5. Transportation News and Update Report: John Sharp, Deputy Director

Grant Funding

ACOG is opening three sets of grant funding: The Surface Transportation Block Grants, Air Quality Grants, and Public Fleet Grant, which open on September 2, 2025, and close on October 31, 2025. If your staff requires help with the online application process, please let ACOG staff know. Also, if your staff is unsure which project fits in which grant program, please reach out to ACOG staff and we will review the criteria with them.

Regional Long Range Transit Plan

ACOG staff has worked on these tasks, which will be finished this fall. The final Plan will be made available to this committee for their review and then adoption in November. This will provide an extensive transit update that will be included in the Encompass 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan.

Quarterly MPO Coordination Meeting

ACOG staff attended the meeting at ODOT. We discussed a new Secretary Duffy letter, current ODOT statewide plans, possible Department of Public Safety/Oklahoma Highway Patrol decisions, and general updates from the MPOs.

Heartland Flyer

Texas Department of Transportation (DOT) voted in the affirmative to fund the service for another year after the North Central Texas Council of Governments managed to raise enough money for FY 2026.

Stantec

Stantec staff will be returning to the region in September for additional meetings to discuss the regional plan to help communities proactively prepare for challenges related to transportation, energy use, land use, and emergency management. This plan aims to reduce risks from extreme weather and ensure critical services remain reliable and cost effective.

Congestion Management Process (CMP)

A meeting was held earlier this month at ODOT with Olsson, the Congestion Management Process consultant. ODOT and ACOG staff discussed the status of the CMP (comparing the 2016 version to current regional conditions), then discussed ODOT's Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) structure in the metro area. In September, we will expand our conversation to include local communities that have or are interested in ITS improvements. The goal is to coordinate all communities with ODOT, so we can more efficiently move around the region.

Drive EV Oklahoma

This month, ACOG and INCOG relaunched Drive EV Oklahoma (DEVOK), a statewide initiative to promote electric vehicle (EV) adoption. DEVOK is part of ACOG's Clean Cities efforts to reduce transportation emissions and improve public health through alternatives fuels and other fuels savings technologies.

Oklahoma Department of Commerce Department of Energy (DOE)

ACOG was awarded \$60,000 in additional Oklahoma Department of Commerce Department of Energy State Energy Program funding to support Clean Cities work through September. Unfortunately, a \$12,000 DOE Clean Cities contract that was set to begin in April has yet to be executed by the current administration. ACOG members and Clean Cities stakeholders are being asked to sign a letter to Congress in support of future DOE Clean Cities funding. To sign this letter, please see Eric Pollard from our staff after today's meeting.

Clean Cities Coalition

On June 30, 2025, ACOG and the Central Oklahoma Clean Cities Coalition held an electric school bus workshop and listening session with the school districts from around the region. The workshop is funded by the Unites States Department of Energy and World Resources Institute (WRI). In related news, the Oklahoma University (OU) Hudson College of Public Health received over \$1 million in National Science Foundation grant funding to deploy vehicle to grid (V2G) chargers.

Shawnee Public Schools

Shawnee schools are exploring the potential for utilization of large vehicle batteries during natural disasters and peak electricity demand. ACOG is a partner on the grant.

Data Center Developers

Some of our member governments are being approached by data center developers. ACOG staff is interested in working with you and other stakeholders to understand the impacts of potential data center projects (economic, environmental, land use, etc.), taking into account water and electricity demands. We will also have to get better understanding of the number of employees that might be located at these facilities and

possible long-term revenue from the local community. More to come on this subject, but if you are interested in discussing how ACOG can support our members in this effort, please reach out to us.

ACOG opened the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Call for Projects (CFP) on September 2, 2025.

Cities, counties, and transportation agencies located within the ACOG MPO area are invited to submit projects for FFY 2029 funding consideration. **The application deadline is 4 p.m., Friday, October 31, 2025.**

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- All projects must be located on a functionally classified road, with the exception of bridge projects. Projects located on federal or state highways, interstates, or toll roads are ineligible.
- All projects must be included in, or consistent with, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (Encompass 2045).
- All projects must be in compliance with the ACOG Complete Streets Policy.
- Only submit projects for which local match funds and other local expenses associated with
 the projects will be available, and environmental clearance, right-of-way acquisition, and
 utility and encroachment clearance have been, or will be, accomplished within the federal
 fiscal year that the STBG-UZA funds are made available for obligation (approved by ODOT
 and FHWA).

APPLICATION SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- **ProjectTracker Application Form** for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s). Applications submitted during the last Call for Projects (and therefore have an application already created) will be open for editing.
- STBG-UZA Programming Resolution (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).
- Itemized Cost Estimate for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming CFP submission deadline. Costs associated with right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.

- Map of Each Proposed Project showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and the names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- The appropriate Project Rating Worksheet(s) for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements or resurfacing with bicycle facilities, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component.
- ODOT Project Scoping Form for each project.
- Any supporting documentation listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

A completed CY 2024 Network Monitoring Survey must be submitted by the Call for Projects deadline to be considered for funding. The CY 2024 Network Monitoring Survey is available for download here: Network Monitoring Survey CY 2024 (Excel file).

STBG-UZA applications received from entities without a completed CY 2024 Network Monitoring Survey will not be accepted. All required documents must be uploaded by the application deadline.

INFORMATION:

In August, the preliminary FFY 2026-2029 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was presented for review and comment. The preliminary TIP was developed with input from ACOG MPO local governments, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA), Norman Transit, the Oklahoma City Department of Airports, and other area airport operators.

The TIP identifies all federally funded surface transportation projects expected to be carried out by city, county, state, and local transportation agencies during federal fiscal years 2026-2029. This includes upcoming state-sponsored projects within the ACOG MPO area, under the jurisdiction of ODOT, upcoming transit projects provided by COTPA and Norman Transit, and proposed airport improvements provided by local airport operators.

Opportunity for public review and comment on the preliminary FFY 2026-2029 TIP was announced by public notice in The Oklahoman, a news release distributed to metro area media outlets, and on ACOG's website and social media suite. Written comments will be accepted through 4 p.m., Monday, September 22, 2025, at IP@acogok.org and anyone may attend the September 25 ACOG MPO Policy Committee public hearing to express their opinions.

Prior to action by the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, a public hearing is required, and comments will be received from any public in attendance.

Following MPO approval, the final FFY 2026-2029 ACOG MPO TIP will be provided to the ODOT for approval (as the Governor's designee) and incorporated into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

The ACOG MPO Technical Committee recommended approval of the final FFY 2026-2029 ACOG MPO TIP at their September 11, 2025, meeting.

INFORMATION:

The next task for the Encompass 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) update is the development of 2050 population control totals for the ACOG Transportation Management Area (TMA) in accordance with ACOG procedures, historical census figures, projections from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce (ODOC) and Woods and Poole Economics Inc., and trend data were used to evaluate future county projections.

With past plans, staff have used ODOC county population projections, the most recent is the 2023 version that provides data for 2020-2070. In Table 1, the 2030, 2040 and 2050 projections are included under the ODOC label.

Woods and Poole (W&P) 1970-2060 county projections (2024 version) were purchased to provide a comparison to the ODOC data. In short, the Woods and Poole data forecasts were created using a sophisticated modeling process and an extensive economic and demographic database containing more than 900 variables collected annually since 1970. In Table 1, the 2030, 2040 and 2050 projections are included under the W&P label.

Additionally, in order to develop local population projections, staff took the 1980-2020 census population numbers by county and projected them out to 2050 by using the forecast function in Excel. This trend data is listed under the ACOG label in Table 1 for 2030, 2040 and 2050 numbers.

Looking at historical population growth trends over 50 years, staff chose one of the 2050 projections from the previously mentioned sources that looked most reasonable, these are highlighted in yellow. This information will be used as a guide for the 2050 MTP but may be modified based on the ability to allow for anticipated growth by local communities.

INFORMATION:

Watch for Me OK is a bicycle/pedestrian safety public awareness campaign from the Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG) and the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office (OHSO). The campaign seeks to educate the public on the rules of the road and aims to keep residents of Central Oklahoma safe while traveling.

September 2025 concludes another year of ACOG staff collaborating with consultant agency Anglin PR to administer the campaign. ACOG has contracted with Anglin PR to administer the campaign since FFY 2021.
