#### Regional Air Quality Plan

ACOG staff has been involved in several meetings to discuss the Regional Air Quality Plan. A presentation on this project will be presented at today's Board meeting.

#### Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP)

Stantec is working on the CCAP, which is the second part of the EPA grant that ACOG received. They have started coordination meetings with ACOG staff and several member communities. This also included reaching out to Tribes in the study area.

#### Concrete & Asphalt

In December, ACOG met with representatives of Dolese, Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ), and Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) to discuss new technologies used in making concrete and asphalt. There is an effort to make their road building products more resilient and they continue to look at cost savings measures to get there.

#### Central Oklahoma Long Range Transit Plan.

ACOG staff has been very active in providing support to the plan, attending several outreach meetings.

#### 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan

The plan will be completed in late 2026. As part of the plan, ACOG staff continues to work on the 2020 base year data.

#### **Deep Fork Trail**

ACOG has been included in discussions with various groups. There may be some issues getting all of the ROW.

#### **Uncommon Grounds Park**

ACOG staff was asked to provide feedback on the park taking shape in Edmond. They are exploring grant opportunities to help build out the 60+ acre park.

#### **Aerial Data**

The regional collection of data for participating communities in the region is ongoing and staff has been reviewing submitted bids.

#### **David Frick**

Congratulations to David Frick, who has been elected to the Department of Energy Clean Cities Coalition Council.

- Changes in plans that need to be incorporated or removed.
- Verify the year when the infrastructure was opened or its future opening.

#### INFORMATION

On June 12, 2024, ACOG issued a Call for Projects (CFP) for the \$7.5 million in Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funds assigned to the <u>ACOG Adjusted Urbanized Area</u>. ACOG received 18 applications for this competitive grant program, totaling \$14.8 million in requests for federal TAP funding.

ACOG staff completed its review of the 2024-2025 TAP applications, scoring sheets, and supporting documentation that were submitted by member entities. This process included verifying project components and scoring accuracy. All applications were also reviewed by Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) staff.

After conducting a review of 2024-2025 TAP applications, ACOG has identified 9 projects to receive full or partial funding, as well as 2 projects as alternates to receive additional funding as it may become available.

The projects selected for funding, as well as the alternate projects, can be found on the following page.

The Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC) recommended approval at their February 13, 2025, meeting.

#### **INFORMATION:**

Performance-based planning and programming has become a national emphasis per recent federal transportation legislation—namely, the 2012 Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act, 2015 Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, and 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). Federal planning requirements direct metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) to coordinate with their respective state department of transportation and area public transportation providers in developing 14 performance measures and targets to track and maximize the benefits of transportation planning decisions and infrastructure investments.

Recently the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) submitted the five required safety targets to FHWA. Now, ACOG as an MPO, needs to identify and submit the regional safety targets for those same five performance measures. Federal guidance states that the MPOs may either support the targets of the state, or may submit their own targets based on the regional data. In either instance, ACOG will need to report on the measures and the targets, and eventually explain how the region is making progress towards reaching those targets. This occurs through both the short-range plan (TIP) and Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). In particular, projects should be selected using criteria which help support the goals, measures, and targets established by the region in the MTP.

The staff presentation will outline possible options for the regional safety targets and the attachment on the next page summarizes these options and recommendations.

#### **INFORMATION:**

On October 7, 2024, the Oklahoma Transportation Commission (OTC) approved a new 8-Year Construction Work Plan (FFY 2025-FFY 2032). The plan contains critically needed transportation improvement projects for the state's on-system facilities (interstates, US and state highways, and bridges). The work plan continues to focus on reducing the number of structurally deficient bridges in the state, while also focusing on improving pavement conditions statewide and reducing the number of two-lane highways with deficient shoulders.
