INFORMATION:

Development impact fees are payments made to local governments by land developers to offset the cost of expanding existing or constructing new capital facilities, such as water and wastewater facilities, parks, and streets.

Fees are typically paid in advance of the completion of the development based on a calculation of estimated impacts to public facilities proportionate to the nature and size of the development. Impact fees can be used to fund public improvements that benefit, and are off-site of, the development.

Committee members are invited to use this time to discuss impact fees, as well as broader development and finance challenges, in their communities.

To begin the conversation, Justin Henry, City of Oklahoma City Transportation Program Planner, will present on the development of an updated impact fee policy for Oklahoma City.

INFORMATION:

In the spring of 2024, ACOG was <u>awarded funding</u> from the U.S Department of Agriculture (USDA) to pilot a community composting program in the Central Oklahoma region.

The USDA/NIFA <u>Composting and Food Reduction Program (CFWR)</u> diverts food waste from landfills and creates strategic partnerships. This is the first time a project in Oklahoma was awarded.

Fertile Ground Cooperative is the sub-awardee of this two-year grant.

The program expands free compost and food waste drop-off locations while providing finished compost products to farms, schools, local businesses, and nonprofits. Fertile Ground is establishing 20 community drop-off sites in Central Oklahoma.

The program addresses the need for a more regional approach to landfill diversion, an issue discussed in the <u>2022 ACOG Board Retreat Regional Visioning</u>. The pilot program improves solid waste management through composting, recycling, and reuse - includes educational outreach, data collection, community participation, and development of waste reduction strategy components.

In spring 2025, ACOG applied (and has received preliminary notification of successful award) for an FY 2026 Professional Service Grant through the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) to take the initial steps in developing a Regional Solid Waste Management (SWM) Plan.

Terry Craghead, Founder & CEO of Fertile Ground, will present on the development of this program.

INFORMATION:

ACOG continues to provide information to members and committees on available grants in Central Oklahoma. Below is information on a few open grant opportunities in the region.

Legacy Grants - Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust (TSET)

- Application window closes June 16, 2025. Minimum award amount \$3 million.
- One-time funding opportunity designed to address Oklahoma's leading causes of death cancer and cardiovascular disease by funding large-scale, transformational projects in areas such as rural health and quality of life improvements.
- Eligible applicants include nonprofit organizations and municipal, county, and tribal governments.

Hometown Grants Program - T-Mobile & Main Street America

- Summer application window closes June 30, 2025. Fall application window opens July 1.
- Award amounts up to \$50,000. No match required. Projects must be able to be executed within 12 months of receiving funds.
- Applicant communities must have a population <50,000.
- Eligible projects include shovel-ready community revitalization projects, revitalizing or repurposing historic structures, or creating or improving public assets in downtowns.

Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program - U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT)

- The SS4A grant program supports planning, infrastructural, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users.
- Maximum 80% federal cost share. The application deadline is June 26, 2025.
- <u>Planning and demonstration grant</u> funding may be used to develop a safety action plan; or for supplemental planning or demonstration activities, such as feasibility studies, development of complementary plans, or new technology pilot programs. <u>Implementation grant</u> funding may be used to implement roadway safety projects identified in an existing action plan, such as intersection improvements, traffic-calming, and safe routes to school strategies.
