ACOG staff have been busy providing support and attending meetings with various groups regarding the Long Range Transit Plan. A Virtual Town Hall meeting was held on January 30. The discussion centered around current and future routes for each transit agency.

Congestion Management Process

ACOG has started discussions with Olsson Associates. They are updating the regional Congestion Management Process. ACOG will be sending an email asking for you to hold the date of March 13 for the stakeholder's kick-off meeting. This process will take approximately one year to complete.

Federal Legislation and Executive Orders

ACOG is currently monitoring Federal Legislation regarding transportation policy. We are having continued discussions with our local Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) office, Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) staff, other MPOs, and local planning staff.

Air Quality

There are several air quality initiatives currently under review. Work on the \$1 million EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG) grant is currently moving ahead.

2025 CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS

INFORMATION

Earlier this year, ACOG signed a contract with Olsson Associates to work on the 2025 Congestion Management Process (CMP). A staff kickoff was held in February and on March 13, a stakeholder project initiation meeting was hosted at ACOG. Both Technical and Policy Committee members were invited, as was ODOT staff. The meetings provided an opportunity to review the scope of the project and the proposed timeline. This \$245,520 project, which is funded by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), will last through the end of calendar year 2025.

The last CMP was completed in 2016, and a great deal has changed in the region since then. The purpose of this update is to develop strategies to manage and reduce congestion throughout the transportation system. The plan must analyze all transportation options and include freight and rail. To help with this work, the consultant will review peer cities/regions and look at strategies that have been successfully implemented.

At the March Policy Committee meeting, a brief overview of the process will be presented.
