ODOT recently opened its FFY 2026 Transportation Alternatives (TA) Call for Projects. ODOT currently has a Notice of Intent Form available on their website. These forms have to be completed between October 1 - December 31, 2025. Only online submissions will be accepted.

This grant provides a broad range of funding for a variety of transportation projects that prioritize safety, comfort, and connectivity to destinations for all people who use the street network, such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities; construction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas; community improvements, such as historic preservation and vegetation management; environmental mitigation related to stormwater and habitat connectivity; recreational trails; safe routes to school projects; and vulnerable road user safety assessments.

# **INFORMATION:**

ACOG opened the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Call for Projects on September 2, 2025.

Cities, counties, and transportation agencies located within the ACOG MPO area are invited to submit projects for FFY 2029 funding consideration. **The application deadline is 4 p.m., Friday, October 31, 2025.** 

### PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- All projects must be located on a functionally classified road, with the exception of bridge projects. Projects located on federal or state highways, interstates, or toll roads are ineligible.
- All projects must be included in, or consistent with, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (Encompass 2045).
- All projects must be in compliance with the <u>ACOG Complete Streets Policy</u>.
- Only submit projects for which local match funds and other local expenses associated
  with the projects will be available, and environmental clearance, right-of-way
  acquisition, and utility and encroachment clearance have been, or will be,
  accomplished within the federal fiscal year that the STBG-UZA funds are made
  available for obligation (approved by ODOT and FHWA).

### APPLICATION SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- ProjectTracker Application Form for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s). Applications submitted during the last Call for Projects (and therefore have an application already created) will be open for editing.
- STBG-UZA Programming Resolution (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).

- Itemized Cost Estimate for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming CFP submission deadline. Costs associated with right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.
- Map of Each Proposed Project showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and the names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- The appropriate **Project Rating Worksheet(s)** for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements or resurfacing with bicycle facilities, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component.
- ODOT Project Scoping Form for each project.
- Any supporting documentation listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

A completed CY 2024 Network Monitoring Survey must be submitted by the Call for Projects deadline to be considered for funding. The CY 2024 Network Monitoring Survey is available for download here: Network Monitoring Survey CY 2024 (Excel file).

STBG-UZA applications received from entities without a completed CY 2024 Network Monitoring Survey will not be accepted. All required documents must be uploaded by the application deadline.

# **INFORMATION:**

On Tuesday, September 2, 2025, ACOG issued a Call for Projects (CFP) for its Air Quality Grant (AQG) program. The program serves to meet the goals of the federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Improvement Program and/or Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) by supporting projects that relieve congestion, reduce transportation emissions, and improve air quality.

For the FY 2026 CFP, approximately \$7 million of CMAQ and CRP funds will be available for eligible active transportation, congestion reduction, and transit improvement projects in the ACOG Adjusted Urbanized Area (UZA).

The Application Guidebook and Scoring Worksheet are available on the ACOG website: <a href="https://www.acogok.org/aqgrants/">https://www.acogok.org/aqgrants/</a>

Applicants are required to provide a minimum of 20 percent in matching local funds. Following the project selection and award process, successful projects will be overseen by Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) staff. Application materials, including supplemental documents such as resolutions, letters of support, project budgets, and work plans must be completed and submitted online through the ACOG ProjectTracker website.

The FY 2026 CFP opened Tuesday, September 2, 2025, and applications will be accepted until 4 p.m. Friday, October 31, 2025.

# Hometown Grants Program - T-Mobile & Main Street America

- Q4 application window opened October 1 and closes December 31, 2025.
- Award amounts up to \$50,000. No match required. Projects must be able to be executed within 12 months of receiving funds. Applicants must have a population <50,000.
- This program is designed for communities looking to build, rebuild, create, or refresh
  connection points in their communities, such as historic buildings, libraries, parks, trails,
  community gardens and kitchens, and more. Projects must be shovel-ready and be able to
  be executed within 12 months of receiving funds.

### **Built Environment Grants - Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust (TSET)**

- Application window opened September 23 and closes November 18, 2025.
- Eligible applicants include public agencies, tribal governments, educational institutions, and 501(c)(3) nonprofit agencies.
- Maximum award for planning/design projects \$150,000; maximum award for construction projects \$300,000/year for up to two years. Awards conferred on reimbursement basis.
- Match funding not required for planning/design projects; match funding required for construction projects serving populations >10,000.
- Program supports infrastructure projects that promote physical activity and nutrition, including planning and development of park/trail systems, enhancements to downtown spaces, and construction or renovation of sidewalks, playgrounds, and farmers markets.
