MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman called the meeting to order at 1:01 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. APPROVAL OF DECEMBER 18, 2025, MINUTES

Director Vickie Douglas moved to approve the December 18, 2025, minutes of the 911 ACOG Board of Directors meeting. Director Grant Aguirre seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. COMMUNICATIONS:

A. Chair’s Report – None

B. Executive Director’s Report – Mr. Sweeney stated that the 911 ACOG Grant Program launched on December 30, 2025, with the deadline to apply being February 27, 2026. Applications will then be reviewed in March 2026 and presented to the 911 ACOG Board of Directors for award approval, followed by contracts being in place by May 2026 with projects being approved to start upon receipt of signed contract. There was a virtual meeting on January 8, 2026, for all potential applicants to attend as a prerequisite to be eligible to apply for a share of the \$1.3 million available. Mr. Sweeney also advised that an email, 911Grants@acogok.org, has been set up to address questions regarding the Grant Program. With this being the inaugural year, there will likely be adjustments for the following years. Director Terry Arps asked if an existing program could be expanded or if it had to be a new project or program. Mr. Sweeney stated there is a list of eligible and non-eligible projects available on www.acogok.org/911acograntprogram website.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS OR DELEGATIONS

Director Claudia Browne introduced her husband, Spencer Browne, with OG&E. Presiding Chair Phil Freeman recognized past ACOG Board member, Glenn Berglan, being in attendance. Director Tim Rudek thanked Del City for giving a ladder truck to Harrah.

5. CONSENT DOCKET

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

A. Finance Report – Authorization of Payments of December 2025 Claims.

Director Terry Arps moved to approve the items under the consent docket.
Director Grant Aguirre seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOD ACTION

A. Approval of ESInet-NGCS (Part A Solution) Contract with NxGnCo (Comtech/Allerium)

Mr. Sweeney reminded the Board that during the December 18, 2025, Board meeting, there was an official intent to award the ESInet-NGCS (Part A Solution) Contract to NexGen Communications (Comtech/Allerium). ACOG staff, with the support of Mission Critical Partners (MCP), has completed contract negotiations with Allerium and requests the authorization for Mr. Sweeney to enter into a contract with NexGen Communications Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$10,981,125.00 for a five-year period. Mr. Sweeney turned the floor to Sherri Griffith Powell to explain some of the details of the contract.

Ms. Griffith Powell stated that after many conversations with Allerium, they have shown their desire to partner with 911 ACOG to continue the relationship established from the beginning of the NG911 upgrade. As a demonstration of their good faith, the not-to-exceed price is actually less than price originally submitted in 2020. Ms. Griffith Powell further discussed the timeline proposed by Allerium, with an understanding that we wish this to be done as expeditiously and efficiently as possible. A new updated timeline will be provided after the kickoff meeting in February 2026. Director Lacey Dawson asked about the timing of the overlap of the system testing and cutovers. Ms. Griffith Powell explained that the systems would run simultaneously till it was proven that the new product worked and the ECCs would not be without service. Once the cutover is complete, 911 ACOG will be the only system in the state with the full fledged next generation service. Director Matt Dukes asked if Allerium would be able to identify and fix the problems NGA encountered. Ms. Griffith Powell and Mr. Sweeney feel confident that with Allerium, being a 911-based company, and NGA, being a software-based company, the same problems should not exist, but if they do have problems, there is a different level of staff expertise that can identify and fix them.

Director Matt Dukes moved to authorize the Executive Director, Mr. Sweeney, to enter into the contract with NexGen Communications, Inc (NxGnCo) for an amount not-to-exceed \$10,928,125 for a five-year term. Director Terry Arps seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

B. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Mr. Hawkinson reminded the Board that the 911 ACOG and NGA contract for Part A ESInet and NGCS expired December 31, 2025. 911 ACOG has completed contract negotiations with Comtech/Allerium. The Comtech Guardian Call Handling Solution continues to perform as expected. Mr. Hawkinson reiterated that 911 ACOG is pleased with the system and most importantly, the dispatchers are also pleased. Mr. Sweeney asked if there was a representative from Allerium present. Mr. Mark Roylance, Allerium

Director of Sales, was present and introduced himself. He stated that Allerium is excited to continue working with Mr. Hawkinson and 911 ACOG.

7. GENERAL STATUS REPORT

911 OPERATIONS:

- Reintegration of Fully Meshed/Redundant IP Network: ACOG 911 technical staff, along with Comtech Engineering support, will complete re-configuration of the AT&T IP Network as Primary and Cox IP Network as Secondary on the Data Center Host Routers with integration of Automatic Network Failover feature on January 27, 2026, between the hours of 12:00 AM and 2:00 AM. 911 staff contacted each ECC midnight shift to personally inform them of the Host re-configuration maintenance window, and followed up with an email to each ECC Supervisor, informing them of the same.

911 GIS:

- 911 Addresses and Plat Requests: ACOG 911 GIS staff stays engaged in address and plat requests for local communities and consistently provides additional GIS updates.

OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:

Mr. Hawkinson mentioned all classes available in the months of January and February 2026, with a reminder that the classes are open to all members of the Board.

- In Case You Forgot...Dispatch Refresher: January 29, A one-day class designed to give telecommunicators a refresher in the basics of dispatch. The topics discussed are Communications, Customer Service, Call Processing, Next Gen 911, Radio Communications, Call Classification, Liability, Court Testimony, and Stress.
- APCO Public Safety Telecommunicator: February 9 - 13, The PST course may be used for new-hire and existing employee training. The course blends the knowledge and skill building information needed for a basic telecommunicator with the most up-to-date information on the technology and issues in public safety communications centers.
- Communications Training Officer Refresher: February 19, A one-day class designed for current Communication Training Officers to go over the foundations for a successful training program. Topics include Responsibilities of CTOs, CTO Program History, CTOs Responsibilities, Benefits of Standardized Training, and Liability.
- Domestic Violence in Oklahoma: February 24, Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior used to establish power and control over another person through fear and intimidation. This class will focus on domestic violence cases and calls in Oklahoma. The learning objectives for this class include Oklahoma statutory definition of Domestic Abuse, Oklahoma Domestic Violence Statistics, Best Practices for Domestic calls, Information gathering during calls, Establishing a trusting relationship between dispatcher and caller, Examples of 911 Domestic calls, and Responder safety.
