#### 1. 2023 Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program

Rhonda Moore gave a presentation to the committee about the Recreational Trails program. She said the application deadline is 4 p.m. Tuesday, January 31, 2023. This year, the maximum grant amount is \$300,000 (with at least a \$75,000 match), for a total project cost of \$375,000. #### 2. Watch for Me OK Program Update

Jordan Evans said ACOG has worked with consultant Anglin PR to administer and promote the Watch for Me OK bicycle and pedestrian safety campaign. ACOG was awarded \$105,000 from the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office to continue the program into FFY 2023. Jordan Evans provided the committee with an update on the status of current TAP projects provided by the ODOT Local Government Division.

#### D. NEW BUSINESS

Lissa Wohltmann, an Edmond resident, attended to discuss concerns about the pavement conditions and safety on Eastern Avenue, north of NE 36<sup>th</sup> Street. She requested the city of Oklahoma City repair this road, as it is the primary route for bicyclists between Oklahoma City and Edmond. She also requested the speed limit on the I-35 frontage road be reduced to improve safety.

Jan Fees with the City of Edmond informed the committee about Cycle 66, a bicycle ride taking place in Edmond. The ride is on November 6, 2022, and includes a 10-mile, 33-mile, and 66-mile route. She is also looking for volunteers to work the rest stops.

Edmond is also working on a new Mobility Plan called EdmondShift. It is going through a review process and should wrap up on October 24.

Max Harris with Oklahoma City said they are updating their Comprehensive Plan. They are also updating their bike/pedestrian plan, bikewalkokc.

Jordan Evans announced new branding for the ACOG agendas.

#### **INFORMATION:**

On September 1, 2022, ACOG issued a Call for Projects for the \$7.5 million in Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funds assigned to the ACOG MPO area. ACOG received 25 applications for this competitive grant program, requesting \$21,780,750 in federal TAP funding.

ACOG staff completed its review of the TAP applications, scoring sheets, and supporting documentation that were submitted by member entities. This process included verifying project components and scoring accuracy. All project applications were then reviewed by a scoring committee comprised of other ACOG staff and staff from both the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and the Oklahoma City Community Foundation (OCCF).

The nine projects selected for funding can be seen on the following page.

#### **ACTION REOUESTED:**

Consider recommending that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve funding for the attached FY 2023 TAP Project Award List, with Cleveland County's "Fairgrounds Multi-Use Trail" and Edmond's "Downtown Detention Facility Multi-Use Trail" projects as alternate projects to receive any additional funding that may become available.

#### **INFORMATION:**

In October 2022, the City of Edmond Council approved the EdmondShift Long-Range Mobility Plan. The EdmondShift Plan modernizes and brings together planning and prioritization for riding transit, walking, biking, ride sharing, and all other modes of transportation. The primary function of EdmondShift is to reconcile, update, and modernize existing plans and consolidate previous recommendations into one comprehensive document for the city to use for all future mobility investment decisions.

The planning process began in August 2021 with data collection, existing plan review, and public feedback on existing conditions and priorities. An Advisory Committee was tasked with guiding the process, creating the vision and goals, and ensuring the plan reflected the vision goals throughout. The Advisory Committee met 8 times over the course of 13 months.

Ken Bryan, Long-Range Planner with the City of Edmond, will provide the committee with an overview of the plan and then discuss the planning process.

## BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN RELATED BILLS INTRODUCED IN THE 2023 OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE

#### **INFORMATION:**

ACOG is monitoring the following bicycle and pedestrian related bills that have been introduced in the 2023 Oklahoma Legislative Session.

#### SB 306 - Sen. Carri Hicks - Income tax credit for the purchase of an e-bike.

Provides one-time \$200 income tax credit for the purchase of an e-bike.

#### HB 1330 - Rep. Judd Strom - Removes wattage restriction from e-bikes.

This bill would remove the maximum power output of 750 watts for e-bikes.

#### HB 2099 - Rep. Forrest Bennett - Rebate for the purchase of an e-bike.

Rebate amount equal to the purchase price but not to exceed \$1,000. Rebate program is not to exceed \$100,000 per fiscal year.

#### HB 2752 - Rep. Nicole Miller - Removes right-of-way for pedestrians.

Pedestrians must yield right-of-way to vehicles in the intersection at the time a walk signal begins and prohibits pedestrians from entering a roadway when a Don't Walk signal is present.
