**MINUTES**

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**1. CALL TO ORDER - INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS**

Presiding Chair Kale Littlefield called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Mr. Littlefield informed the attendees that he was conducting the meeting because Brent Hawkinson underwent successful quadruple bypass surgery on February 15, 2026. Should anyone have any questions or need anything, the 911 team is available.

**2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - DECEMBER 2, 2025, MEETING**

Christie Jaggi moved to approve December 2, 2025, minutes of the ACOG RPAC meeting. Captain Ray Kimbrough seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### **3. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY**

#### **A. NG911 IMPLEMENTATION STATUS REORT**

Mr. Littlefield reported that 911 ACOG successfully completed contract negotiations with the ESInet and NGCS provider, Allerium. The agreement was executed on January 29, 2026. Tinker Air Force Base was updated on the NG911 program status in a meeting facilitated by MCP and ACOG 911 on February 6, 2026. The Allerium ESInet and NGCS project was kicked off on February 11, 2026, in a joint meeting with 911 ACOG staff, MCP and Allerium; and the ComTech Guardian continues to function as expected. The timeline provided is approximately two years with the first ECC coming online in January 2027 and the remainder being the end of May 2027. A more formal timeline will be provided after the kickoff meetings are completed.

#### **B. 911 ACOG GRANT PROGRAM**

Mr. Jeff Choate advised that the 911 staff received eight grant applications which will be reviewed March 17 and 18, 2026, with recommendations being presented to the Board of Directors at the March 26, 2026, Board Meeting.

#### **C. 911 TECHNICAL SYSTEMS PROJECTS**

Kale Littlefield said his team has completed the monthly map updates and a router prioritization configuration is ongoing. The 911 Technical team contacted everyone at the beginning of February 2026, about the reconfiguration to AT&T as the primary. That process has gone under a formal review and will be more in depth than originally planned to be assured it will not be affecting service and hope to have a date soon. All supervisors and the overnight shift will be contacted with the schedule and how long it will take.

#### **D. 911 TRAINING/SCHEDULE**

Robin Murray informed the attendees that she and Kristin Gonul have been working hard preparing for National Telecommunicators Week. The basket contents have increased and improved for the dispatcher's enjoyment. This year the dispatchers will be receiving baseball shirts in recognition of National Telecommunicator Week. Basket deliveries will be the week of April 12 - 18, 2026. Ms. Murray was glad to announce that ACOG and the Secret Service has expanded their collaboration. The Mass Attacks classes have increased to eight for the year, and all but one class is full. Ms. Murray said she will inquire about adding more Mass Attack classes, as well as inquiring about other classes they could teach. Future classes are Developing as a Supervisor on March 5, 2026, APCO Fire Service Communications on March 9-12, 2026, and Managing Different Generations on March 16, 2026.

#### **E. RECENT 911 GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEMS (GIS) ACTIVITIES**

Tanner Jones stated that the 911 GIS staff has received the yearly data audit from GeoComm. GeoComm compares our road centerlines, address points, and MSAG to assess the synchronization across the data. Our customer records to roads report had a match rate of 99.03 percent, which is a .49 percent increase over last year's audit. The 911 GIS staff will review the errors found and correct them. With data that is constantly changing, it is important to audit the data and maintain our accuracy over the NENA recommended accuracy of 98 percent MSAG to ALI match. All ACOG ECC's have either uploaded their data to the 911 states repository or have a vendor or plan to get that data uploaded. If any entities need their data, let Tanner Jones know and he can add you to the monthly distribution list. Tanner advised there is GIS training available through the Oklahoma 911 Management Authority on March 10, 2026. There is information on the OMA

website or Tanner can assist with getting the information. The 911 GIS staff is again preparing the map updates so the latest GIS data will be available for the Guardian workstations and for the 911 dispatchers. The GIS data that will be distributed to the workstations will have the same up to date information that is in the ACOG GIS database. Tanner Jones also stated the monthly GIS data push to the GIS PSAP contacts was going out that day. If you need access or have any questions about the data, please let Tanner or his team know. The boundary map verifications are due soon. Please get those returned to Robin McDonald and the Management Authority.

#### **4. ECC UPDATE**

Christie Jaggie stated Edmond currently has one opening. They are also working on a project to implement ASAP to PSAP.

Jodi Wolff stated that the El Reno ECC has one opening and is asking the city for two more positions for next year to increase to 14 dispatchers. They are still working on their build with APCO and Telecom for police, fire, and medical dispatching.

Teresa Coplen stated that Midwest City still has three openings with currently two in training. This will bring their total to 15 dispatchers. They will be going live with ProQA on April 1, 2026, and will be getting rid of the card set. They will be switching to New World CAD within the next twelve months. They are currently using Tyler CAD.

Chief Don Sweger stated that Guthrie was finally approved for eight communications officers. Guthrie is currently working on GIS for all of Logan County and has to be done by June 1, 2026. Congresswoman Stephanie Bice gave Guthrie 1.4 million dollars for radar and electronic devices.

Russell Anderson stated that Norman is down three dispatchers and is hiring for four. Carolyn Glover is retiring July 2, 2026, after 42 years. Emily Breslin was introduced as the new mentor and Quality Assurance / Quality Control to identify training issues.

Ray Kimbrough stated that they are waiting on the new building for the Cleveland County Sheriffs Department. They have been working with Kale Littlefield and others to get the building ready to open in April 2026. Patricia Martini is back as communications supervisor. They are now fully staffed.

Whitney Byrd stated that Blanchard is fully staffed with seven full-time positions and two dispatchers on duty 95 percent of the time. Blanchard call taking has increased with improved weather. They are currently working on new policy and procedure manuals, as well as training manuals.
