1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. A quorum was present.

A. Finance Report - Authorization of Payments of December 2024 Claims

Director Terry Arps made a motion to approve the item under the consent docket. Director Roger Godwin seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOD ACTION

A. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Mr. Hawkinson highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum regarding the NG911 Implementation Status Report. He said NGA Call Routing Solution and Comtech Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program. He said the next testing session is scheduled for January 24, 2025. He said additional testing is planned for early – mid February. He said Originating Service Provider (OSP) should migrate approximately two weeks after testing.

7. GENERAL STATUS REPORT

911 OPERATIONS:

 NGA Next Generation Core Services (NGCS) Migration: Staff has been assisting with facilitating pre-end-to-end testing between NGA and Comtech at the TierPoint & MidCon Data Centers. Next testing is scheduled for January 24, 2025.

911 GIS:

- 911 ACOG GeoDatabase Schema Conversion: GIS is provisioning the 911 ACOG GIS data for NGA regarding current and future GIS data uploads for NG911.
- GIS staff stay engaged in address and plat requests for local communities and consistently provides additional GIS updates.

OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:

Mass Attacks in Public Spaces: January 28, 2025. Mass Attacks in Public Spaces analyzes
targeted attacks that occurred in public or semi-public locations in the U.S., in which three
or more people were harmed (not including the attacker).

The class focuses on identifying the sources that may have information on the subject's actions, stressors, recent changes in his or her life, and behaviors that may have concerned others. Using the systems approach not only helps gather information, but it can also help identify changes in the subject's behavior over time and whether they act differently in varying contexts. The class will be taught by Jeff Murray, Domestic Security Strategist (DSS), National Threat Assessment Center, Protective Intelligence and Assessment Division, U.S. Secret Service.

The class is approved for (4) hours of CLEET credit under course number 24-3941. The class can only be attended by commissioned law enforcement officers or those currently employed as a public safety telecommunicator.

 APCO Public Safety Telecommunicator (PST) I: February 10 – 14 The five-day course may be used for new-hiring and existing employee training. The PST course blends the knowledge and skill building information needed for a basic telecommunicator with the most up-to-date information on the technology and issues in public safety communications centers.

Director Arps asked what time the Mass Attacks in Public Spaces class will start on Tuesday. Mr. Hawkinson said the class will begin at 9:00 a.m.

Chair Freeman asked if the 69 calls shown on the Monthly Guardian ECC Call Volume Statistics are simulated. Mr. Hawkinson said these calls are placed to the Training ECC. He said if one of the ECCs has any issues, they can come to the ACOG building and log in as a live ECC. Mr. Sweeney said Pafford EMS is taking over many of EMSA's contracts throughout the region and has approached ACOG regarding setting up a meeting.

INFORMATION:

NGA Call Routing Solution and Comtech Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program.

Final testing of the networks by 911 ACOG, Comtech and NGA was scheduled for February 19, 2025, but due to inclement weather has been rescheduled to February 28, 2025. Once complete, the deployment plan and schedule can be finalized by NGA.

The first Originating Service Provider (OSP) is tentatively scheduled to migrate two weeks after final testing of the network is successful. Full system acceptance is tentative to occur approximately 16 weeks later.

911 ACOG continues to work with Tinker AFB and NGA to incorporate Tinker AFB into the NGA Call Routing Solution. Tinker AFB's timeline for cutover remains dependent on the completion of their network connectivity.
