1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Rod Cleveland called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 23, 2023 MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING

Director Mark Hamm made a motion to approve the February 23, 2023 minutes. Director Ray Poland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Chair Cleveland presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

A. Finance Report - Authorization of Payments of February 2023 Claims

Director Ray Poland made a motion to approve the item under the consent docket. Director Phil Freeman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOARD OF DIRECTORS ACTION

A. NGA 911 Implementation Status Report

Karyn Henry, Communications Consultant, Mission Critical Partners (MCP), highlighted the current issues as detailed in the agenda memorandum regarding NG911 Implementation Status Report that can be viewed here:

Director Moore asked if the goal to fix the issue will be completed this week. Ms. Henry said during the amendment period, the vendors will be able to motify the solutions as needed for the scenario to pass. She said the test scenarios must pass in order for staff to move forward and begin implementation. She said testing for Part A and Part B is scheduled to begin this week, with MCP facilitating. She said that anytime during the 30-day period, vendors will have access to test independently in the training lab located in the ACOG building.

Mr. Sweeney added that if NGA 911 is unable to fullfill their obligation, staff will end the contract with NGA 911 and an agenda item for the Solacom Solution will be presented at the April 27, 2023, Board meeting. Director Mark Hamm asked if staff would be able to send the testing results to the Board. Mr. Sweeney said ACOG staff will provide a results report to the Board members the week of April 11. Ms. Henry said once testing has concluded, MCP will have three business days to provide the results of the testing to the vendors.

Chair Cleveland asked if the quote for additional cost is for MCP or Solacom. Mr. Sweeney said the quote for additional cost is for Solacom. He said the contract for MCP will be up for renewal in December 2023. Director Ray Poland asked if the agreement will be fulfilled for 2024. Mr. Sweeney said if implementation goes according to plan, the process will continue into 2024.

7. GENERAL STATUS REPORT

911 OPERATIONS:

Viper Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) Server outage: 911 staff received a VoIP Server alarm on March 15 from the MidCon Datacenter. Staff diagnosed a fan-motor failure and was able to replace the defective motor, returning the VoIP Server to full service within 24 hours. No 911 calls were dropped during this outage.

911 GIS:

Dispatch Map Aerials & Map Data Updates: GIS staff has been updating Aerials for the dispatch maps, in addition to the monthly map data updates. Fire District and Community maps have been prepared and delivered, confirming 911 boundaries for the requesting agencies.

OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:

Active Assailant Course: April 3, 2023. This (1) day course is the most comprehensive active shooter class on the market. It not only gives telecommunicators the historical prospective of the active shooter, but also provides skills the telecommunicator can use during active shooter events.

Suicide Intervention Course: April 4, 2023. This (1) day interactive course is designed to educate telecommunicators in crisis intervention. Topics include - suicide attitudes, risk assessment of caller, risk assessment of responder, and telecommunicator intervention.

INFORMATION:

NGA 911 Call Routing Solution and Solacom Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress 911 staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program.

Facilitated by Mission Critical Partners (MCP), final Operational readiness testing (ORT) was performed with 911 ACOG, NGA 911, and Solacom on March 27 - March 30, 2023. The ORT plan identified 22 failover test cases and 21 functional test cases (which created 58 different test scenarios) to ensure all core functionality of the NG911 system—coupled with call handling, was operational and ready for deployment.

Most of the test cases were successful. However, seven test scenarios "failed," with one test scenario tentatively marked as "pass" due to a longer-than-expected loss of audio. Per the Third Contract Amendment (January 20, 2023), NGA 911 was provided an opportunity to research unsuccessful test cases and provide 911 ACOG with a Regression Test Plan which included additional test scenarios to ensure that any fix applied to correct the failed test scenarios did not cause other functionality disruptions.

The regression testing consisting of 20 scenarios was performed on April 5, 2023. All tests were successful, and the Fourth Contract Amendment (March 1, 2023) concluded on April 7, 2023.

911 Institute staff will complete El Reno Dispatcher re-training Friday April 28 in preparation for the May 2El Reno ECC cutover. Mustang and Yukon Dispatcher re-training will be completed on Friday, May 12, with Mustang ECC cutover scheduled for May 23, and Yukon ECC cutover scheduled for June 6, completing Cut Group One.

911 staff will continue working with both solution vendors and the ECCs to coordinate Dispatcher re-training and cutover scheduling for Cut Groups Two through Five.

David Jones, MCP Co-founder & Senior Vice President, Strategic Accounts, will be present at the April Board meeting to answer any questions.
