Chairperson Josh Moore called the meeting to order at 1:39 p.m. A quorum was present. He welcomed all in attendance.

1. Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Proposed Project Scope Change by the City of Bethany: Hannah Nolen, AICP, TPS Program Coordinator

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information provided in the agenda memorandum.

Commissioner Mark Sharpton made a motion to approve the proposed CRRSAA project scope change as requested by the City of Bethany. Mayor Glenn Berglan seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Requested Change to FY 2018 Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Project Funding: Hannah Nolen, AICP, TPS Program Coordinator

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information provided in the agenda memorandum.

Mayor Glenn Berglan made a motion to approve moving \$240,000 in returned TAP funds to the City of Norman's Flood Avenue Project. Mayor Phil Freeman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. TABLED ITEM FROM MARCH 30, 2023 MEETING.

ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area (TMA) Boundary Review: John Sharp, Deputy Director and City of El Reno Representative

John Sharp provided a presentation on the analysis based on ACOG MPO TMA Boundary. The presentation can be viewed here: <https://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/05/ACOG-MPO-TMA-2023-updated-Johns-presentation.pdf>

Commissioner Mark Sharpton made a motion to approve the addition of El Reno, Union City, and portions of Canadian County to the ACOG MPO TMA boundary contingent on final approval from ODOT and FHWA, with the stipulation that ACOG MPO membership would be effective on July 1, 2023, but these communities would not be eligible for federal transportation dollars until FY 2025. Councilmember Todd Stone seconded the motion.

4. Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Discretionary Grant Program & National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program: David Frick, TPS Air Quality & Clean Cities Planner II

David Frick said the CFI Discretionary Grant Program will provide \$2.5 billion over five years and is divided into two separate categories. He said because of the size of this funding, there are some important things to know. The grant requires an 80/20 percent match. For the Community Program, there is a \$500,000 minimum project size and for the Corridor Program, there is a \$1 million minimum project size. This will be difficult for smaller communities, but communities can group together for a joint application to help cover that match. Mr. Frick said applications are due May 30. Chairman Sharp said for the entities to contact ACOG if they wish to group together with other entities.

Mr. Frick also gave an update regarding the NEVI Formula Program as detailed in the agenda memorandum.

5. Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Project Awards: John Sharp, Deputy Director

John Sharp highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. He referred to the table that listed the ODOT TAP Awards in the ACOG Transportation Management Area (TMA).

6. Transportation News and Update Report from John Sharp:

Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Tasks

ACOG staff is currently working on UPWP tasks and budget for FY 2024.

MPO Coordination

ACOG had a zoom meeting with the new Transportation Director at INCOG. He is a former Department of Transportation (DOT) employee in Kansas. We discussed MPO/DOT coordination opportunities.

ODOT

ACOG attended an MPO quarterly meeting at ODOT to discuss planning transportation funding.

Noble Meeting

In April, ACOG discussed the STBG-UZA process with the Town of Noble and discussed the future ODOT expansion of US 77 to four lanes as it reaches the south side of their community.
