May is National Bike Month, sponsored by the League of American Bicyclists and celebrated in communities from coast to coast. Established in 1956, National Bike Month is a chance to showcase the many benefits of bicycling and encourage more residents to give biking a try. ACOG is planning the following events and activities to promote bicycling for transportation, recreation, and health.

BikeFest will serve as the kick-off to Bike Month and will feature bike shops and organizations, music, activities for kids, bicycle demonstrations, and more! BikeFest is scheduled for Sunday, May 4, 2025, from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Wheeler Ferris Wheel (1701 S. Western Ave., Oklahoma City, OK).

National Bike & Roll to School Day will be held on Wednesday, May 7, 2025. Bike & Roll to School Day invites participants to celebrate the joy of active commuting while building a sense of community and school spirit. Communities are encouraged to coordinate activities with their school districts and bike clubs or other organizations. Planned events like bike busses are designed to help children bike to school safely, promote exercise, reduce congestion, and normalize cycling as a means of transit. While May 7 is this year's official date, communities are welcome to celebrate any day in May that best fits their schedules.

Bike to Place of Worship will take place May 16-18, 2025. Bike to Place of Worship offers residents and faith leaders an opportunity to strengthen the connections within their congregations by organizing group rides to church, mosque, synagogue, or other places of worship.

Bike to Work Week is May 12-18, 2025, and **Bike to Work Day** is Friday, May 16. Please begin planning your Bike to Work Day group rides and routes, and let ACOG know the routes you plan to take. REGIONAL SOLSMART AND CHARGING SMART DESIGNATIONS

INFORMATION:

ACOG is committed to advancing transportation and energy initiatives that enhance the quality of life in our region. In line with this commitment, ACOG staff is actively pursuing two designations: SolSmart Regional Designation and Charging Smart Designation.

<u>SolSmart</u> is a national program funded by the U.S. Department of Energy that recognizes communities for encouraging solar energy growth at the local level and implementing best practices in permitting, zoning, and community engagement to reduce barriers to solar energy development.

More solar development in Central Oklahoma supports the ACOG Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) energy diversification goals and the ACOG emissions reduction strategies. Despite being the 6th best state for solar potential, Oklahoma is ranked 40th in solar development.

ACOG staff believes <u>criteria can be met to achieve a Regional SolSmart designation</u> in the next 6-12 months.

<u>Charging Smart</u> is a national designation program that assists local governments in setting and achieving electric vehicle (EV) readiness goals. The program offers free technical assistance to help communities adopt policies and practices that support the deployment of EV charging infrastructure.

By pursuing the <u>Charging Smart Designation</u>, ACOG aims to ensure Central Oklahoma residents and businesses can realize transportation electrification benefits (cost savings and cleaner air). Like SolSmart, participation in the Charging Smart program will help Central Oklahoma communities with permitting, zoning, and stakeholder engagement in support of EV infrastructure development.

Individual cities and counties can also pursue SolSmart and Charging Smart designations.

INFORMATION:

In early March, Transportation Planning Services (TPS) staff sent a survey to members of the Areawide Planning and Technical Advisory Committee (APTAC) meeting seeking general information from member communities regarding the status of their comprehensive plans, as well as points of interest within the comprehensive plan process that committee members would like to discuss with other planning practitioners.

Potential discussion topics include:

- RFP development and consultant selection
- Community engagement and citizen involvement
- Transitioning from plan development to implementation
- Infrastructure (including streets, sidewalks, trails, and water/wastewater)
- Transit (including rail, bus, and micro-transit)
- Housing & homelessness
- Land use management (including current and future land use, zoning, development codes, growth management policies, and environmental preservation)
- Economic development (including tax revenues, special districts, downtown plans, and placemaking)
- Community appearance (including historic preservation, parks, and arts & culture)
- City services (including utilities, police, fire, libraries, and code enforcement)
- Urban design standards
