MINUTES

1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Eric Pollard called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., welcoming all in attendance.

2. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES MARCH 14, 2023

Eric Pollard asked for a review of the March 14, 2023, minutes. There were no comments on the minutes.

3. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY

Coalition Strategic Plan:

Eric Pollard said the Department of Energy has added grant deliverable requirements of Clean Cities Coalitions to create strategic planning documents. Mr. Pollard shared that in 2021 the coalition was redesignated by the Department of Energy for a five-year period. Mr. Pollard presented the committee with the ACOG's coalition mission statement for the strategic plan.

Mr. Pollard asked the committee to participate in an online interactive tool called Mentimeter to get feedback on the goals of the coalition.

Funding Opportunities Update

Eric Pollard said ACOG is in the process of selecting applications for the Public Fleet Grant. There is around four million dollars of funding available for this program, which is a two-year grant cycle. ACOG will not be accepting applications next year, so we are working closely with applicants. Mr. Pollard said this is a funding opportunity for the public and private sector.

EMPOWER GRANT - Workplace Charging Outreach Grant Update

David Frick said this initiative involved thirty Clean Cities Coalitions are involved including the two coalitions in Oklahoma, and that employers were being engaged on the benefits of workplace charging.

2024 Policy & Legislative Priorities Discussion

Eric Pollard said that ACOG is compiling a legislative agenda which includes Clean Cities related items and that Coalition stakeholders should reach out to staff if they had identified legislation or policy priorities for the upcoming legislative session.

Fall Events Update

David Frick said the first event is National Drive Electric week is September 22 - October 1, 2023. Mr. Frick said ACOG is working on a social media campaign that is coming soon. The next event is the Clean Cities Award Luncheon on November 2, 2023, at 11:30 - 1:00 p.m.
