1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER 14, 2024 MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING

Director Roger Godwin made a motion to approve the November 14, 2024 minutes of the 911 ACOG Board of Directors Meeting. Director Kathy Griffith seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. COMMUNICATIONS:

A. **CHAIR'S REPORT** – Chair Freeman wished the Board Happy Holidays.

B. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT** – Mark Sweeney said there will be holiday refreshments available for the Board throughout the meeting. He said Mr. Hawkinson will introduce the promoted and new ACOG employees. Mr. Hawkinson introduced Kale Littlefield having been reclassified as 911 System Support Manager, replacing Chris Camp, and Brandon Walker and Nick Kugler-Fukhimi as the recently hired 911 System Specialist Is.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS OR DELEGATIONS - None

5. CONSENT DOCKET

Presiding Chair Freeman presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

A. Finance Report – Authorization of Payments of November 2024 Claims

Director Matt Dukes made a motion to approve the item under the consent docket. Director Steven Gentling seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOD ACTION

A. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Mr. Hawkinson highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum regarding the NG911 Implementation Status Report. He said the final “end to end” testing is still in progress. He said the testing process is a collaborative effort between 911 ACOG, NGA, and Comtech. He said the next testing session is scheduled for December 18, 2024, with additional testing scheduled for January 2025. He said there will be final “end to end” testing before staff will proceed with the migration of Next Generation Core Services.

7. GENERAL STATUS REPORT

911 OPERATIONS:

- NGA Next Generation Core Services (NGCS) Migration: Staff has been assisting with facilitating end-to-end testing between NGA and Comtech at the TierPoint & MidCon Data Centers. Next testing is scheduled for December 18, 2024, 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. CST.

911 GIS:

- 911 ACOG GeoDatabase Schema Conversion: GIS staff is provisioning the 911 ACOG GIS data for NGA regarding current and future GIS data uploads for NG911.
- GIS staff stays engaged in address and plat requests for local communities and consistently provides additional GIS updates.

OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:

- APCO Public Safety Telecommunicator (PST) I: December 16 – 20 The five-day course may be used for new-hire and existing employee training. The PST course blends the knowledge and skill building information needed for a basic telecommunicator with the most up-to-date information on the technology and issues in public safety communications centers.
- Suicide Intervention: January 13, 2025. This one-day interactive class is designed to educate Public Safety call-takers in crisis intervention. Topics include suicide attitudes, risk assessment of caller, risk assessment of responder, and call-taker intervention.
- Mass Attacks in Public Spaces: January 21, 2025 & January 28, 2025. Mass Attacks in Public Spaces analyzes targeted attacks that occurred in public or semi-public locations in the U.S., in which three or more people were harmed (not including the attacker).

The class focuses on identifying the sources that may have information on the subject's actions, stressors, recent changes in his or her life, and behaviors that may have concerned others. Using the systems approach not only helps gather information, but it can also help

identify changes in the subject's behavior over time and whether they act differently in varying contexts.

The class will be taught by Jeff Murray, Domestic Security Strategist (DSS), National Threat Assessment Center, Protective Intelligence and Assessment Division, U.S. Secret Service.

The class is approved for (4) hours of CLEET credit under course number 24-3941. The class can only be attended by commissioned law enforcement officers or those currently employed as a public safety telecommunicator.

INFORMATION:
NGA Call Routing Solution and Comtech Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program.

Final testing of the networks by 911 ACOG, Comtech and NGA is scheduled to begin the week of January 20, 2025. Once complete, the deployment plan and schedule can be finalized by NGA.

The first Originating Service Provider (OSP) is tentatively scheduled to migrate two weeks after final testing of the network is successful. Full system acceptance is tentative to occur approximately 16 weeks later.

911 ACOG continues to work with Tinker AFB and NGA to incorporate Tinker AFB into the NGA Call Routing Solution. Tinker AFB's timeline for cutover remains dependent on their acquisition of the necessary circuits, which has not yet occurred.
