Jennifer Sebesta highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum.

Presiding Chairperson Glenn Berglan opened the public hearing. There being no response from the public, the public hearing was closed.

Mayor Peter Hoffman made a motion to amend the FFY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program by updating the COTPA FFY 2024 Transit Element with the attached program of projects, replacing the FFY 2026 and FFY 2027 local government Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) projects with the updated project lists, and amending the FFY 2024 local government projects to include the Air Quality Small Grant and Public Fleet Grant projects, and submitting the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Councilmember Shelli Selby seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area 2020 Population by County and City: John Sharp, Deputy Director

John Sharp highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. Mr. Sharp presented the committee with tables listing the county and city population totals for 2010, 2020. John Sharp said ACOG anticipates requesting approval of the data at the June ACOG MPO Technical and Policy Committee meetings.

3. Transportation News and Update Report: John Sharp, Deputy Director

Regional Safety Action Plan

ACOG continues to work on the Regional Safety Action Plan and hosted the second planning team meeting. ACOG was provided with a preliminary review of the high crash

rate locations in the metro area. Mr. Sharp informed the committee that handouts are available on the table, and there is a link to a map where you can mark dangerous locations that you have observed. Part of this plan is to reach out to the public and get their feedback. In May, the consultant and staff provided educational material at the Norman Farm Market.

Grant Applications

ACOG staff had a meeting with El Reno staff to discuss future grant applications.

STBG Projects

Last month, ACOG brought \$80 million in STBG projects for FY 2026 and 2027 for your approval. We have been informed by ODOT that an additional \$10 million in 4th quarter federal redistribution funds for STBG will be made available soon. These funds can be used for past projects that are already under construction.

Federally Funded Transportation Projects

ACOG staff continues to coordinate transportation projects with local communities and ODOT staff.

Bike Month

May was not a good month for bicycle events that had been scheduled. BikeFest was canceled and the Full Moon Bike ride was canceled due to the weather. Many Bike to Work events and local community rides were able to go ahead, in between showers and storms. ACOG will provide feedback on these events in June.

Del City Bike Education

ACOG staff attended the event at Townsend Elementary School, which was sponsored by the Rotary Club. We were able to provide helmets and reflective equipment for safety. It was an interesting event as the Mayor and a city councilwoman attended and a few people running for state office.

Bike Safety Education

ACOG staff continues to provide bike safety education classes at libraries and various events/locations around the metro.

Regional Air Quality Plan

ACOG staff and consultants are working on the Regional Air Quality Plan. The report will be completed later this year.

John Sharp encouraged the committee to check out the grants memo in the consent docket.

INFORMATION:

To ensure that the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) continues to reflect local government priorities that meet federal requirements for authorization, ACOG is inviting each community within the ACOG MPO boundary to submit projects for funding consideration.

If your entity wishes to submit a project or projects, the following information needs to be submitted to ACOG no later than **4 p.m., Tuesday, September 3, 2024.**

- **ProjectTracker application form** for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s). Applications submitted during the last Call for Projects (and therefore have an application already created) will be open for editing.
- **STBG-UZA Programming Resolution** (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).
- **Itemized cost estimate** for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming CFP submission deadline. Costs associated with right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.
- **Map of each proposed project** showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and the names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- The appropriate **Project Rating Worksheet(s)** for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements or resurfacing with bicycle facilities, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component.
- **ODOT Project Scoping Form** for each project.
- Any supporting documentation listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

Pre-applications are not required for this Call for Projects cycle. A completed CY 2023 Network Monitoring Survey must be submitted by the Call for Projects deadline in order to be considered for funding. The CY 2023 Network Monitoring Survey is available for download here: [Network Monitoring Survey CY 2023 \(excel file\)](#).

As a reminder, each STBG-UZA project selected for a locked year must be programmed through ACOG and ODOT, and all proposed federal-aid projects (except bridges) must be located on the approved Federal Functional Classification System for the Oklahoma City Urban Area. Construction projects on the State Highway System (interstates, U.S. highways, and state highways) are not eligible for funding.

Selected projects will be included in the forthcoming FFY 2026-2028 ACOG MPO TIP document. It should be noted that inclusion of a project in the TIP does not represent a commitment of federal funds. The actual obligation of federal funds is contingent upon processing of all federal requirements, including environmental clearance; right-of-way acquisition; right-of-way, utility and encroachment clearance; completion of right-of-way and design plans; deposit of local matching funds with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation; and availability of federal funds. Additionally, all project funds are capped at the cost estimate plus contingencies and inflation. Any cost overages will be borne by the sponsoring entity.

It is strongly encouraged for prospective applicants to schedule project coordination meetings with ACOG staff before or during the Call for Projects period to discuss projects and address any questions. **Please contact ACOG at (405) 234 2264 or at TPSgrants@acogok.org to schedule a meeting.**

FY 2025 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP) CALL FOR PROJECTS

INFORMATION:

On November 15, 2021, the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law. This bill increased the amount of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding for states and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) by nearly 70 percent over a 5-year period.

The ACOG TAP intends to provide funding for projects that advance non-motorized transportation opportunities in the Central Oklahoma region. This includes projects such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities, recreational trails, safe routes to school projects, and more. TAP continues to build upon the legacy of the Transportation Enhancements and Safe Routes to Schools programs by providing funding opportunities for local projects that support additional transportation options, strengthen local economies, improve quality of life, protect the natural environment, and enhance transportation infrastructure.

A Call for Projects (CFP) was last held in FY 2023 with \$7.5 million available for projects in the ACOG Adjusted Urbanized Area (UZA). The CFP was held from September 1, 2022, through October 31, 2022. As a result, nine projects were awarded at a total of \$7,487,454. The remaining \$12,546 in funding from that call, will be added to the 3 years of funding available for the FY 2025 ACOG TAP CFP.

The FY 2025 CFP will have a total of approximately **\$7.5 million available** for projects in the [ACOG Adjusted Urbanized Area](#). Eligible organizations may not request more than **\$1.5 million** or less than **\$20,000** in federal funds per project. There is no limit on overall project size. No single entity can receive more than 56 percent of the total available funding for TAP until all entities' projects have been considered. Eligible TAP projects will be funded at a ratio of **80 percent federal funds** and **20 percent local funds** for eligible costs.

The TAP application cycle will open on July 1, 2024, and closes at 4 p.m., Tuesday, September 3, 2024.

INFORMATION:

As mentioned at the May ACOG MPO Policy Committee meeting, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) is willing to provide up to \$10 million in additional Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funds to the ACOG MPO. These funds are made available through the fourth quarter redistribution of federal transportation funds. For local government projects to be eligible for additional funding, they must meet the following criteria:

1. Projects must have been previously awarded funding through ACOG's STBG-UZA Program.
2. Projects must be under construction, recently let, or be authorized prior to October 2024.
3. These 80/20 percent projects are where the local match exceeded 20 percent.

ODOT Local Government staff has identified the projects listed in [Table 1](#) as meeting all necessary requirements. If approved, the FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) will be amended to reflect the increase in funding for these projects once it is made available.

Prior to action by the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, a public hearing will be opened, and comments received from any public in attendance.

The ACOG MPO Technical Committee has recommended approval. Upon approval by the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, the request will be forwarded to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), and then to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for final approval.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Motion to approve the projects listed in Table 1 to receive additional STBG funding through ODOT, amend the FFY 2024 local government Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) projects of the FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TIP to reflect these changes, and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

INFORMATION:

ACOG staff has developed the 2020 base data for the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). The MPO is required to develop a Plan update by the fall of 2026. The early work involves assembling land use and socioeconomic data for the base year (2020). This will be followed by utilizing scenario planning to allocate population and employment based on future development patterns and land use capacity.

At this time, the final 2020 total population of 1,333,280 has been calculated at the regional, county, city, and traffic analysis zone (TAZ) level using block level data from the 2020 Census. The TMA boundary has changed since the last plan and so some additional portions of counties and cities have been added.
