MINUTES -

1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Carrie Blumert called the meeting to order at 1:07 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. APPROVAL OF JUNE 29, 2023 MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING

Director Matt Dukes made a motion to approve the June 29, 2023 minutes. Director Phil Freeman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. COMMUNICATIONS:

- A. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT Chair Blumert said she was happy to serve as the new 911 ACOG Chair.
- B. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT Mark Sweeney acknowledged that Director Phil Freeman, Mayor of Noble, is now serving as Vice-Chair, and Director Roger Godwin, Mayor of Warr Acres, is now serving as Secretary/Treasurer.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS OR DELEGATIONS

None

5. CONSENT DOCKET

Chair Blumert presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

A. Finance Report - Authorization of Payments of June and July 2023 Claims

Director Amy Neathery made a motion to approve the item under the consent docket. Director Phil Freeman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOARD OF DIRECTORS ACTION

A. Selection and Contract Authorization of Professional Auditing Services

Debbie Cook highlighted the recommendations as detailed in the memorandum regarding the Contract Authorization of Professional Auditing Services. She said the previous agreement with Arledge & Associates, P.C., to provide professional auditing services to ACOG and 911 ACOG, expired at the conclusion of the FY 22 audit. She said on June 5, 2023, staff released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Professional Auditing Services for ACOG and 911 ACOG. She said staff received proposals from three different firms and these proposals were reviewed by an evaluation committee, consisting of ACOG staff members Mark Sweeney-Executive Director, John Sharp-Deputy Director, Debbie Cook-Finance Director, and Debbie Wilczek-Accountant II/Procurement Administrator. She said the evaluation committee met on August 1, 2023 to evaluate all the proposals for both technical qualifications and price.

She said the proposal that scored the highest was the new proposal submitted by Arledge & Associates, P.C., of Edmond. She said the evaluation committee believes that the services of Arledge & Associates, P.C. will best meet the needs of ACOG and 911 ACOG. She said the price for the FY 23 audits will be \$38,000, and based on the contractual option to renew, the prices for the audits of the subsequent fiscal years will be \$39,300 for FY 24, \$40,600 for FY 25, \$42,000 for FY 26 and \$43,000 for FY 27. Director Rod Cleveland asked why the price was increased. Ms. Cook said the dollar amount is the total amount for both ACOG and 911 ACOG and ACOG is higher because they have a single auditor.

Director Matt Dukes made a motion to approve the selection of Arledge & Associates, P.C., and to authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and execute a contract to provide ACOG and 911 ACOG with professional auditing services for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, with the option to renew for each of the four (4) subsequent fiscal years, subject to concurrence of the ACOG and 911 ACOG Board of Directors. Director Terry Arps seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

B. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Mr. Hawkinson highlighted the current status as detailed in the memorandum regarding NG911 Implementation. He said at the June 29 Board Meeting, Mission Critical Partners' (MCP) update explained the decision to separate the call handling equipment and next generation 911 implementations. He said the primary objectives of this approach are to mitigate risk by reducing complexity and stabilize the ECC environment. He said 911 staff heard the Board's desire to focus on the implementation of the call handling equipment first in order to address issues being experienced with the current aging equipment.

He said once the call handling equipment is installed and functioning as expected, 911 ACOG will begin Next Generation Core Service implementations. He said 911 ACOG has executed a contract amendment with Solacom, and the gateways were installed the week of August 14, 2023. He said 911 staff is testing the call handling system and training the first ECC cut group in preparation for cutovers. He said the Intrado text control center (TCC) router is in place and final configurations are being completed with Intrado.

He said ECC cutovers will begin on September 12, 2023, starting with Mustang, and will continue every two weeks until November 2023 when they will increase to one per week. He said staff anticipates having ten ECCs on the new Solacom equipment prior to the holidays in December 2023. The report can be viewed here:

Director Brian Grider asked why the cutover for El Reno was postponed. Mr. Hawkinson said El Reno did not want to be first this time since they had experienced several lost calls and multiple issues with audio. Director Rob Jones asked when the cutover is for Yukon and Piedmont. Mr. Hawkinson said the cutover for Mustang will start September 12, Yukon will cut September 26, and El Reno will cut October 10.

MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman called the meeting to order at 1:20 p.m. There not being a quorum present, the Chair stated the Board would discuss "For information only" items.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING

Due to lack of a quorum, this item was deferred to next Board meeting.

3. COMMUNICATIONS:

- C. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT Chair Freeman said since there was no quorum, the Board will forgo any agenda items that require action.

D. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Brent Hawkinson highlighted the current status as detailed in the memorandum regarding NG911 Implementation. He said as reported at the August 31 Board meeting, call handling equipment was being configured and tested in anticipation of cutovers beginning September 12, 2023. He said after testing, audio issues were discovered that have caused 911 ACOG to postpone the ECC cutovers scheduled for September. He said that the audio problem is under the purview of another supplier called Audio Codes. He said 911 ACOG continues to work with the solution vendor to resolve the issues and begin ECC cutovers as quickly as possible. He said staff will continue collaboration with the solution vendors for the most expedient and reliable options for the public and our ECCs.

Director Ben Whitt asked if any changes could happen without notice. Mr. Hawkinson said no, staff will be informed of any changes. He said staff is meeting with Solacom next week to discuss the issues regarding the audio. Director Vickie Douglas asked if the lack of audio will affect cell service. Mr. Hawkinson said once the ECC gets the call, it would go through the Guardian System, so the audio reception and delivery must be without issue. He said there have been cases where the audio is clipped and/or the caller does not receive all of the audio.

Mr. Sweeney said this is an internal issue within Audio Code's technical system that they are in the process of correcting. Director Marci White asked if there was a configuration issue. Mr Sweeney said it has nothing to with ACOG staff and that this is an internal issue. Mr. Hawkinson added that staff is working with Solacom engineers to resolve the issue. He said Solacom engineers have been working directly with Audio Codes to find a solution to the audio issue. Chair Freeman asked if these were existing issues or issues that come up as staff proceeds further. Mr. Hawkinson said Solacom owns the relationship with Audio Codes, but ACOG staff will continue to insist that the system is running correctly before implementation.

INFORMATION:

NGA 911 Call Routing Solution and Solacom Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress 911 staff and our vendors are making with implementing the NG911 Program.

911 ACOG continues to negotiate a contract amendment with NGA 911. Meetings were held October 11 and October 19. Progress was made and additional meetings are being scheduled. MCP Senior Vice President and Director of Strategic Accounts, David F. Jones, will be presenting the 911 ACOG NG911 Project Summary.

As reported at the September 28 Board meeting, audio issues were discovered that are the purview of another supplier - Audio Codes.

911 ACOG has facilitated escalation of this issue to the Audio Codes CEO located in Tel Aviv and is tracking the issue closely. Several issues related to the Israeli-Hamas War are impacting this effort.

911 ACOG continues to work collaboratively with Solacom, the solution vendor, to resolve the issues and begin ECC cutovers as quickly as possible. A pre-release "debug" update has been provided to Solacom by Audio Codes for testing, which is currently underway. Solacom Vice President of Sales & Public Safety, Tony Parrott, will be presenting a summary of testing and troubleshooting efforts with Audio Codes.

Due to these factors the scheduled October, November, and December cutovers have been postponed.
