Jan Fees with Edmond said she went to the National Bike Summit in Washington, D.C. Ms. Fees said it was wonderful riding bikes in DC. She said Bart Vleugels came to Edmond's Bike committee meeting to talk about what his work is, and now she feels communication with Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) is better.

Petya Stefanoff with Midwest City said they are updating their comprehensive plan, and they have a separate master plan. Ms. Stefanoff said they will be adding more options to the comprehensive plan.

Chuck Mikkelson with Oklahoma City Running Club said May 27 and 28 is Oklahoma City's Memorial Marathon. The Arts Festival and Olympic rowing event are all happening the same weekend. Mr. Mikkelson said they are expecting 23,000 runners for the marathon.

FY 2025 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP) CALL FOR PROJECTS

INFORMATION:

On November 15, 2021, the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law. This bill increased the amount of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding for states and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) by nearly 70 percent over a 5-year period.

The ACOG TAP intends to provide funding for projects that advance non-motorized transportation opportunities in the Central Oklahoma region. This includes projects such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities, recreational trails, safe routes to school projects, and more. TAP continues to build upon the legacy of the Transportation Enhancements and Safe Routes to Schools programs by providing funding opportunities for local projects that support additional transportation options, strengthen local economies, improve quality of life, protect the natural environment, and enhance transportation infrastructure.

A Call for Projects (CFP) was last held in FY 2023 with \$7.5 million available for projects in the ACOG Adjusted Urbanized Area (UZA). The CFP was held from September 1, 2022, through October 31, 2022. As a result, nine projects were awarded at a total of \$7,487,454. The remaining \$12,546 in funding from that call, will be added to the 3 years of funding available for the FY 2025 ACOG TAP CFP.

The FY 2025 CFP will have a total of approximately \$7.5 million available for projects in the ACOG Adjusted Urbanized Area. Eligible organizations may not request more than \$1.5 million or less than \$20,000 in federal funds per project. There is no limit on overall project size. No single entity can receive more than 56 percent of the total available funding for TAP until all entities' projects have been considered. Eligible TAP projects will be funded at a ratio of 80 percent federal funds and 20 percent local funds for eligible costs.

The TAP application cycle will open on July 1, 2024, and closes at 4 p.m., Tuesday, September 3, 2024.
