## **MINUTES**

### **1. CALL TO ORDER**

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. A quorum was present.

### **2. APPROVAL OF AUGUST 28, 2025, MINUTES**

Director Matt Dukes made a motion to approve the August 28, 2025, minutes of the 911 ACOG Board of Directors meeting. Director Shelli Selby seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### **5. CONSENT DOCKET**

Presiding Chair Freeman presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

- A. Finance Report – Authorization of Payments of August 2025 Claims

Director Selby made a motion to approve the item under the consent docket.  
Director Vickie Douglas seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.



## **6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOD ACTION**

### **A. NG911 Implementation Status Report**

Mr. Hawkinson introduced David Jones, Mission Critical Partners, Senior Vice President & Director of Strategic Growth, and Sherri Griffith Powell, Manager, 911 Services, to highlight the NG911 Implementation Status Report. Mr. Jones said the additional testing of the network involving Verizon Wireless testing took place on September 4, 2025, and was not successful. He said an NGA Root Cause Analysis (RCA) of these failures was requested by MCP on ACOG and Norman ECC's behalf. He said on September 5, ACOG discovered T-Mobile outbound transfers at Norman ECC were not working. He said NGA advised these failures were a result of configuration changes made prior to the September 4, testing. He said those changes were rolled back the same day, and outbound transfers were restored. He said further investigation revealed two additional T-Mobile failed outbound transfers to non ACOG ECC's had occurred since August 31, 2025, prior to the Verizon Wireless testing.

Director Dukes asked if the issues were only in Norman or if they were nationwide. Mr. Hawkinson said the rollout was planned for one ECC at a time. He said Norman agreed to be the first to test and is the only ECC that has been affected.

Director Dukes asked how long before implementation is completed. Mr. Hawkinson said there have been no issues with Comtech and all call handling solutions are secure. He said it is critical to ensure that all transfers are accurate and that there are no issues. Sherri Griffith Powell added that MCP is assessing the RCA and is working on a potential timeline and next steps.

### **911 OPERATIONS:**

- NGA Next Generation Core Services (NGCS) Migration: Staff support of NGA OSP Migration is on hold as 911 ACOG reviews the NGA Root Cause Analysis (RCA).

### **911 GIS:**

- 911 ACOG GeoDatabase Schema Conversion: Staff has provisioned the 911 ACOG GIS data for NGA regarding current and future GIS data uploads for NG911.
- Staff stays engaged in address and plat requests for local communities and consistently provides additional GIS updates.

### **OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:**

- Mass Attacks in Public Spaces: October 16 Mass Attacks in Public Spaces analyzes targeted attacks that occurred in public or semi-public locations in the U.S., in which three or more people were harmed (not including the attacker).

The class will be taught by Jeff Murray, Domestic Security Strategist (DSS), National Threat Assessment Center, Protective Intelligence and Assessment Division, U.S. Secret Service.

The class is approved for (4) hours of CLEET credit under course number 24-3941 and can only be attended by commissioned law enforcement officers or those currently employed as a public safety telecommunicator.



- Crisis Intervention for Communications: October 20 Communications professionals are often the first to deal with a person in crisis. This one-day class is designed to provide attendees with the skills to make a difference. Topics include: General guidelines, Active listening, Verbal containment, Use of your voice, Intelligence gathering, Suicide intervention, Understanding returning veterans, The mentally ill, Case studies and role play.
- APCO Communications Center Supervisor: October 22 – 24 This three-day course is designed for prospective, new or experienced communications supervisors who want to enhance their supervisory skills and knowledge.

**AT&T SWITCHED ETHERNET ON DEMAND (ASEoD) SERVICES AGREEMENT**

### **INFORMATION:**

AT&T Switched Ethernet (ASE) is the 911 ACOG Primary Network for 911 Call Delivery to the ECCs.

The current ASE Services Agreement expires October 31, 2025. AT&T has proposed a new 36-month evergreen automatic annual renewable agreement for AT&T Switched Ethernet on Demand (ASEoD) securing ASE Service from AT&T November 1, 2025, through October 31, 2028.

The total cost of Year 1 services provided by the 36-month ASEoD Services Agreement is \$73,000.00, reduced from \$143,352.00 from FY 2025.

### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Motion to authorize the Executive Director to accept the AT&T 36-month ASEoD Services Agreement, along with approval of the annual cost of Year 1 to begin November 1, 2025, through October 31, 2026, that will not exceed \$73,000.00.

### **INFORMATION:**

NGA Call Routing Solution and Comtech Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress 911 staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program.

### **INFORMATION:**

A contract was executed between 911 ACOG and NGA for Part A ESInet and NGCS on October 13, 2020, with an initial contract term of five years with options for two one-year extensions.

The Fifth Amendment to the Purchase Agreement between 911 ACOG and NGA executed November 6, 2023, extended the initial contract term to December 31, 2025.

The ACOG Executive Committee, which is comprised of the elected officers of the 911 ACOG Board, ACOG Board, ACOG MPO Policy Committee, and the Garber-Wellington Association Policy Committee, met on October 14 with ACOG staff, MCP consultants, and ACOG Legal Counsel to review the renewal option. The Committee unanimously recommended that the 911 ACOG Board not exercise the optional one-year extension to the NGA contract.
