with at least a \$75,000 match), for a total project cost of \$375,000.

#### **INFORMATION:**

The following amendment has been proposed for the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program:

The Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA) has submitted a request to amend the FFY 2023 Transit Element of the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). COTPA is requesting the amendment (see letter on the next page) in order to program FFY 2022 FTA Section 5339(b) Bus and Bus Facilities funds for the purchase of ten 40' CNG buses and twelve paratransit vans. COTPA is also requesting to program FFY 2022 FTA Section 5337 State of Good Repair funds to be used for dredging of the Oklahoma River. This amendment will not supersede COTPA's previous amendments but adds to the program of projects.

This amendment will ensure consistency among the TIP, Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), and the grant awards.

Prior to action by the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, a public hearing will be opened, and comments will be received from any public in attendance.

The ACOG MPO Technical Committee has recommended approval<sup>1</sup>. Upon approval of the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, the request will be forwarded to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and then to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)/Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for final approval.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Motion to amend the FFY 2022-2025 TIP by updating COTPA's FFY 2023 Transit Element with the attached program of projects and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

#### **INFORMATION:**

On October 3, 2022, the Oklahoma Transportation Commission (OTC) approved a new 8-Year Construction Work Plan (FFY 2023-FFY 2030). The plan contains critically needed transportation improvement projects for the state's on-system facilities (interstates, US and state highways, and bridges). The work plan continues to focus on reducing the number of structurally deficient bridges in the state, while also focusing on improving pavement conditions statewide and reducing the number of two-lane highways with deficient shoulders.
