

## SPECIAL SESSION TIMELINE

# acog

- Special Session convened on Monday, June 12, 2023
- House Members arrived on June 12 and voted to override Gov. Stitt's veto of a bill extending state-tribal motor vehicle compacts (HB1005X) & to extend the special legislative session through July 31
- The Senate was not in session on June 12, due to a failure to assemble a quorum
- Senate convened on June 26 and took up the compact veto overrides SB26X (tobacco) and HB1005X (motor vehicle) and the resolution to extend the special session to July 31
- Senate failed to override SB26X
  - Sen. Treat will call for an override again in July when more Senators will be present
- Senate adjourned Special Session to the call of its chair, without taking up the possible override of HB1005X
- Senate did approve to extend their special session to the end of July

## SPECIAL SESSION ACTIVITIES

# acog

- There are three budget-related bills in the House that the House did not vote on because the Senate failed two of the budget bills in their chamber
- Speaker McCall says the House will only come back into session to hear the Senate overrides
- Because the Senate could not override the veto on SB 26X, the House will not be in session
- The Governor can call both legislative bodies into session again after July 31 with orders to bring about tax relief
- Lobbyists with Majority Plus believe that if that occurs, the House and Senate would arrive and then vote to adjourn
- There can be a vote on a budget bill or veto override as the first order of business in February 2024 Regular Session
